RAA Summer Baseball & Softball Sign-Up



From the Village Hall

Cat & Dog Licenses are due on or before April 1st. Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. **Failure to obtain a license by April 1st, will result in a late fee of \$20.00 per pet.**

Solid Waste & Recycling Carts need to be out on the curb by 5:00 am for service. DO NOT place carts within 4' of any objects such as utility poles, mailboxes, or vehicles. Carts need to be on separate sides of your driveway or at least 4' apart. Carts placed on the street or on snow banks will not be serviced.

Water Softeners: Any water softener installed must be rated to have a salt efficiency of at least 4000 grains of hardness removed per pound of salt used, must be approved and inspected by a representative of the Village of Reedsville and must regenerate on demand only.





- Village of Cleveland - .5% Sales Tax Proposal. No action taken

The First Responders monthly written report was presented by Barth. The Police Dept. monthly verbal report was presented by Mignon. The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Hoppenrath. A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Cummings to have the Attorney contact AT&T to see what the status is regarding an offer. Motion carried 4-0. The discussion on the Water Tower Painting Project and the Northern Pipe Inc. insurance claim was postponed to the next regular scheduled Board meeting. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Schreiber to table the sewer rate discussion. Motion carried 3-0. Reis abstained.

The Fire Dept. monthly written report was presented by Busse. Krahn will work on creating a hiring policy on paper.

The Public Works Dept monthly written report was presented by Krepline. The discussion on the 4th Street Bridge project was postponed to the next regular scheduled Board meeting.

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Schreiber to approve the 2018-2019 list of Election Inspectors as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

Cumming informed the Board that he met with the First Responder and Fire Dept officers in November. The issue of keeping confidential information private was discussed. No future meeting date was scheduled at this time. Correspondence was read from Reis regarding these meetings. Changes will be made on the vacation policy and the sidewalk ordinance for the next regular scheduled Board meeting. The budget will be reviewed for the possibility of creating a part-time position in the Clerk-Treasurer office

The next regular monthly meeting will be held on Thursday, January 11, 2018 at 6:30 PM. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 4-0. Meeting adjourned at 7:48 PM.
