HYDRANT FLUSHING



The city will be flushing the hydrants the week of May 22 (weather permitting).

During flushing your water may be discolored. If this happens run your could water for 3 or 4 minutes, wait and if still discolored run again. It is recommended to not wash clothes during this time, as it may discolor your clothes.

COMPOST SITE

Will open April (weather permitted)

- Only yard and garden waste allowed
- Brush no larger than 4 inches in diameter
- Absolutely no garbage!
- Take your bags with you

TO THE CAT OWNERS:



Please do not let your cat roam free


This city has a real problem with feral cats, and we do not need yours adding to the problem.

TO THE DOG OWNERS:

- 2 dogs allowed per household
- Keep your dog under your control (put on leash)
- * Dogs Should not be loose in neighborhood
- Clean up after them, carry bags with you!!!!!
- Do not let dogs bark for longer than a few minutes
- Get a tag at City hall to help if you loose your dog

HOUSE NUMBERS

Make sure your home address is clearing visable from the street.
Emergency response vehicles need to be able to see your address.



KEEP YARDS MOWED & TREES TRIMMED

City ordinance requires homeowners to keep their yards mowed and free of weeds. Your lawn should be no longer than 6 inches.

Trees and bushes should not block the view at an intersection. Remember to keep them trimmed. Be aware of wires!

If this is not done, the property owner will be notified in writing. If the issue is not resolved by the date given the City will take care of it at the owners expense of \$100.00 per hour for first time with an increase of \$100.00 per hour per additional nuisance.

RECREATIONAL CAMPFIRES:

are allowed in the city provided:

- 25 feet away from all buildings of combustible materials
- Fire must be constantly attended by an adult
- A 3 foot pit of ring for the fire or above ground fire pit no larger than 36 inches in diameter with a screen
- A minimum of one portable fire extinguisher or garden hose connected to water source must be available
- Materials To Burn: Tree Wood, dimensional lumber, small branches, brush or charcoal
- The fire must be immediately extinguished if the pose a fire safety risk or if they are not in compliance.

BE SMART! Pay attention to the weather.

DO NOT BURN if windy!!!



Water/Sewer Utility Bill Information:

- Meters are read on the 30th of the month
- Bills are mailed on/about the 3rd of the month
- Save paper sign up for email billing
- Bills are due monthly, must be received by end of month to avoid 10% late fees.

Monthly amount is deducted on the 25th - Use savings or checking account.
