From the Village Hall

Nomination Papers: Fill-in forms for Village Trustee can be found on the Reedsville Website under Links, on the Government Accountability Board Website under Forms or blank forms are available in the lobby in the Reedsville Municipal Building. All completed forms must be returned to the Village Clerk/Treasurer's office by 3:00 PM on or before January 2, 2018 in order for the candidates name to be placed on the ballot. All elected officials serve a two year term beginning the third Tuesday of April.

Payment of Property Taxes:

- Real estate and personal property tax payments can be made in person at the Reedsville Municipal Building during normal business hours.
- Payments may also be made by sending a check to the following: Reedsville Municipal Building, Tax Collection, 217 Menasha St., Reedsville, WI 54230-8597. Taxes paid by check or money order must be made payable to the Village of Reedsville. **Cash will not be accepted.** A receipt will only be sent back if you have included a self-addressed stamped envelope.
- You can pay your taxes on-line at <https://client.pointandpay.net/web/VillageofReedsvilleWIWeb>. This address can also be found on the Reedsville Website under Links.

All first installment taxes are due by January 31st.

Solid Waste & Recycling Carts need to be out on the curb by 5:00 am for service. DO NOT place carts within 4' ft of any objects such as utility poles, mailboxes, or vehicle. Carts need to be on separate sides of your driveway or at least 4' apart. Carts placed on the street or on snow banks will not be serviced.

Cat & Dog Licenses: Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. Please make out a separate check for the licenses as it goes into a different account.

Clerk/Treasurer's Office Hours: Monday thru Thursday, 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM and Friday 8:00 am to Noon.

The Clerk-Treasurer's office will be closed December 18th thru December 26th.

The Reedsville Municipal Building will be closed all day December 22nd, 25th, 26th and January 1st and at noon on December 29th for the holidays.



DIGESTIVE "GUT" BACTERIA AND THEIR ROLE

Last month the topic was the Brain-Gut connection and this month the focus will be on the digestive system and the role of good bacteria.

- Gut bacteria play crucial roles in digesting food and modulating the immune system.
- Defend against foreign invaders/pathogens.
- In the realm known as POST-biotics, bacteria make certain molecules needed for enzymes to work properly, signal the body/brain, and metabolism.

Metabolic endotoxemia

- Occurs when the level of endotoxins in the blood increases 2-3X the normal amount.
- Cell wall of bacteria contain compounds (toxins) that leak into the bloodstream (when the gut lining is compromised), resulting in systemic overload.
- Can result in insulin resistance, mood disorder, muscle pain, and fatty liver.

Non-alcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD)

- NAFLD ranges from 17%-33% population
- Obese about 75%
- NAFLD can progress from normal, to fatty liver, to liver cirrhosis.
- Many studies: animals/humans found a relationship between the gut microbiota and NAFLD

Leaky gut

- Systemic overload=increased intestinal permeability.
- Caused by disrupted intestinal tight junctions, creating "leaky gut" (loss of gut barrier integrity).
- Bacterial toxins leak beyond the mucosal barrier.

Diets primarily plant-based (vs. animal based) have a greater diversity for helpful bacteria. The old saying "you are what you eat" should say "you are what your gut bacteria eats". Stop in on Wednesday at 6 P.M. for a BIO-TRACKER OPEN HOUSE and learn how the IN.FORM program rebuilds the gut.

MERRY CHRISTMAS TO EVERYONE

Cold and flu season is right around the corner, what advice do you have to help my family stay well?

Cold and flu season is certainly on the way, and those of us unfortunate enough to catch a bug may experience severe sore throat, lots of congestion, painful earaches - all while feeling absolutely miserable.

Going to your doctor will likely result in a diagnosis of a "viral infection." One thing to keep in mind is that viruses, not bacteria, cause upper respiratory infections. While antibiotics can effectively treat bacterial infections, they are not effective against viral infections such as the common cold and the flu.

Here are some tips to feel better (without antibiotics)

- Remember, most colds usually run their course within five to 10 days
- Drink plenty of fluids
- Get plenty of rest
- Use a humidifier
- Try over the counter medications, based on your symptoms. Consult your provider if you have questions.



Here are some tips to avoid catching colds or the flu

- Eat a healthy, well-balanced diet
- Drink plenty of liquids and get plenty of sleep
- If you are really sick, stay home to avoid passing anything on to others
- Cover your mouth when you cough and sneeze
- Wash your hands frequently, especially after blowing your nose or coughing or sneezing. You need to lather for 20 seconds and then rinse equally well.
- Discard used tissues immediately into the garbage can
- And lastly, and most importantly, get your flu shot.

Following these suggestions can be an effective way to help you stay well during cold and flu season.
