

I am working on providing as much information as I can before then though. I have created a page (<https://www.baraboorange.org/news/beci-project>) on our website that includes a better link to the finicky map that the MGS group produced. I am also planning to host a meeting at the Carnegie-Schadde Memorial Public Library (in Baraboo) to help people submit their comments through the GeoVoice web application.

I just happened to get GIS data for the lines and will be publishing that on our website too — with our own Protected Lands data which is absent from the MGS maps.

You're right that the National Natural Landmark should be enough to deter them and there are a few segments that intersect that boundary. We are prepared to defend those particular segments as best as we are able. We also have friends in the Sauk Prairie Conservation Alliance that are mounting a defense of their lands of the former Badger Army Ammunition Plant.

I'm glad you connected and happy to hear there's mounting opposition throughout the Project area.
