

Overcoming the Transportation Barrier

The ability to travel around town, going where we want or need to go whenever we need or choose to, is a freedom that most of us enjoy. We take for granted that we can hop on a bus or slip behind the wheel of a car to drive whenever we please. But for a growing portion of the elderly population, once routine outings such as going to medical appointments, the grocery store, the library, or social outings now present daily challenges. As seniors age, driving is not an option for many of them, and they need to find other methods for getting to and from their daily activities. Research indicates that older individuals who are no longer able to drive attend fewer medical appointments, go shopping and out for meals less often, and reduce the frequency of their visits to friends and family compared to drivers of the same age. This leads to increased isolation and loneliness which can dramatically impact quality of life.

The good news is that there are many options in Manitowoc County to ensure our senior population has adequate transportation options. From our Volunteer Rural Elderly program to Assist-To-Transport, we can accommodate nearly any need at a very low cost. Most recently, we have transported individuals for medical appointments, grocery store visits, and social outings.

Do you have a wheel chair or walker? No problem! We have a variety of vehicles that are wheelchair accessible and strive to provide each senior the best experience possible. The Aging and Disability Resource Center of the Lakeshore partners with Maritime Metro Transit to provide a one-stop-shop for all transportation needs. You simply have to call our mobility manager at (920) 686-6977 and she will appropriately match you to the transportation program that best suits your needs.

If you live outside of the city of Manitowoc or Two Rivers, we offer our Volunteer Rural Elderly program. We service various parts of the county each day of the week and, with a minimum of two riders, have been able to help those homebound in our rural communities to get to doctor appointments, grocery shopping, and more. This program, specifically, requires you to be 65 or older and runs with the help of our volunteer drivers. If you aren't in need of the ride but would love to serve your community, please contact our mobility manager to find out how you can get involved in our volunteer driver program.

Seniors maintaining their independence is crucial for healthy and active aging and transportation plays a huge role in that. If you or someone you love is in need of transportation services, please call our mobility manager at the number above to make a reservation today!



Proceedings of the Reedsville Village Board

June 14, 2018

The monthly meeting of the Reedsville Village Board was called to order on June 14, 2018, at 6:30 PM by Village President Jesse Walt. Present were: Joe Cummings, Jerry Reis, Patty Schreiber and Jack Siebert: Absent. Chad Rataichek. Also present were: Stacey Barth, Leroy Krepline, Corey Hoppenrath, Todd Maertz, Justin Meyer, Craig Schuh, John Schuh, Joe Tisler and Sonya Knier-Collins

A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Schreiber to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

It was decided to cancel the viewing of the video until next month.

Public Input: none

A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cummings to approve the minutes of the May 10, 2018 meeting as presented. Motion carried 4-0

A motion was made by Schreiber and seconded by Siebert to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$131,412.18. Motion carried 4-0.

Correspondence was presented by Michael and Bobbi Reedy requesting an address for their new home. A motion was made by Reis and seconded by Siebert to assign 512 S 5th Street as their address. Motion carried 4-0. Krahn presented the 2017 Financial Report and the post card for parade participation. Following a discussion, it was decided that Ayres Associates will put in a car with a trailer behind and that Walt will ride in the trailer.

The First Responders monthly written report was presented by Barth. A motion was made by Cummings and seconded by Schreiber to accept the resignation from Jo Siebert. Motion carried 3-0 (Siebert abstained)

The Police Dept. monthly written report was presented by Tisler

The Utility Departments monthly written report was presented by Meyer. C Schuh gave an update on the AT&T MOU and the tower painting project. Following a discussion, a motion was made by Reis and seconded by Schreiber to submit an application to the USDA for proposed street projects and to have Ayres Associates prepare a contact for their engineering services to submit the application in an amount not to exceed \$12,000.00. Motion carried 4-0. Discussion on the sewer rates was postponed until the next regular scheduled Village Board meeting. Resolution 2018-2 regarding the CMAR was introduced by Reis. A motion was made by Siebert and seconded by Cummings to approve the Resolution as presented. Motion carried 4-0. A special closed session was scheduled for June 21, 2018 to meet with Atty Mozinski regarding the AT&T Memo of Understanding.

of items needed per the Hiring Policy.
