- 1. 25 June 10:18am. Call from Brandie Smaldon 2099 Newport Rd. regarding 3 dogs on her next door neighbor's property that frequently walk onto her property unattended. One of the dogs barked a lot at her whenever she was near, and she was worried about the safety of her kids.**

She doesn't know the name of her neighbor, and couldn't give me any other information I could use to contact him. I left a message for him to call me, but have not heard from him yet.

I have visited the property 4 times in effort to talk to the owner but have been unsuccessful thus far. On one visit, I caught the dogs on her property by her pond and approached them. They were noisy, but were friendly enough that I was able to pet them.

Dog 1 appears to be a young Black Labrador about 1 year old. Dog 2 appears to be a Rottweiler Collie mix. Dog 3 is an unknown medium sized dog with short cream colored fur & white muzzle. They are registered and vaccinated in Syracuse. I Will continue to follow up.

- 2. 28 June 3:15. Received a call from Amanda Bienkowski regarding a small Beagle owned by her neighbor that frequently is left outside without visible signs of food and/or water.**

Stopped by same day but could not locate owner or dog.

Stopped by again after a call from Amanda on 30 June. Amanda had the dog and said she wanders over frequently. I talked to the owner Sarah Downs, 7440 Newport rd. Explained the requirement for Town registration and vaccination.

1 July, Sarah sent me a picture of the Town registration tag and proof of vaccination.

- 3. 28 June, 8pm. Rebecca Bell called to report a loose dog with tags and a leash walking along Newport rd. She managed to catch the large white dog & believes it belongs to the Amish farm behind her property. She was going to try to**

return it. I was unable to respond to the call until the next day. She said the dog got loose from her and ran away. Nothing further to report.
