Payment of Property Taxes:

- Real estate and personal property tax payments can be made in person at the Reedsville Municipal Building during normal business hours.
- Payments may also be made by sending a check to the following: Reedsville Municipal Building, Tax Collection, 217 Menasha St., Reedsville, WI 54230-8597. Taxes paid by check or money order must be made payable to the Village of Reedsville. **Cash will not be accepted.** A receipt will only be sent back if you have included a self-addressed stamped envelope.

All first installment taxes are due on or before January 31, 2018.

Cat & Dog Licenses: Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. Please make out a separate check for the licenses as it goes into a different account.

Holiday Tree Drop-off: Manitowoc County residents and businesses may drop off their natural holiday trees at the Basswood Compost Site from 7:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday, and Saturdays from 8:00 am until noon. Please remove all ornaments, tinsel, lights, stands and storage bags before dropping off. If the tree is more than 6 feet long, it must be cut in half. The Basswood compost is located at 3000 Basswood Rd., near the intersection of County Road P and R. Call 683-4333 or visit www.manitowocrecycles.org for additional information. **The Village does not pick up or chip Christmas Trees.**

Snow & Ice Removal: The owner or occupant of any lot abutting on a public sidewalk shall clear their sidewalk of snow within twenty-four (24) hours after a snowfall and keep the same free of ice. If such snow or ice is not removed as required herein, the Street Dept. shall cause the same to be done and the cost thereof assessed against the property owner

Utility Bill Payment Services:

Building Permits: A building permit is required for any structural or major changes in excess of \$300.00 to your home or property. Permits cost \$40.00 for the first \$2,000 of material and labor costs and \$2.00 for each additional \$1,000 of costs after that. Building Permits are good for 6 months. The application form is available on the website under *Forms and Permits* or in the Reedsville Municipal Building lobby. Permits can be obtained at the Clerk-Treasurer office located at 217 Menasha Street.

HAPPY NEW YEAR FROM SUNRISE HORSE FARM





I wanted to give the clinic a chance now that it had opened with all new staff and a new nurse practitioner. Well, what did I do? -- something that many women would do -- let my husband be the guinea pig. He said he had wanted to go there for his yearly exam, so he went. Immediately after the appointment, he told me that I would really like the people there. Well, having been married for 23 years, I hoped my husband knew me well enough to be right. So I made my appointment...AND although it almost physically hurts me to say that my husband is right, I'm glad he was. Everyone that works

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on October 12, 2017 at 6:30 PM by Trustee Jerry Reis. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cumming to amend the agenda. Motion carried 3-0. The resignation letter was read from Andy Bubolz resigning his position as Village President effective October 12, 2017. A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Siebert to nominate Walt to fill this position. Walt did not accept the nomination at this time. A special meeting will be held on October 16, 2017 at 5:00 pm to discussion this vacancy. Reis was asked to continue as acting President until the special meeting.

A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Siebert to approve the minutes from September 14, 2017 meeting. Motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cummings to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$75,005.24. Motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Jack to approve the Class B Liquor License application from the Reedsville Fire Fighters. Motion carried 3-0 (Walt abstained - Reis voted). A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cummings to approve the Operator License applications from the following: Craig Anhalt, Jessup Bubolz, Brad Busse, Jacob Glasow and Michael O'Connell. Motion carried 3-0. (Walt abstained-Reis voted). A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cummings to approve the 2018 Special Law Enforcement Agreement with the City of Brillion in the amount of \$28,120.00. Motion carried 3-0

Ordinance 2017-3 regarding Firearms and Dangerous Weapon Regulations was introduced by Siebert. A motion was made by Walt and

seconded by Cummings to approve the Ordinance as presented. Motion carried 3-0. Ordinance 2017-4 Establishing Procedures and Criteria for Alternate Forms of Sworn Testimony at the Board of Review Hearing was introduced by Siebert. A motion was made by Walt and seconded by Cummings to approve the Ordinance as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

The First Responders monthly written report was presented by Barth. The Police Dept. monthly written report was presented by Tisler. The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Hoppenrath. Updates on the AT&T proposal, Water Tower Painting project, Northern Pipe, insurance claim, sewer rates and laterals in Meadowbrook Court were postponed until the next regular scheduled Board meeting.

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Walt to approve the Collins State Bank loan proposal in the amount of \$87,000 at 2:65%. Motion carried 3-0.

The discussion on the meeting with the 1st Responders and Fire Dept, building permit fees, sidewalk ordinance and the vacation policy was postponed until the next regular scheduled Board meeting. The proposed 2018 budget will be redone for the next scheduled meeting.

The next regular monthly meeting will be held on Thursday, November 9, 2017 at 6:30 PM. A motion was made by Walt and seconded by Siebert to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 3-0. Meeting adjourned at 8:07 PM.
