Administrator Update: April was a very busy month between finalizing plans for our train restoration project, development discussions for housing and childcare, and pursuit for federal funding for various projects. We have been reviewing our water rates with our auditors and financial advisors and began conducting a water rate case to determine the next steps relating to those fees, more information will be provided within the next month. Police Spotlight: The Hillsboro Police Department has had an eventful and exciting start to 2024. For the month of April, we handled 135 calls for service. These calls for service include but are not limited to traffic stops, mental health calls, park checks, business checks, fraud, and disorderly conduct. On May 9th, the Hillsboro Police Department was gifted \$100 by the Hillsboro Women's Civic Club for the purchase of bike lights to hand out to community members, free of charge. City residents are encouraged to stop by HPD or City Hall to register their bikes and receive a free decal and a pair of bike lights.
