HOUSE NUMBERS

Make sure your home address is clearly visible from the street. Emergency response vehicles need to be able to see your address.

Keep bushes and trees trimmed to avoid house numbers being obstructed

KEEP YARDS MOWED & TREES TRIMMED

City ordinance requires homeowners to keep their yards mowed and free of weeds. Your lawn should be no longer than 6 inches.

Do not mow grass clippings into the street

Trees and bushes should not block the view at an intersection. Remember to keep them trimmed. Be aware of wires!

If this is not done, the property owner will be notified in writing. If the issue is not resolved by deadline given then the City will take care of it at the owners expense of \$100.00 per hour for first time with an increase of \$100.00 per hour per additional nuisance.

* Wheels should point toward your house, away from the street Cart should be 1 foot from curb, not the street. Cart should be 3 feet from any other obstructions such as mailboxes, trees, poles, etc. No bungee cords on the lid. IF IN DOUBT, NOTICE THE CART'S POSITION AFTER SERVICE AND PLACE IT THE SAME WAY EACH WEEK.

ALUMINUM AND TIN CANS - Includes small scrap pieces of clean aluminum. Labels may remain on cans.

GLASS – Please rinse. All colors of glass are accepted. Labels may remain on glass. NO BROKEN GLASS!

PLASTIC- Please rinse. Labels may remain on containers. Items with #1, #2 and #5 in the recycling triangles are acceptable.

PAPER PRODUCTS/PAPERBOARD -

This includes newspaper, ad inserts, magazines, catalogs, mixed residential mail and paperboard. (Paperboard includes items such as cereal, snack and tissue boxes as well as paper grocery bags.)

CARDBOARD- Can accept small amounts of cardboard. No pizza boxes. Please break down cardboard to prevent it from getting stuck in your container

Please discard items not recyclable as trash.

** These items are not recyclable! **

Styrofoam containers, waxed or food contaminated paper, drinking glasses, windowpanes, light bulbs, broken glass, paper towels and aerosol cans.


HYDRANT FLUSHING

During flushing your water may be discolored. If this happens run your could water for 3 or 4 minutes, wait and if still discolored run again. It is recommended to not wash clothes during this time, as it may discolor your clothes.



COMPOST SITE


Perfect place to bring all the clippings from vard work!

- Will open in April (weather permitting)
- Only yard and garden waste allowed
- Brush no larger than 4 inches in diameter
- Absolutely no garbage!
- Take your bags with you

** FROZEN PIPES**

Spring may be around the corner but pipes can still freeze.

Tips for preventing frozen pipes:



- Keep doors open between heated and unheated rooms. This includes cabinet doors to pipes.
- Keep heat at 55 degrees or warmer, even if you are away.
- Keep slight water flow in low use areas (increased water bill will be cheaper than broken pipes)
