Sealed bids, plainly marked "Roadway Resurfacing – Cheshire, MA", may be submitted to the Town of Cheshire, 191 Church Street, Cheshire, MA 01225, until April 22, 2024 at 2PM at which time they will be publicly opened and read. SUBMIT ORIGINAL AND ONE COPY.

This project is being bid per MGL Ch 30 §39M. A 5% bid bond in the form of a certified check, bank treasurer's or cashier's check, or a bid bond from a MA licensed surety company is required at the time of bid opening. A 50% Labor and Materials Payment Bond will be required upon execution of the contract. Wage rates for this bid are subject to prevailing wage rates as per MGL Chapter 149, Section 26 - 27f inclusive and Davis Bacon Wage rates, both of which are provided in Attachment B. The higher rate prevails.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION SUMMARY

The work is located on multiple roads in Cheshire, MA. BASE Bid locations (Ingalls Road, Curran Road and Stewart White Road) will be funded through MassWorks, and Chapter 90. See Bid Form for location-specific details.

- The Town of Cheshire requests all work to be completed by October 31, 2024
- Contractors shall consult the Town of Cheshire DPW Director, McGrath at 413-743-1690 x. 110,
 dpw@cheshire-ma.gov , prior to the bid opening to review the work areas.
- Estimated volumes by location are shown on the bid page. Amounts above or below the estimated
 amounts shall be billed by the unit price bid. Materials more than estimated volume will only be
 paid with acceptable backup documentation. An increase in materials amount by 10% or more
 shall be pre-approved in a signed Change Order, per included form. Contractor shall consult with
 the DPW Director to review the work areas prior to bidding and request an Addendum if they believe
 a measurement or quantity is incorrect.
- This project is considered a "book job" and, where not superseded by this IFB, should follow 2023
 Edition of the Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges to the extent applicable to municipal projects. Any permitting required is the responsibility of the Town.
- Period prices for Asphalt and Diesel per MassDOT apply.
- The Town will be responsible for Police Detail / Traffic Control / Signage as needed.
- The Town will retain all millings, and will provide a designated area at the Highway Garage Yard for the Contractor to deposit them.
- The Contractor will communicate with the DPW Director daily for the need of Details for the next day.

Work is to be completed per all current MassDOT specs where applicable to Town roads except where contradicted in the next section: TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS. Please see 2023 Edition of the Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS ASPHALT RECLAMATION, MILLING, RESURFACING

Specifications are per 2023 Edition of the Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges for Reclaimed Pavement for Base Course and/or Sub Base where applicable for municipalities and Specification with Emulsion shall follow Item 403.2 "Full Depth Reclamation with Emulsified Asphalt Stabilization".

Surface Preparation

Surface preparation, which may include cleaning and grubbing; removal of visible cobbles; drainage; sign, mail boxes and guard rail resetting; etc., will be the responsibility of the municipality and will be completed before the contractor moves onto the job.

However, adjusting of street irons - valve covers, manhole covers, drop inlet gratings, catch basins will be the responsibility of the Contractor and is to be included in the pricing.

Protection of Structures is defined as: installation of an approved geotextile fabric under all catch basin grates, and supplementally cover all existing catch basin grates with approved steel plates, so that no soil and/or milled material enters into the structure, however at no time are the catch basins to be placed fully out of service. In the event material does enter into the structure then the Contractor shall immediately clean the unit to the satisfaction of the Participant. Once the work has been completed, and the roadway leveled, then the Contractor is to remove the plates from the catch basin structures.

Traffic Control

Traffic control, including flagging or police details, warning lights, barricades, and warning signs, is the responsibility of the municipality. Unless otherwise specified, the roadway shall be kept open to traffic at all times, with traffic discontinued on the lane being reclaimed. Controlled traffic may be permitted as soon as the base has been rolled.

Structures

Per MassDOT specifications for Asphalt Reclamation, lowering of structures (lowered below subgrade and plated) is incidental and not paid as a separate pay item. The number of structures is given for information on the estimates

page and bid form, but shall be included in the total price. Additional, over the number on the estimates sheet may be paid at the Additional Item price.

COLD PLANING EXISTING ROADWAYS & THE DISPOSAL OF MATERIAL- Per specifications of Section 120, Subsection 120,25 HOT MIX ASPHALT PAVEMENT MILLING MassDOT Supplemental Specifications February 25, 2010.-TC-11 and as updated.

SECTION A: COLD PLANING/MILLING - STANDARD

SECTION B: MICRO-MILLING

MICROMILLING SHALL BE AS PER SPECIFICATIONS BELOW EXCEPT A MILLING MACHINE WITH FINER TEETH WILL BE USED TO WORK AROUND STRUCTURES AND CREATE A FINER MILLING PRODUCT.

Also known as surface planing or fine milling, micro-milling uses a milling drum with more teeth and a tighter lacing pattern to create a smoother surface than the traditional milling process. This smoother surface can be opened to traffic with no further treatment and also provides a better surface for overlays, particularly thin and porous lifts

Standard milling – Teeth are spaced 5/8" apart Micro-milling – Teeth are spaced 2/10" apart, or approximately three times as many bits

Process and Equipment

Micro-milling is performed using essentially the same process as traditional milling, but with a micro-mill drum in place of the standard drum. The smoothness of a finished surface relies heavily on factors such as milling machine speed, how teeth are located on the cutting drum, and the speed (RPMs) of the cutting drum. Depending on specifications, operators may need to proceed at the lower range of traditional milling speeds to meet smoothness requirements, and pay closer attention to milling controls.

- (a) The work to be done under this item consists of removing existing Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) pavement courses along designated roadways, from within adjacent intersections, and from around various roadway structures, by cold planer and by supplemental cold planing methods.
- (b) The work requires cold planing to a minimum depth of one and one-half (1 1/2) inches up to a maximum depth of two (2) inches across the entire existing bituminous roadway surface, inclusive of the area(s) immediately around and about all existing castings in addition to adjacent roadway intersection areas as designated and/or as otherwise pre-approved by the Engineer. Further, the cold planing operation shall also be used, from time to time as the Highway Super may direct, to re-profile the cross-section of the existing roadway in order to alleviate drainage problems and/or to eradicate other roadway imperfections.
- (c)UNLESS EXPRESSLY NOTIFIED THAT THE MUNICIPALITY WISHES TO RETAIN EXCAVATED/MILLED MATERIALS (I.E. "MILLINGS"), all excavated/milled material shall become the property of the Contractor. The Contractor shall be responsible for the immediate removal and subsequent legal disposal of the material. In addition, any such work shall be done in an environmentally proper manner, inclusive of controlling both dust and debris.

FOR THIS PROJECT, THE TOWN WILL RETAIN ALL MILLINGS, AND WILL PROVIDE A DESIGNATED AREA AT THE HIGHWAY GARAGE YARD FOR THE CONTRACTOR TO DEPOSIT THEM.

- (d) Under this item the Contractor is to work closely with the DPW Director to coordinate and schedule the cold planing operation.
- (e) No cold planing shall be performed on arterial roadways before 8:30 A.M. nor after 4:00 P.M.. Arterial roadways shall be designated by the Highway Super. The Contractor is further advised that the hours of operations are set by law. No machines or equipment are to be activated before 7:00 A.M. & no work is to extend beyond 4:30 P.M.. In addition no weekend or holiday work will be allowed unless special permission is granted.

Equipment

- (f) The cold planer, and any other motorized vehicular equipment, shall be equipped with taillights, headlights, and necessary reflectors so that they can be operated in traffic with complete safety.
- (g) The cold planing machine shall be designed and built for planing flexible pavement and possess the added ability

to plane cement concrete patches when encountered in bituminous pavement. It shall be self-propelled and have the means for planing, without tearing or gouging, the underlying surface, and the cold planing machine shall also have the inherent ability to directly convey the cold planed material into trucks as the operation commences. Variable lacing patterns shall be provided to permit a rough grooved surface, or smooth surface as directed by the Engineer. The machine shall be capable of being operated at speeds from 10 to 40 feet per minute, and designed so that the operator can at all times observe the planing operation without leaving his control area.

- (h) The cold planing machine shall be adjustable as to crown and depth. The equipment shall be demonstrated to have been operated successfully on similar work completed prior to the award of this contract.
- (i) The equipment furnished by the Contractor shall be in good repair and shall be maintained so as to produce a clean cut into the pavement at all times.
- (j)The cold planer must be equipped with an elevating device capable of loading planed material directly into dump trucks while operative and with all necessary safety devices such as flashing lights and back-up signals so as to operate in traffic with complete safety.
- (k) Supplemental equipment of a smaller scale, capable of performing cold planing functions around and about roadway structures, and/or other similar areas which are not commonly accessible to the primary cold planing machinery, shall be utilized by the Contractor to 'detail' the work zone and to ultimately complete the cold planing operation.
- (1) Cold-planers mounted on pneumatic tires will not be employed except for trimming and clean-up operations.
- (m) Dust control equipment on the cold planer must comply with EPA air quality standards. The equipment shall meet the standards set by the Air Quality Act for noise and pollution.

Method of Construction

- (n) The Contractor shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of the DPW Director that the equipment, crew and construction methods he intends to use are capable of completing the work in accordance with these specifications and within the time allotted.
- (o) The Contractor is advised that under certain conditions (i.e bus traffic, emergency vehicle access, arterial roadways, etc.) vehicular traffic flow must be maintained, therefore the Contractor must be prepared to accommodate vehicular travel throughout the project zone for the entire duration of the project while these process' are underway as it shall not be impaired.
- (p) No work is to be undertaken until the Municipality has established construction signs and/or safety devices around and about the project zone periphery. To that end the Contractor shall not commence operations until he has verified that semi-permanent signs (i.e. 'Road Under Construction') and/or daily signing (i.e. 'Detour') has been appropriately established. However, the Contractor shall be responsible for establishing supplemental signage, and/or safety devices, as he deems necessary in order to further provide for the safety of the pedestrian and the motoring public, as well as for affording him the opportunity of moving his process forward without interruption. Under this clause the Contractor shall work closely with the Municipality Agent in order to coordinate the signing activities in a timely and reasonable manner. Further, due to the nature of this work, the Contractor shall be required, from time to time, to erect, move, relocate, repair, and/or to remove at days end, any site sign in order to either expedite his work or to otherwise accommodate the safety and/or delineate the project zone and/or its active or inactive detour status and route line, and this work shall be done either at his discretion and/or at the request of a Municipality Agent(s) or Officer. Noncompliance with any such request, as herein described, shall be grounds for the Municipality to halt work until such remedial measures have been taken, and any such loss of time by the Contractor shall be at his own expense.
- (q) Prior to the cold planing process, the Contractor is to install an approved geotextile fabric under all catch basin grates, and is to supplementally cover all existing catch basin grates with approved steel plates, so that no soil

and/or milled material enters into the structure, however at no time are the catch basins to be placed fully out of service. In the event milled material does enter into the structure then the Contractor shall immediately clean the unit to the satisfaction of the Engineer. Once the milling has been completed, and the roadway leveled, then the Contractor is to remove the plates from the catch basin structures.

- (r) Once the cold planing process has begun the Contractor is obliged to carry this effort forward without interruption, yet in accordance with all work hour restrictions unless otherwise directed by the Highway Super.
- (s) The two (2) inch cut to a pre-determined grade and/or profile, or any other specified lesser depth, shall be made in one pass. To that end the cold planing machine shall be adjustable with regard to both crown and depth. The equipment shall be demonstrated to have been operated successfully on similar work completed prior to the award of this contract.
- (t) Cold planing operations shall not be limited to just the primary roadway surface, but shall also extend into the adjacent intersections as well. The limit of this work shall be determined 'in the field' by the Highway Super so as to best meet the existing conditions and to further provide for a smooth pavement transitioning.
- (u) The milled or planed surface shall conform generally to the grade and cross slope required to best meet the prevailing roadway grade conditions and such milled work shall be free from tears, gouges, breaks, or excessive grooves. The surface shall be free of imperfections that will prevent the milled or planed surface from being resurfaced with new pavement subsequent to this operation. Surface texture shall be as specified by the Highway Super and shall provide acceptable ride-ability for traffic in the event that resurfacing is delayed.
- (v) The minimum width of pavement planed in each pass shall be approximately seventy-two (72) inches except in areas to be trimmed and edged.
- (w) The Contractor shall exercise caution while cold planing in the vicinity of roadway structures and therefore shall not damage any roadway structure and/or casting during the course of these cold planing operations. Any damage shall be repaired at the Contractors expense and to the satisfaction of the Highway Super.
- (x) The milled material (including material removed by other means) shall be immediately removed from the site by means of discharging the milled material directly into trucks. All residual milled material is to be broomed from the roadway so that no residual material remains on the roadway surface upon completion of the milling process. When working adjacent to traffic, the Contractor shall immediately remove material that is spilled on the traveled way. The contractor shall be responsible for all clean-up work along gutters, around castings and along the entire roadway.
- (y) Where proposed paving is to be started or ended at the project limits, a cut shall be made to a depth of one and one-half (1 1/2) inches. The end station cut shall be dressed to a clean vertical edge. All loosened material shall be promptly removed prior to returning traffic to the excavated surface.
- (z) Immediately upon completion of the cold planing (i.e. 'detailing') operation around and about manholes and/or catch basins, the Contractor shall apply a bright ribbon of orange flourescent paint on the projecting face of the manhole casting, such that oncoming traffic is made aware of the castings presence. In the event the cold planing operation has caused any casting to project more than one and a half (1 ½) inches above the milled surface of the roadway then the Contractor shall also provide a stabilized three foot (3) high traffic cone on the casting in addition to the paint until such time as other remedial measures can be taken.

Method of Measurement

(aa) Measurement shall be by the square yard of the surface area that is actually cold planed, **however no deduction will be made for roadway castings.**

Basis of Payment

(ab) the Contractor will be paid the contract unit price per square yard for cold planing the bituminous concrete pavement, for immediately loading the milled material onto trucks and disposing of the material(s) at an off-site location, for 'detailing' the project zone around and about manholes, curbs etc., and for cleaning the roadway, which unit price shall include full compensation for all labor materials, tools and equipment, and all incidentals necessary to complete the work under this Item, as directed by the Highway Super, and as specified herein.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS HOT MIX ASPHALT

- 1. NOTE ON SPEC 460: All materials (mix) and application methods for paving must be MassDOT approved per Subsection 460: Hot Mix Asphalt Pavement for Local Streets latest Edition. For purposes of this bid, all roadways are to meet the mixture designation for 50 gyrations (aka "Level 1") including materials for handwork and berm. Adjustment of mix to 75 gyrations (aka "Level 2") roads is allowable with permission of the DPW Director; however, no pricing adjustment will be made for this change. There are no "Level 3" roadways contemplated in this bid. Use of transfer machines will be rare, but in the case where they are desired, a separate contract for their use (MassDOT pay item is by the ton) may be negotiated between the Contractor and the Town. Sweeping will be the responsibility of the municipality and not included in the bid prices. In all cases, when referencing the MassDOT specification, "Department" shall mean the "Town" and "Engineer" shall mean the DPW Director or their designee.
- 2. Asphalt Emulsion "Tack Coat" will be required, as directed by the DPW Director. Tack coat shall be MassDOT spec and priced by the gallon.
- 3. All work should only be done under proper weather conditions.
- 4. Timeliness and Approved Delays: Time shall be of the essence regarding performance of each and every portion of the contracted work. Work schedules approved by the Town of Cheshire shall be binding upon the Contractor except for reasonable delays due to weather, failure of the Town in the timely performance of any of its prerequisite obligations, or site-related circumstances beyond the control of the Contractor. Extensions of time resulting from such delays are subject to approval by the Town and may not be unreasonably withheld.
- 5. Police or Flagging Detail is the responsibility of the Town. If the Contractor fails to appear for or cancel scheduled work to which police, flag people or public works personnel are assigned on an additional pay basis, Contractor will be subject to contract back charges for costs incurred at the discretion of the Town. Such charges may include preparation by others that is required to be repeated. This shall not be the case in the event of inclement weather which precludes the work from being accomplished.
- 6. A MASSDOT PREQUALIFIED CONTRACTOR MUST MEET THE PREQUALIFICATION REQUIREMENT FOR THIS PROJECT.
- 7. Award will be based on the estimated quantities provided times the price submitted. The vendor whose total is lowest for the combination of all items (BASE bid plus Alternates 1 and 2) will be awarded unless the Town has a legitimate reason to not award to the low bidder. It is Cheshire's intent to award the BASE bid; the Add Alternates will be evaluated in their order, and as budget allows, one or both Alternates will be awarded.
- 8. All awards are dependent on the Town of Cheshire funding availability for the projects. Contracts resulting from this IFB will be non-exclusive. The Town reserves the right to do work or purchase goods of the type covered by this contract with their own forces or with other contracts following MGL Ch30b §5 or MGL Ch30 §39M.

All materials and application methods must be MassDOT approved. Projects are considered "book jobs" and, where not superseded by this IFB, should follow 2023 Edition of the Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges to the extent applicable to municipal projects.

PRICE ADJUSTMENT FOR HOT MIX ASPHALT

A fluctuating price will be required for this bid, to allow for price adjustments based on the period price of asphalt by the Mass.DOT. This provision applies to all mixtures containing 100 tons or more of hot mix asphalt mixtures containing liquid asphalt cement.

The Price Adjustment will be a separate payment item, and only when the price varies more than 5%. ANY FUNDS TO BE RETURNED TO TOWNS WILL BE IN THE FORM OF A CHECK, NOT A CREDIT ON A FOLLOWING YEARS' OR FUTURE PROJECT. A CREDIT IS INCONSISTENT WITH CHAPTER 90 REQUIREMENTS.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

- 1. All bids must contain a filled out signed BID FORM. Minor defects on a bid submittal may be waived by the Town as long as the error or variation is not prejudicial or preferential to the other bidders and that it may be corrected without affect upon substantive elements of the bid such as, but not limited to, price, quality, payment terms or delivery schedule. Resolution will be determined by the Town with advice of the Chief Procurement Officer.
- 2. Bids which are incomplete, not properly endorsed or signed, or otherwise contrary to instructions may be rejected as non-responsive. Conditional bids will not be accepted. Any bid arriving after the time and date of bid opening will not be accepted. A 5% Bid Bond/Deposit payable to the Town of Cheshire in the form of a bank/cashier's check or bond issued by a MA licensed Surety registered with the IRS is also required.
- 3. As the TOWN OF CHESHIRE is exempt from the payment of Federal Excise Taxes and Massachusetts Sales Tax, prices quoted herein are not to include these taxes.
- 4. A bidder will be held to the terms and the prices on the bid form for the duration of the contract period if a contract is signed by both parties within 30 days from bid opening.
- 5. The TOWN reserves the right to reject any and all bids, in total or in part.
- 6. The bidder will be bound by all applicable statutory provisions of law of the Federal Government and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
- 7. The contractor will be required to indemnify and hold harmless the TOWN OF CHESHIRE for all damages to life and property that may occur due to contractor's negligence or that of his/her employees, subcontractors, etc., during the contract.
- 8. If in the judgment of the TOWN OF CHESHIRE, any property is needlessly damaged by an act or omission of the contractor, the amount of damages will be deducted from money due the contractor or may be recovered from said contractor in legal action.
- 9. Any restrictions, qualifications, or deviations from specifications must appear either on the bid form or on an attachment thereto.
- 10. A contract will be signed between the awarded bidder and the TOWN OF CHESHIRE. A sample contract is attached. Any provisions of the contract that cannot be met by a prospective bidder must be brought to the attention of TOWN during the open question period, otherwise submittal of a bid constitutes acceptance of the Town's standard terms and conditions.
- 11.. The contract resulting from this bid will be awarded to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder based upon bid price, past performance and reliability of the bidder, quality of product and/or service, and degree of exclusion, exemption, or restrictions on the bid form. In the event of identical and responsible low bids, the Contractor with an office in Berkshire County, MA will be chosen. If neither bidder has an office in Berkshire County, a coin toss overseen by the Chief Procurement Officer will determine the award.
- 13. Any questions about the technical specifications of the project or the bid process must be submitted to the Chief Procurement Officer and all prospective bidders will be notified if an addendum is required.

- 14. Payments of invoices will be made within 30 days upon receipt of invoice by the Town.
- 15. The Town will be available to answer any general questions about bid procedure, etc., but no question will be answered that in any way could give an unfair advantage to a bidder. All inquiries concerning this bid should be directed to:

The Owner shall pay the Contractor for the performance of this Agreement, subject to

A. Definition of Term: The Term "Substantial completion" shall mean the date certified by the Owner when construction is sufficiently complete, in accordance with the

Contract Documents, so the Owner may occupy the project, or designated portion(s) thereof, for the use for which it is intended.

- B. Time as Essential Condition: It is understood and agreed that the commencement of and substantial completion of the work are essential conditions of this Agreement. It is further agreed that time is of the essence for each and every portion of the Contract Documents wherein a definite and certain length of time is fixed for the performance of any act whatsoever; and where under the Contract Documents any additional time is allowed for the completion of any work, the new time fixed by such extension shall be of the essence of this Agreement. It is understood and agreed that the times for the completion of the work are reasonable, taking into consideration the average climatic range and usual industrial conditions prevailing in this locality.
- C. Progress and Completion: Contractor shall commence work promptly upon execution of this Agreement and shall prosecute and complete the work regularly, diligently and uninterruptedly at such a rate of progress as will insure Substantial Completion within the stipulated number of calendar days.
- D. Liquidated Damages: None apply.

4. Performance of the Work

- A. Direction of the Work: The Contractor shall supervise and direct the Work, using his best skills and attention which shall not be less than such state of skill and attention generally rendered by the contracting profession for projects similar to the Project in scope, difficulty and location. The Contractor shall maintain adequate supervisory personnel at the project site during the performance of the Work. He shall be solely responsible for all construction means, methods, techniques, sequences and procedures and for coordinating all portions of the Work under the Agreement.
- B. Responsibility for the Work: (1) The Contractor shall be responsible to the Owner for the acts and omissions of his employees, Subcontractors and their agents and employees, and other persons performing any of the Work under a contract with the Contractor. This obligation shall also extend to the presence on the Site of suppliers of materials or equipment, their employees, contractors, and agents engaged in the work.
 - (2) The Contractor shall not be relieved from his obligations to perform the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents either by the activities or duties of the Owner in its administration of the Agreement, or by inspections, tests or approvals required or performed by persons other than the Contractor. Approval or review of any documents plans specifications or drawings by the Owner shall not relieve the Contractor of its duties and obligations hereunder.
- C. Permits and Fees: Unless otherwise expressly provided, the Contractor shall secure and pay for all permits and fees, licenses and inspections necessary for the proper execution and completion of the Work which are customarily secured after execution

- of the Agreement and which are legally required at the time the bids are received, and the same shall at all times be the property of the Owner and shall be delivered to the Owner upon completion of the Project.
- D. Notices, Compliance With Laws: (1) The Contractor shall give all notices and comply with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and lawful orders of any public authority bearing on the performance of the Work.  - (3) If the Contractor performs any Work which he knows or should know is contrary to such laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, and without such notice to the Owner, he shall assume full responsibility therefor and shall bear all costs attributable thereto.
 - (4) In the performance of the Work, the Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations including those relating to workplace and employee safety. The Contractor shall notify the Owner immediately of any conditions at the place of the work which violate said laws and regulations and shall take prompt action to correct and eliminate any such violations.

- G. Drawings, Specifications and Submittals:
 - (1) The Contractor shall maintain at the site for the Owner one record copy of all Drawings, Specifications, Addenda, Change Orders and other Modifications, and "As-Built" Drawings and Specifications in good order and marked currently to record all changes made during construction, and approved Shop Drawings, Product Data and Samples. These shall be delivered to the Owner upon completion of the Work.

- (2) By approving and submitting Shop Drawings, Product Data and Samples, the Contractor represents that he has determined and verified all materials, field measurements, and field construction criteria related thereto, or will do so, and that he has checked and coordinated the information contained within such submittals with the requirements of the Work and of the Contract Documents.
- (3) The Contractor shall not be relieved of responsibility for any deviation from the requirements of the Contract Documents by the Owner's approval of Shop Drawings, Product Data or Samples unless the Contractor has specifically informed the Owner in writing of such deviation at the time of submission and the Owner has given written approval to the specific deviation. The Contractor shall not be relieved from responsibility for errors or omissions in the Shop Drawings, Product Data or Samples by the Owner's approval thereof.

- (5) No portion of the Work requiring submission of a Shop Drawing, Product Data or Sample shall be commenced until the submittal has been approved by the Owner. All such portions of the Work shall be in accordance with approved submittals.
- H. Protection of the Work and Owner's Property: The Contractor shall at all times safely guard the Owner's property from injury or loss in connection with this Agreement. He shall at all times safely guard and protect his own work, and that of adjacent property from damage. The Contractor shall replace or make good any such damage, loss or injury. The Contractor shall clean the work area and restore it to its original condition upon completion of the work.
- I. Quality of the Work: The Contractor shall perform the work in a good, workmanlike manner. The Contractor hereby guarantees that the entire work constructed by him under the Agreement will meet fully all requirements thereof as to quality of workmanship and materials. The Contractor shall make all repairs and replacements promptly upon receipt of written orders for same from the Owner. If the Contractor fails to make the repairs and replacements promptly, the Owner may do the work and the Contractor shall be liable to the Owner for the cost thereof.
- J. Warranty: The Contractor guarantees to Owner that all materials incorporated into the work will be new unless otherwise specified or agreed. Prior to final payment, the Contractor shall deliver to the Owner all manufacturers' warranties, together with

such endorsements or assignments as are necessary to ensure to the Owner the full rights and benefits of such warranties.

5. <u>Affirmative Action/Equal Employment Opportunity</u>

The Contractor is directed to comply with all applicable Federal and State Laws, Ordinances, Bylaws, and rules and regulations regarding affirmative action/equal employment opportunity requirements. Failure of the Contractor to comply with any such law, rule or regulation shall constitute grounds for the Owner to terminate the Agreement.

Pursuant to his/her obligations under the preceding section, the Contractor shall strive to achieve on this project the labor participation goals contained herein. Said participation goals shall apply in each job category on this project including but not limited to bricklayers, carpenters, cement masons, electricians, ironworkers, operating engineers and those classes of work enumerated in Section 44F of Chapter 149 of the Massachusetts General Laws. The participation goals for this project shall be 15.3% for minorities and 6.9% for women. The participation goals, as set forth herein, shall not be construed as quotas or set-asides; rather, such participation goals will be used to measure the progress of the Commonwealth's equal opportunity, non-discrimination and affirmative action program. Additionally, the participation goals contained herein should not be seen or treated as a floor or as a ceiling for the employment of particular individuals or group of individuals.

6. Site Information Not Guaranteed; Contractor's Investigation

All information given in the Contract Documents relating to subsurface and other conditions, natural phenomena, existing pipes, and other structures is from the best sources at present available to the Owner. All such information is furnished only for the information and convenience of the Contractor and is not guaranteed.

It is agreed and understood that the Owner does not warrant or guarantee that the subsurface or other conditions, natural phenomena, existing pipes, or other structures encountered during construction will be the same as those indicated in the Contract Documents.

Contractor has familiarized himself with the nature and extent of the Contract Documents, work, locality, and with all local conditions and federal, state, and local laws, rules, ordinances, and regulations that in any manner may affect costs, progress, or performance of the work. Contractor has made, or has caused to be made, examinations, investigations, and tests and studies of such reports and related data in addition to those referred to in the paragraph above as he deems necessary for the performance of the work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Time, and in accordance with the other Terms and Conditions of the Contract Documents; and no additional examinations, tests, investigations, reports, and similar data are or will be required by the Contractor for such purposes.

Contractor has correlated the results of all such observations, examinations, investigations, tests, reports, and data with the Contract Documents. Contractor has given the Owner written notice of all conflicts, errors, or discrepancies that he has discovered in

the Contract Documents, and the resolution thereof by the Owner is acceptable to the Contractor.

It is further agreed and understood that the Contractor shall not use or be entitled to use any of the information made available to him or obtained in any examination made by him in any manner as a basis of or ground for any claim or demand against the Owner, arising from or by reason of any variance which may exist between the information made available and the actual subsurface conditions or other conditions or structures actually encountered during the construction work, except as may otherwise be expressly provided for in the Contract Documents.

7. Project Architect or Engineer

8. Wage Rates

Prevailing Wage Rates as determined by the Commissioner of the Department of Labor and Workforce Development under the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 149, Section 26 to 27G, as amended, apply to this project and Federal Davis-Bacon wage rates.. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to provide the Town with certified payrolls and to comply with all requirements of the above-cited statutes. The schedules of MA prevailing wage rates and Davis-Bacon wage rates are included in the Contract Documents. The higher rate prevails.

9. Payments to the Contractor

Within thirty (30) days after receipt from the Contractor of a proper and satisfactory periodic estimate requesting payment of the amount due for the preceding month, the Owner shall have thirty (30) days to make payment for:

- A. The work performed during the preceding month.
- B. The materials not incorporated in the Work but delivered and suitably stored at the site (or at some location agreed upon in writing) to which the Contractor has title, or to which a Subcontractor has title and has authorized the Contractor to transfer title to the Owner.
- C. Less the following retention items:

- 1. A retention based on an estimate of the fair value of the Owner's claims against the Contractor.
- A retention for direct payments to Subcontractors, if any, based on demands for same in accordance with the provisions of Section 39F of Chapter 30 of the General Laws.
- 3. A retention not exceeding five percent (5%) of the approved amount of the periodic payment.
- D. After the receipt of a periodic estimate requesting final payment and within sixty-five (65) days after the Contractor fully completes the Work, or substantially completes the Work so that the value of the Work remaining to be done is, on the estimate of the Owner, less than 1% of the original Contract Price, or substantially completes the Work and the Owner takes possession or occupancy, whichever occurs first, the Owner shall pay the Contractor the entire balance due on the Contract less:
 - A retention based on an estimate of the fair value of the Owner's claims against the Contractor and of the cost of completing the incomplete and unsatisfactory items of work.
 - 2. A retention for direct payments to Subcontractors, if any, based on demands of same in accordance with the provisions of Section 39F of Chapter 30 of the General Laws, or based on the record of payments by the Contractor to the Subcontractors under this Contract if such record of payment indicates that the Contractor has not paid Subcontractors as provided in Section 39F of Chapter 30 of the General Laws.

The Owner may make changes in any periodic estimate submitted by the Contractor and the payment due on said periodic estimate shall be computed in accordance with the changes so made, and such changes and any requirements for a corrected periodic estimate shall not affect the due date for the periodic payment or the date for the commencement of interest charges on the amount of the periodic payment computed in accordance with the changes made, as provided herein; provided further, that the Owner may, within fourteen (14) days after receipt, return to the Contractor for correction, any periodic estimate which is not in acceptable form or which contains computations not arithmetically correct, and in that event, the date of receipt of such periodic estimate shall be the date of receipt of the corrected periodic estimate in proper form and with arithmetically correct computations. The date of receipt of a periodic estimate received on a Saturday shall be the first working day thereafter.

- E. Changes in the Work: No changes in the work covered by the approved Contract Documents shall be made without prior written approval of the Owner. Charges or credits for the work covered by the approved change shall be determined by one or more, or a combination of the following methods:
 - (a) Unit bid prices previously approved.
 - (b) An agreed lump sum.

- (c) The actual cost of:
- (1) Labor.
- (2) Materials entering permanently into the work.
- (3) The ownership or rental cost of construction equipment during the time of use on the extra work.
- (4) Power and consumable supplies for the operation of power equipment.
- (5) Wages to be paid.

To the cost under (c) there shall be added a fixed fee to be agreed upon but not to exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the actual cost of work. The fee shall be compensation to cover the cost of supervision, overhead, bond, profit and any other general expenses.

F. Claims for Additional Costs: If the Contractor wishes to make a claim for an increase in the Contract Sum, he shall give the Owner written notice thereof within twenty days after the occurrence of the event giving rise to such claim. This notice shall be given by the Contractor before proceeding to execute the Work, except in an emergency endangering life or property. No such claim shall be valid unless so made. Any change in the Contract Sum resulting from such claim shall be authorized by Change Order.

The Contractor hereby agrees that the Contractor shall have no claim for damages of any kind against the Owner on account of any delay in the commencement or performance of the work and/or any hindrance, delay or suspension of any portion of the work including, but not limited to, any claims or damages on account of having to perform out of sequence work, claims for damages on account of loss of production or other interference with the work whether such delay is caused by the Owner or otherwise, except as and to the extent expressly provided under G.L. c.30, §390 in the case of written orders by the Owner. The Contractor acknowledges that the Contractor's sole remedy for any such claim will be an extension of time as provided herein.

10. Final Payment, Effect

The acceptance of final payment by the Contractor shall constitute a waiver of all claims by the Contractor arising under the Agreement.

12. Terms Required By Law

12.1 This contract will be construed and governed by the provisions of applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations; and wherever any provision of the contract or contract documents shall conflict with any provision or requirement of federal, state or local law or regulation, then the provisions of law and regulation shall control. Where applicable to the contract, the provisions of General Laws are incorporated by reference into this contract, including but not limited to the following:

General Laws Chapter 30B - Procurement of Goods and Services

General Laws Chapter 30, section 39 et. seq. - Public Works Contracts

- 12.2 Wherever applicable law mandates the inclusion of any term and/or provision into a municipal contract, this section shall be understood to import such term or provision into this contract. To whatever extent any provision of this contract shall be inconsistent with any law or regulation limiting the power or liability of cities and towns, such law or regulation shall control.
- 12.3 The Contractor shall give all notices and comply with all laws and regulations bearing on the performance of the contract. If the Contractor performs the contract in violation of any applicable law or regulation, the Contractor shall bear all costs arising therefrom.
- 12.4 The Contractor shall keep itself fully informed of all existing and future State and Federal Laws and Municipal By-laws and regulations and of all orders and decrees of any bodies or tribunals having jurisdiction in any manner affecting those engaged or employed in the work, of the materials used in the work or in any way affecting the conduct of the work, if any discrepancy or inconsistency is discovered in the Drawings, Specifications or Contract for this work in violation of any such law, by-law, regulation, order or decree, it shall forthwith report the same in writing to the Owner. It shall, at all times, itself observe and comply with and shall cause all its agents, employees and subcontractors to observe and comply with all such existing and future laws, by-laws, regulations, orders and decrees; and shall protect and indemnify the Owner and its duly appointed agents against any claim or liability arising from or based on any violation whether by Contractor, its agents, employees or Subcontractors or any such law, by-law, regulation or decree.

13. <u>Indemnification</u>

- a. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and save harmless the Owner, and its respective duly elected or appointed officials, agents and employees (referred to collectively as "Owners") from and against all demands, claims, damages, liabilities, losses, costs, and expenses (including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney fees) (referred to collectively as "demands") arising out of or resulting from any work performed pursuant to this Agreement including but not limited to any negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Contractor, any subcontractor of the Contractor, or any person directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or by a defect of a product or design supplied by the Contractor or subcontractor. Such obligation shall not negate, abridge, or reduce in any way any additional indemnification rights of the Owner, that otherwise may exist under statute or in law or equity.
- b. Contractor assumes full responsibility for relations with any subcontractors employed directly or indirectly by the Contractor and the Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and save harmless the Owner from all demands made against the Owner by such subcontractor, such subcontractor's agent or employee, or any person, as the result of such subcontractor's work performed pursuant to this Agreement including but not limited to negligent acts, errors, or omissions that arise out of, result from, or are connected with the performance of this Agreement or any subsequent Agreement and is not otherwise subject to indemnifications under subparagraph "a" above.
- c. The Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Owner from any and all demands relating to wages, overtime compensation, or other employee benefits by employees employed directly or indirectly by the Contractor for work performed in connection with the work hereunder or required by state or federal law, including but not limited to Fair Labor Standards Act and Massachusetts Prevailing Wage Law.
- d. The indemnification obligations of the Contractor and subcontractor shall not be limited in any way by any limitations on the amount or type of damages, compensations, or benefits payable by or for the Contractor or subcontractor under any federal or state law.
- e. In the event of a breach of this Agreement by the Contractor, the Contractor shall pay the Owner all reasonable attorney fees, costs and other litigation expenses incurred by the Owner in enforcing its rights as a result of said breach in addition to any damages for said breach.

14. Insurance

The Contractor shall purchase and maintain such insurance as will protect both the Owner and the Contractor from claims which may arise under the Agreement, including operations performed for the named insured by independent contractors and general inspection thereof by the named insured. In addition, the Contractor shall require its subcontractors to maintain such insurance. Coverage shall be provided for:

- .1 claims under workers' or workmen's compensation, disability benefit and other applicable employee benefit acts;
- claims for damages because of bodily injury, occupational sickness or disease, or death of Contractor's employees;

- .3 claims for damages because of bodily injury, sickness or disease, or death of any person other than Contractor's employees;
- .4 claims for damages insured by usual personal injury liability coverage which are sustained (1) by any person as a result of an offense directly or indirectly related to the employment of such person by the Contractor, or (2) by any other person;
- .5 claims for damages, including damages to the Work itself, because of injury to or destruction of tangible property, including loss of use resulting therefrom; and
- .6 claims for damages because of bodily injury or death of any person or property damage arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of any motor vehicle.
- .7 claims involving contractual liability applicable to the Contractor's obligations under Article 13.

The Contractor shall, at all times during the Contract, maintain in full force and effect: Employer's Liability, Workers' Compensation, Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance, including contractual liability coverage for the provisions of Section 13.00 (INDEMNITY). All insurance shall be by insurers and for policy limits acceptable to Owner and, before commencement of work hereunder, the Contractor agrees to furnish Owner with certificates of insurance or other evidence satisfactory to Owner to the effect that such insurance has been procured and is in force. The certificates shall contain the following express obligation:

For the purpose of the Contract, the Contractor shall carry the following types of insurance in at least the limits specified below:

The Town of Blandford shall be named as additional insured under the liability and automobile insurance. The general liability insurance policy should contain a broad form general liability endorsement.

Except for Workmen's Compensation, all liability coverage shall name the Owner as an additional insured and shall provide for 30 days prior written notice to the Owner of any modification or termination of coverage provided thereby. The Contractor shall provide the Owner with appropriate certificate(s) of insurance evidencing compliance with this provision prior to the commencement of any work under this Agreement.

15. Notice

All notices required to be given hereunder shall be in writing and delivered to, or mailed first class to, the parties' respective addresses stated above. In the event that immediate notice is required, it may be given by telephone or facsimile, but shall, to the extent possible, be followed by notice in writing in the manner set forth above.

16. Termination

- A. Each party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement in the event of a failure of the other party to comply with the terms of the Agreement. Such termination shall be effective upon seven days' notice to the party in default and the failure within that time of said party to cure its default.
- B. The Owner shall have the right to terminate the Agreement without cause, upon ten (10) days' written notice to the Contractor. In the event that the Agreement is terminated pursuant to this subparagraph, the Contractor shall be reimbursed in accordance with the Contract Documents for all satisfactory Work performed up to the termination date, and for all materials or equipment not incorporated in the Work, but delivered and suitably stored at the site. Payment for material or equipment stored at the site shall be conditioned upon submission by the Contractor of bills of sale or such other evidence as is satisfactory to Owner to establish the Owner's title to such material or equipment or otherwise protect the Owner's interests.

17. <u>Miscellaneous</u>

A. Royalties and Patents: The Contractor shall pay all royalties and license fees. He shall defend all suits or claims for infringement of any patent rights and shall save the Owner harmless from loss on account thereof, except that the Owner shall be responsible for all such loss when a particular design, process or the product of a particular manufacturer or manufacturers is specified; but if the Contractor believes or has reason to believe that the design, process or product specified is an infringement of a patent, he shall be responsible for such loss unless he promptly gives such information to the Owner, and thereafter the Owner insists on the use of the design, process or products specified.

B. ACCESS TO RECORDS

Contractor will make all books, accounts, data, records, reports, files and other papers, things or property, that relate to its activities under this Contract, available

at all reasonable times for inspection, review and audit by the Owner, it authorized representative, the Inspector General of the Commonwealth, or the Auditor of the Commonwealth. The Commonwealth reserve the right of the Governor or his designee, the Secretary of Administration and Finance and the State Auditor or his designee, at reasonable times and upon reasonable notice to examine the books, records, and other completive data of the Contractor which pertain to the performance of the provisions and requirements of this Contract as provided by Executive Order 195. .

C. RIGHTS AND REMEDIES

Owner's rights and remedies provided in this Contract are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law.

D. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Each party shall adhere to the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 268A, with respect to the Conduct of Public Employees. In addition, no member, officer, or employee of either party, or its designee, or agents, no member of the governing body of the locality in which the program is situated, and no other public official of such locality or localities who exercises any functions or responsibilities with respect to the program during his tenure or for one (1) year thereafter (or such longer period as may be provided in Chapter 268A of the Massachusetts General Laws), shall have any interest in any contract or subcontract, or the proceeds thereof, for work to be performed in connection with the program assisted under this Contract. Each party shall incorporate, or cause to be incorporated, in all such contracts or subcontracts a provision prohibiting such interest, pursuant to the purposes of this subsection.

E. JURISDICTION

This Contract shall be interpreted by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and any suit brought pursuant to this Contract shall be commenced only within the County of BERKSHIRE, Massachusetts.

F. MODIFICATION, WAIVER OR CHANGE

No modifications, waiver or change shall be made in the terms and conditions of this Contract except as may be mutually agreed upon in writing by all parties hereto.

G. ASSIGNMENT

Owner and Contractor recognize that each has a substantial interest in having the other perform or control the acts required of it by this Contract. Neither party shall perform its—duties through a delegate nor assign its interest under this Contract without the written—consent of the other. Nothing herein shall be construed to prevent an assignor's due—performance of its entire obligation.

H. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

Owner and Contractor each binds itself, its partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives to the other party to this Contract and to the partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives of such other party with respect to all covenants of this Contract.

I. ENTIRE UNDERSTANDING

This Contract, together with the attachments hereto, represent the entire understanding of the parties, and neither party is relying upon any representation not contained herein.

J. SEVERABILITY/INTERPRETATION

In the event that any provision of this Contract shall be deemed invalid, unreasonable, or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall be stricken—from the Contract or modified so as to render it reasonable, and the remaining provisions of this Contract or the modified provision as provided above, shall continue in full force and effect and be binding upon the parties so long as such remaining or modified provisions reflect the intent of the parties as of the date of this Contract. Further, should—this Contract omit any statutory or regulatory requirements which would otherwise render this Contract illegal, then this Contract shall be deemed amended to the minimum extent necessary to comply with said statutes or regulations.

For purposes of interpreting this Agreement in the context of a dispute over its terms or otherwise neither party shall be considered the drafter of this Agreement and neither party shall have any provision of this Agreement construed in its favor as a result of its role in drafting this Agreement or its bargaining power with respect to this Agreement, Consultant's Services, the Project, or otherwise.

K. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

The parties agree that all documents created for the project by the Contractor shall belong to the Owner.

- L. By its signature hereon, the Contractor certifies, under the pains and penalties of perjury, that it has complied with all laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts relating to taxes, reporting of employees and contractors, and withholding and remitting child support.
- M. The compensation provided by this Contract is subject to the continued availability of funds for the services provided for herein.
- N. The Contractor by its signature certifies that it has a drug free workplace and policy.
- O. Force Majeure: The parties shall not be liable for the failure to wholly perform their duties if such failure is caused by catastrophe, riot, war, governmental order or regulation, strike, fire, accident, act of God or other similar or different contingency beyond the reasonable control of the Contractor or the Owner.

NOW, THEREFORE, if the Principal shall well, truly and faithfully perform its duties, all the undertakings, covenants, terms, conditions, and agreements of the Construction Contract during the original term thereof, and any extensions thereof which may be granted by the Owner, with or without notice to the Surety, and if he shall satisfy all claims and demands incurred under the Construction Contract, and shall fully indemnify and save harmless the Owner from all costs and damages which it may suffer by reason of failure to do so, and shall reimburse and repay the Owner all outlay and expense which the Owner may incur in making good any default, then this obligation shall be void; otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

PROVIDED, FURTHER, that the Surety's obligation under this Bond shall arise after (1) the Owner has declared the Principal in default of the Construction Contract or any provision thereof or (2) has declared that the Principal has failed, or is otherwise unable or unwilling, to execute the work consistent with, and in conformance to, the Construction Contract (collectively referred to as a "Contractor Default"). The determination of a Contractor Default shall be made solely by the Owner. The Owner need not terminate the Construction Contract to declare a Contractor Default or to invoke its rights under this Bond.

When the Surety's obligation under this Bond arises, the Surety, at its sole expense and at the consent and election of the Owner, shall promptly take one of the following steps: (1) arrange for the Principal to perform and complete the work of the Construction Contract: (2) arrange for a contractor other than the Principal to perform and complete the work of the Construction Contract; (3) reimburse the Owner, in a manner and at such time as the Owner shall decide, for all costs and expenses incurred by the Owner in performing and completing the work of the Construction Contract. Surety will keep Owner reasonably informed of the progress, status and results of any investigation of any claim of the Owner.

If the Surety does not proceed as provided in this Bond with due diligence and all deliberate speed, the Surety shall be deemed to be in default of this Bond, and the Owner shall be entitled to enforce any remedy available to the Owner.

- (c) Black means: All persons having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa, including, but not limited to, African-Americans, and all persons having origins in any of the original peoples of the Cape Verdean Islands.
- (d) Eskimo or Aleut means: All persons having origins in any of the peoples of Northern Canada, Greenland, Alaska, and Eastern Siberia.
- (e) Hispanic means: All persons having their origins in any of the Spanish-speaking peoples of Mexico, Puerto Rico, Cuba, Central or South America, or the Caribbean Islands.

"State construction contract" means a contract for the construction, reconstruction, installation, demolition, maintenance or repair of a building or capital facility, or a contract for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, remodeling or repair of a public work undertaken by a department, agency, board, or commission of the commonwealth.

"State assisted construction contract" means a contract for the construction, reconstruction, installation, demolition, maintenance or repair of a building or capital facility undertaken by a political subdivision of the commonwealth, or two or more political subdivisions thereof, an authority, or other instrumentality and whose costs of the contract are paid for, reimbursed, grant funded, or otherwise supported, in whole or in part, by the commonwealth.

II. Equal Opportunity, Non-Discrimination and Affirmative Action

During the performance of this Contract, the Contractor and all subcontractors (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Contractor") for a state construction contract or a state assisted construction contract, for him/herself, his/her assignees and successors in interest, agree to comply

with all applicable equal employment opportunity, non-discrimination and affirmative action requirements, including but not limited to the following:

In connection with the performance of work under this contract, the Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religious creed, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, genetic information, military service, age, ancestry or disability, shall not discriminate in the selection or retention of subcontractors, and shall not discriminate in the procurement of materials and rentals of equipment.

The aforesaid provision shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment advertising, layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; conditions or privileges of employment; and selection for apprenticeship or on-the-job training opportunity. The Contractor shall comply with the provisions of chapter 151B of the Massachusetts General Laws, as amended, and all other applicable anti-discrimination and equal opportunity laws, all of which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this Contract.

The Contractor shall post hereafter in conspicuous places, available for employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination setting forth the provisions of the Fair Employment Practices Law of the Commonwealth (Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 151B).

In connection with the performance of work under this contract, the Contractor shall undertake, in good faith, affirmative action measures to eliminate any discriminatory barriers in the terms and conditions of employment on the grounds of race, color, religious creed, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, genetic information, military service, age, ancestry or disability. Such affirmative action measures shall entail positive and aggressive measures to ensure non-discrimination and to promote equal opportunity in the areas of hiring, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment, layoff or termination, rate of compensation, apprenticeship and on-the-job training programs. A list of positive and aggressive measures shall include, but not be limited to, advertising employment opportunities in minority and other community news media; notifying minority, women and other community-based organizations of employment opportunities; validating all job specifications, selection requirements, and tests; maintaining a file of names and addresses of each worker referred to the Contractor and what action was taken concerning such worker; and notifying the administering agency in writing when a union with whom the Contractor has a collective bargaining agreement has failed to refer a minority or woman worker. These and other affirmative action measures shall include all actions required to guarantee equal employment opportunity for all persons, regardless of race, color, religious creed, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, genetic information, military service, age, ancestry or disability. One purpose of this provision is to ensure to the fullest extent possible an adequate supply of skilled tradesmen for this and future Commonwealth public construction projects.

III. Minority and Women Workforce Participation

Pursuant to his/her obligations under the preceding section, the Contractor shall strive to achieve on this project the labor participation goals contained herein. Said participation goals shall apply in each job category on this project including but not limited to bricklayers, carpenters, cement masons, electricians, ironworkers, operating engineers and those classes of work enumerated in Section 44F of Chapter 149 of the Massachusetts General Laws. The participation goals for this project shall be 15.3% for minorities and 6.9% for women. The participation goals, as set forth herein, shall not be construed as quotas or set-asides; rather, such participation goals will be used to measure the progress of the Commonwealth's equal opportunity, non-discrimination and affirmative action program. Additionally, the participation goals contained herein should not be seen or treated as a floor or as a ceiling for the employment of particular individuals or group of individuals.

IV. Liaison Committee

At the discretion of the agency that administers the contract for the construction project there may be established for the life of the contract a body to be known as the Liaison Committee. The Liaison Committee shall be composed of one representative each from the agency or agencies administering the contract for the construction project, hereinafter called the administering agency, a representative from the Office of Affirmative action, and such other representatives as may be designated by the administering agency.

The Contractor (or his/her agent, if any, designated by him/her as the on-site equal employment opportunity officer) shall recognize the Liaison Committee as an affirmative action body, and shall establish a continuing working relationship with the Liaison Committee, consulting with the Liaison Committee on all matters related to minority recruitment, referral, employment and training.

V. Reports and Records

The Contractor shall prepare projected workforce tables on a quarterly basis when required by the administering agency. These shall be broken down into projections, by week, of workers required in each trade. Copies shall be furnished one week in advance of the commencement of the period covered, and also, when updated, to the administering agency and the Liaison Committee when required.

The Contractor shall prepare weekly reports in a form approved by the administering agency, unless information required is required to be reported electronically by the administering agency, the number of hours worked in each trade by each employee, identified as woman, minority, or non-minority. Copies of these shall be provided at the end of each such week to the administering agency and the Liaison Committee.

Records of employment referral orders, prepared by the Contractor, shall be made available to the administering agency on request.

The Contractor will provide all information and reports required by the administering agency on instructions issued by the administering agency and will permit access to its facilities and any books, records, accounts and other sources of information which may be determined by the administering agency to effect the employment of personnel. This provision shall apply only to information pertinent to the Commonwealth's supplementary non-discrimination, equal opportunity and access and opportunity contract requirements. Where information required is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, the Contractor shall so certify to the administering agency and shall set forth what efforts he has made to obtain the information.

VI. Access to Work Site

A designee of the administering agency and a designee of the Liaison Committee shall each have a right to access the work site.

VII. Solicitations for Subcontracts, and for the Procurement of Materials and Equipment

In all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the Contractor either for work to be performed under a subcontract or for the procurement of materials or equipment, each potential subcontractor or supplier shall be notified in writing by the Contractor of the Contractor's obligations under this contract relative to non-discrimination and equal opportunity.

VIII. Sanctions

Whenever the administering agency believes the General or Prime Contractor or any subcontractor may not be operating in compliance with the provisions of the Fair Employment Practices Law of the Commonwealth (Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 151B), the administering agency may refer the matter to the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination ("Commission") for investigation.

Following the referral of a matter by the administering agency to the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination, and while the matter is pending before the MCAD, the administering agency may withhold payments from contractors and subcontractors when it has documentation that the contractor or subcontractor has violated the Fair Employment Practices Law with respect to its activities on the Project, or if the administering agency determines that the contractor has materially failed to comply with its obligations and the requirements of this Section. The amount withheld shall not exceed a withhold of payment to the General or Prime Contractor of 1/100 or 1% of the contract award price or \$5,000, whichever sum is greater, or, if a subcontractor is in non-compliance, a withhold by the administering agency from the General Contractor, to be assessed by the General Contractor as a charge against the subcontractor, of 1/100 or 1% of the subcontractor price, or \$1,000 whichever sum is greater, for each violation of the applicable law or contract requirements. The total withheld from any one General or Prime Contractor or subcontractor on a Project shall not exceed \$20,000 overall. No withhold of payments or investigation by the Commission or its agent shall be initiated without the administering agency providing prior notice to the Contractor.

If, after investigation, the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination finds that a General or Prime Contractor or subcontractor, in commission of a state construction contract or

For multiyear CM AT RISK projects, the awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. The annual update requirement is not applicable to 27F "rental of equipment" contracts. The updated wage schedule must be provided to all contractors, including general and sub-contractors, working on the construction project.
- This wage schedule applies only to the specific project referenced at the top of this page and uniquely identified by the "Wage Request Number" on all pages of this schedule.
- An Awarding Authority must request an updated wage schedule if it has not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the date of issuance of the wage schedule. For CM AT RISK projects (bid pursuant to G.L. c.149A), the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the bid for the first construction scope of work must be within 90-days of the wage schedule issuance date.
- The wage schedule shall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project as required by M.G.L. c. 149, § 27. The wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract awarded for the project. The wage schedule must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site for the life of the project in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 § 27. The wages listed on the wage schedule must be paid to employees performing construction work on the project whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or a sub-
- Apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Massachusetts Division of Apprentice Standards (DAS). Apprentices must keep their apprentice identification card on their persons during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wage schedule. Any apprentice not registered with DAS regardless of whether they are registered with another federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the iournevworker's rate.
- · Every contractor or subcontractor working on the construction project must submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years. Each weekly payroll report must contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports to DLS. For a sample payroll reporting form go to http://www.mass.gov/dols/pw.
- · Contractors with questions about the wage rates or classifications included on the wage schedule have an affirmative obligation to inquire with DLS at (617) 626-6953.
- · Contractors must obtain the wage schedules from awarding authorities. Failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay the prevailing wage rates listed on the wage schedule to all employees who perform construction work on the project is a violation of the law and subjects the contractor or subcontractor to civil and criminal penalties.
- · Employees not receiving the prevailing wage rate set forth on the wage schedule may file a complaint with the Fair Labor Division of the office of the Attorney General at (617) 727-3465.
