

Nomination Papers: Fill-in forms for Village President & Trustee can be found on the Reedsville Website under Links, on the Wisconsin Elections Commission Website under Forms or blank forms are available in the lobby in the Reedsville Municipal Building. All completed forms must be returned to the Village Clerk/Treasurer's office by 3:00 PM on or before January 2, 2019 in order for the candidate's name to be placed on the ballot. All elected officials serve a two-year term beginning the third Tuesday of April.

Payment of Property Taxes:

- Real estate and personal property tax payments can be made in person at the Reedsville Municipal Building during normal business hours.
- Payments may also be made by sending a check to the following: Reedsville Municipal Building, Tax Collection, 217 Menasha St., Reedsville, WI 54230-8597. Taxes paid by check or money order must be made payable to the Village of Reedsville. **Cash will not be accepted.** A receipt will only be sent back if you have included a self-addressed stamped envelope.
- You can pay your taxes on-line at <https://client.pointandpay.net/web/VillageofReedsvilleWIWeb>. This address can also be found on the Reedsville Website under Links.

All first installment taxes are due by January 31st.

Solid Waste & Recycling Carts need to be out on the curb by 5:00 am for service. DO NOT place carts within 4' ft of any objects such as utility poles, mailboxes, or vehicle. Carts need to be on separate sides of your driveway or at least 4' apart. Carts placed on the street or on snow banks will not be serviced.

Cat & Dog Licenses: Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. Please make out a separate check for the licenses as it goes into a different account.

Clerk/Treasurer's Office Hours: Monday thru Thursday, 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM and Friday 8:00 am to Noon.

The Reedsville Municipal Building will be closed all day December 24th, 25th, 26th, 31st & January 1st for the holidays.

Proceedings of the Reedsville Village Board September 13, 2018

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on September 13, 2018, at 6:30 PM by Village President Jesse Walt. Present were: Joe Cummings, Jerry Reis, Chad Rataichek, Patty Schreiber and Jack Siebert: No one was absent. Also, present were: Stacey Barth, Brad Busse, Leroy Krepline, Justin Meyer, JoAnn Mignon, Craig Schuh, John Schuh, Joe Tisler, Becky Busse, Tony Depies, Sonja Collins and Dave Nordby.

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cummings to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried 5-0.

Public Input: Becky Busse had concerns regarding contacting utility customers with leaks and a leak on Elm Street

A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Schreiber to approve the minutes of the August 9, 2018 meeting as presented. Motion carried 5-0

A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Cummings to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$207,957.68. Motion carried 5-0

At 6:45 pm a motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Rataichek to convene into closed session pursuant to Section 19:85 (1)(c) to consider compensation for any employee over which the governmental body has jurisdiction and Section 19.85(1)(f) to consider data of specific persons. Motion carried 5-0. At 7:45 pm a motion was made by Reis and seconded by Schreiber to reconvene into open session. Motion carried 5-0.

The August report from the Valders Ambulance Service and correspondence from the USDA regarding the Village 2017 Year End Financial Report were presented.

The First Responders monthly written report was presented by Barth.

The Police Dept. monthly written report was presented by Tisler

The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Meyer. A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Schreiber to approve the decision as discussed in closed session regarding a utility account. Motion carried 5-0. Depies gave an update on the Water Tower Painting Project.

The Fire Dept. monthly written report was presented by Busse. A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Siebert to approve the resignation from Devon Bubolz from the Fire Dept. Motion carried 5-0.

The Public Works Dept monthly written report was presented by J. Schuh. J Schuh informed the Board that there will be a walk thru of the 4th Street Bridge project on September 19, 2018 at 8:00 am. Discussion on the loan amount was postponed until the next regular scheduled Village Board meeting. A discussion was held regarding sump pumps being drained into the Streets. The Police Dept will contact residents that they should install an elbow at the end of their pipes so the water goes down the gutter area to the drains. More information will be obtained for the USDA projects for the next regular scheduled Village Board meeting. The discussion the LRIP project was postponed until the next regular scheduled Village Board meeting.

Ordinance 2018-4 amending the Golf Cart Ordinance was introduced by Siebert. A motion was made by Schreiber and second by Cummings to approve the Ordinance as presented. Motion carried 5-0. A special meeting will be held on September 19, 2018 at 5:00 pm to work on the 2019 budget. Following a discussion, it was decided to keep the rates the same as they currently are for the ads in the Reedsville News. Following a discussion, a motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Siebert to have Trick or Treating on Sunday, October 28, 2018 from 2:00 am to 4:00 pm. Motion carried 5-0.

Walt will schedule a meeting with the RAA and the Reedsville Fire Dept. regarding the softball diamond. The discussion on the physicals required was postponed until more information can be obtained.

The next regular monthly meeting will be held on Thursday, October 11, 2018 at 6:30 PM. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 5-0. Meeting adjourned at 8:40 PM.
