**Thank You!** On the behalf of the citizens of the Village and the Village Board, I would like to say thank you to Andy Bubolz and Ryan Lorrigan for their many years of service as Board Members.

**Per Public Service Commission,** effective September 1, 2017 property owners will be responsible for ownership as well as maintenance of the sewer lateral from the dwelling to the sewer utility main within the street.

**Consumer Confidence Report (CCR):** In April 2017, a copy of the 2016 CCR was sent to all Reedsville Utility customers. If you did not receive it or want additional copies, the Report can be picked up at the Reedsville Municipal Building Lobby or found on the Village Website:

[www.reedsville.org](http://www.reedsville.org) under the Utility Department tab.

**Cat & Dog Licenses:** The late fee of \$15.00 will be assessed per dog or cat for failure to obtain a license by April 1<sup>st</sup>. Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$25.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$20.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot.

**Bicycle Registration:** All bicycles must be registered. To obtain the license, flag down a Village Police Officer. A \$2.00 fee covers a one-time registration.

**Board of Review:** The Village of Reedsville will hold its Board of Review on May 10, 2017 from 2:00 pm until 4:00 pm in the hall at the Reedsville Municipal Building located at 217 Menasha Street. Please contact the Clerk-Treasurer at 754-4371 for the procedural requirements if you would like to appear before the Board.

**Curfew:** Any person under the age of 18 unaccompanied by a parent or legal guardian may not be out and about between 11:00 PM - 6:00 AM Sunday through Thursday and 12:00 AM - 6:00 AM Friday and Saturday.

**Vehicle Nuisance:** It is illegal for any partially dismantled, non operating, wrecked, junked, unregistered or discarded vehicles to be placed or stored on any public or private property within the Village limits for a period of longer than five (5) days, unless said vehicles are stored within an enclosed building. This ordinance does not apply to property zoned for the sale or repair of vehicles. Having a vehicle behind your garage or under a tarp does not meet the requirement of an enclosed building.

**Open Burning/Fire Pits:** Controlled burning must be located off the public street pavement or street gutter, must be at least fifteen (15') from any lot line and may not be less than fifteen feet (15') from any building. Only clean wood may be used in fire pits and flames cannot extend more than two feet (2') above the pit. All fires must be monitored by a responsible person until the fire has extinguished itself completely. Persons utilizing and maintaining outdoor fires shall be responsible for any liability resulting from any damage caused by their fire.

**Pool Owners:** You must fill out the **Swimming Pool Discount Application** to qualify for the swimming pool discount. No other form of submittal will be accepted. This form can be found on the Reedsville website [www.reedsville.org](http://www.reedsville.org) or picked up at the Reedsville Municipal Building Lobby.

**Dogs Or Cats:** It shall be unlawful to own, harbor, shelter, or keep any dog or cat which runs at large within the limits of the Village. A dog or cat shall be deemed to be running at large when it is on any public street, alley, parks, or other grounds of the Village or any other premises in the Village other than the premises of its owner, his servant, agent or a member of his family of suitable age and discretion unless it is on a durable leash no longer than eight feet (8') or the dog or cat must be under control and within eight feet (8') of its owner, his servant, agent or a member of his family of suitable age and discretion at all times when off the premises of its owner.

It shall be unlawful for any person owning or in control of a dog or cat to allow or permit such animal to defecate on any private or public property owned by another unless such person shall remove all feces so deposited by such animal. Violation shall be punishable by a forfeiture of not less than twenty dollars (\$20.00) nor more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

**Littering Streets Prohibited:** No person shall place, throw, deposit, dump, scatter, leave or permit to remain any rubbish, paper, stone, wire, manure, snow, ice, dirt, grass, leaves, construction or yard waste, dirt or filthy substance upon the street, gutter, sidewalk, alley or public ground in the village. Each owner or occupant of any building, dwelling house, store, shop, tenement or structure of any kind and description fronting or abutting on any street, sidewalk, gutter, alley or public ground shall clean the same by sweeping, scraping or shoveling such rubbish, dirt or filth from the sidewalk by or before twelve o'clock (12:00) noon of each day, and shall cooperate with the street commissioner in keeping the streets, alleys, gutters and public grounds in a clean, tidy and orderly manner.

**Signs and Awnings:** No signs, posters or other advertising material shall be placed in or on any village owned property without permission from the Village Clerk-Treasurer or Department of Public Works Director.



### Proceedings of the Reedsville Village Board February 9, 2017

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on February 9, 2017 at 5:30 PM by Village President Andy Bubolz. Present were: Ryan Lorrigan, Jerry Reis, Jack Siebert and Jesse Walt: Also present were: Brad Busse (arrived at 5:43), Melanie Hills, Leroy Krepline, Rob Michaelson, Craig Schuh, Joe Tisler, John Schuh, Marc Holsen, Bob Brandt, Philip Burkart, Bob Campana, Tony Butturini and Jim Winter.

The minutes of the previous meeting of January 12, 2017 were approved as presented.

A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$210,434.08. Motion carried 4-0.

Correspondence was presented from Rural Insurance regarding the new agent and a Home Occupation Application/Permit from NEW LOCK N LOAD LLC. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Walt to approve the Home Occupation Application from NEW LOCK N LOAD LLC with an expiration date of February 1, 2018. Motion carried 4-0

The First Responders monthly written report was presented by Hills.

The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Michaelson. A discussion was held regarding discounts to customers who provide samples. The Fire Dept. verbal monthly report was presented by Busse. Krahn asked that he put his annual report in writing.

Holsen gave an update on the 4<sup>th</sup> Street Bridge Replacement Project to be done in the summer of 2018. Following a discussion, a motion was made by Reis and seconded by Walt to place a plug/seed combi-

nation on the wetland shelf at a cost of approximately \$7,500.00. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to place a concrete approach on either side of the bridge at a cost of approximately \$19,000.00. Motion carried 4-0. A motion was made by Lorrigan and seconded by Siebert to hire John Kropp from SMI to obtain the information on the easement needed for the bridge projects. Motion carried 4-0.

Krepline informed the Board that we cannot obtain any additional salt from the County for this year. Krepline will see if he can obtain some from any other surrounding municipality or business. A discussion was held on the purchase offer for the jeep. Tisler will do some research on the title.

Burkart presented the League of Wisconsin Municipalities Insurance proposal. Upon reviewing the presented proposals, a motion was made by Reis and seconded by Lorrigan to approve the proposal presented from the League in the amount of \$43,523.00. Motion carried 4-0.

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Lorrigan to place a request for proposal ad in the *League of Municipality Magazine* for a Municipal Attorney. Motion carried 4-0. Brandt gave an update on the purchase of the property located on 720 Manitowoc St and the proposed usage of that property. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to send him a letter letting him know the Village appreciates his purchasing the property and it's a great thing he is proposing but after conferring with the insurance agent we will not be able to assist with the help he proposed. Motion carried 4-0

The next regular monthly meeting will be held on Thursday, March 9, 2017 at 6:30 PM. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Walt to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried 4-0. Meeting adjourned at 8:43PM.
