Dates to Remember

September 24th – First day to request and complete an absentee ballot IN PERSON in the Clerk's Office for the November 6th General Election.

October 24th – Clerk's Office will be open from 5-7pm for those wishing to register to vote or vote absentee for the November 6th General Election.

November 2nd – Last day to register to vote or vote absentee for the November 6th General Election. NO VOTER REGISTRATION OR ABSENTEE VOTING CAN TAKE PLACE THE MONDAY PRIOR TO ELECTION DAY.

November 4th - Daylight Saving Time ends at 2 a.m. on Sunday, November 4th, 2018. Remember to turn your clock back (fall back) one hour. It's also a good time to change the batteries in your smoke detectors!

November 6th – General Election. See details on the right of this page.

Date to be determined (mid-November) – A public hearing immediately followed by a Meeting of the Electorate will convene mid-November to consider the proposed 2019 Town of Stockton budget. The public hearing and the Meeting of Electorate will take place at the Town Hall, 7252 6th Street, Custer. Once the date has been determined, the meeting will be published in the Stevens Point Journal, on our Town website as well as on the Town posting boards.

November 22nd – The Town of Stockton Clerk's Office will be closed in observance of Thanksgiving.

Tuesday, November 6th, 2018 is the Fall General Election which includes a number of Congressional, Legislative, State and County offices as well as the state Governor's Election.

Polls will be open from 7:00 am – 8:00 pm. We're doing a lot of preparation in advance to make the voting experience as smooth and efficient as possible.

Photo ID is required. The easiest from of photo ID is a Wisconsin Driver's License or Wisconsin State Issued ID card. There are a number of acceptable photo IDs if you don't have a Wisconsin Driver's License. Contact the Clerk for more information.

If you are a first time voter, new to the area, have an address change or a name change; you will need to fill out the Wisconsin Voter Registration Application. You will need a photo ID as well as proof of residence. Contact the Clerk for further details.

If you prefer to vote Absentee, you may do so. You don't need a reason, it's your right. To vote absentee, contact the Clerk to obtain an Absentee Ballot Application. The first day to complete an Absentee Ballot IN PERSON in the Clerk's Office is Monday, September 24th, 2018. Clerk Novotny will be available regular office hours in addition to Wednesday, October 24th from 5-7pm for those interested in voting absentee or registering to vote. Deadline to vote Absentee in the Clerk's Office is Friday, November 2nd. The Clerk's Office will be open on November 2nd from 8:00 am – 5:00 pm to accommodate Absentee requests. All mailed absentee ballots must be received via USPS by 8pm Election Day in order to be counted. NO VOTER REGISTRATION OR ABSENTEE VOTING CAN TAKE PLACE THE MONDAY PRIOR TO **ELECTION DAY.**

Town of Stockton Receives Disaster Relief Funds

The evening of June 12, 2017 was one that many won't forget. The Town of Stockton as well as multiple Portage County municipalities experienced a disaster; more specifically, heavy rains, flooding, high winds and extensive trees down. The Town of Stockton employees and a few volunteers worked diligently to complete debris removal which consisted of removal of trees covering roadways, trees and debris in the road right-of-way and subsequent debris removal after the storm had ended. The clean up process took a few months. During this time, we worked very closely with the Portage County Emergency Management Office as well as the State of Wisconsin Disaster Fund Coordinator to compile and submit extensive documentation and photos of the damage within our Town. We were able to provide very extensive, detailed documentation which helped the Town of Stockton in obtaining disaster relief funding from the State Emergency Management Division. Although the Town is only eligible for a portion of the damages documented and submitted, we were very fortunate to receive a check in the amount of \$18,845.65.
