

**MINUTES WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING
TOWN OF SABATTUS
May 23, 2024**

AND ACTION TAKEN ON WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

Town Clerk Brenda Letourneau opened the meeting at 6:00p.m. and read the following:

To Police Chief Erik Baker, a Constable of the Town of Sabattus, County of Androscoggin, State of Maine,

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the voters of the Town of Sabattus, in said county, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to meet in the gymnasium of the Oak Hill Middle School at 40 Ball Park Road in said town, on Wednesday, May 23, 2024 at 6:00 o'clock in the evening, then and there to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a moderator by written ballot to preside at said meeting.

Action taken on Article 1: Mark Duquette nominated Johnathon Peloff as moderator of the town meeting. Richard Lacombe seconded the nomination. Johnathon Peloff did not come forward, therefore Mark Duquette nominated Jeffrey Baril as moderator of the town meeting. Richard Lacombe seconded the nomination. Ballots were cast. Jeffrey Baril is elected and sworn in by Brenda Letourneau, Town Clerk.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town, in accordance with 36 M.R.S.A. Section 505(1), will vote that the tax lists specified in 36 M.R.S.A. Section 709 be committed for collection on or before September 4, 2024.


