Administrator Update: It's crazy to think how fast 2024 is flying. Summer is here and now is a great time to sign up for pool passes. We have had some technical difficulties with getting the pool ready, but we intend to have the pool in operation for the start of swimming lessons. If something were to change, we would make an announcement. Over the next month and a half, the city will begin the initial assessment of the 2024 budget and start preparing for the 2025 budget process. Lastly, we are in the process of switching and updating our website. Over the next week, we will have moments where the website may not be accessible. Road Construction Update: Road repairs will begin the week of June 10th on Washington Ave. (the full road starting at the corner of Mechanic St.), Prairie Ave. (Mill St. to Mechanic St.) and Pine Ave. (Mill St. to Mechanic St.). Construction is expected to last two weeks depending on weather conditions. Please avoid these areas during the process if possible. If you reside in any of those locations, you will have access to your property, but please note that there may be brief moments for no access.
