"That sign must be a misprint." We hear it over and over
again. The sign saying "Reedville" in the Collins Depot
attracts a lot of attention for its unique spelling of the
Village's name. As we can tell, after the Village changed
names from Mud Creek to Reed(s)ville, the spelling without
the 's' was correct. As the Chicago and Northwestern
railroad came through the community in 1872, the railroad
put up a wonderful depot with the Reedville sign. As the
years passed the Village became known as Reedsville but the
railroad did not want to change the sign. Be sure to visit the

Reedsville Lions Club News and Events

The Reedsville Lions Club will be participating in the *Community Diabetes Awareness Project* during the month of October. We will be distributing door hangers, to make the people of Reedsville and the rural areas aware of Diabetes and it's affects now we need to distribute them to the Reedsville area including some of the rural areas.

What a simple but powerful way for our club to respond to one of the most costly epidemics in the United State and the World. Also this allows us to build our image in the community that we serve.

We have been selected to take part in the Wisconsin Public Service's, Service Club Energy Challenge. We are 1 of 20 clubs chosen to compete for a \$1,000.00 grant that we will be able to use for any new project or need in our community. This challenge runs from September 1st till November 30th, 2011.

To receive the \$1,000, club members must complete three energy savings tasks;

1. Install 10 home weatherization kits for residents in our community.
2. Listen to an energy conservation speaker at one of our meetings.
3. 10 club members must reduce our homes energy consumption by 5% during the 3 month contest.

Results will be determined 12/23/11 and grants awarded by 1/31/12.

Also, the date for the Fall Festival is set for Sunday November 14th 2011 at the High School. Last year we made over \$700.00.

Like last year we a cosponsoring this event with the Reedsville Lioness and the Society for the Preservation of St Mary's.

Mammograms Save Lives

October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Now's the perfect time to remind women to make an appointment for a mammogram and a breast health exam.

Women should consult with their health care provider to discuss their individual risk for breast cancer and to develop a personalized schedule for breast cancer screening.

The American Cancer Society recommends a clinical breast exam every three years for women age 40-49, and every year for women age 50 and older.

Mammograms are vitally important because:

- One out of every eight American women will develop breast cancer at some point in her life.
- Breast cancer is the leading cause of cancer death among women ages 35 to 50.
- Eight out of nine women diagnosed with breast cancer have no family history of the disease. 70% of women who develop breast cancer have no identifiable risk factors.

Medical experts agree that having regular mammograms can detect cancers of a smaller size, when the disease can be more easily treated, often months or years before it can be detected by physical examination.

Breast cancer screening can often be done with little or no out-of-pocket costs to women age 40 or older. Most insurance carriers and government-funded programs such as Medicare cover mammography services.
