PUBLIC WORK SPOTLIGHT: The leaves are falling! Did you know leaves that collect on our streets every fall can harm our waters? More than 50% of the annual amount of phosphorus in urban stormwater can come from leaves in the street! When it rains, stormwater flows through leaf piles in streets creating a "leaf tea" that is rich in dissolved phosphorus. This "leaf tea" travels through storm sewers making its way to our lakes, rivers and streams. This causes low oxygen, algae blooms, and murky water. Streets crew will be removing leaf piles throughout the fall.
