

Resolution 2026-93

Authorization to Expend Funds from the Town Parks and Trails Capital Reserve Fund

WHEREAS, the Town of Newport has contracted with Barton & Loguidice to provide engineering professional services for the Town of Newport Town Trail Development Project (the “Project); and

WHEREAS, the Project constitutes a capital improvement, as that term is defined under N.Y. General Municipal Law § 6-c (1) (b); and

WHEREAS, the Project is within the scope of the type of capital improvement to be financed under the Town of Newport Town Parks and Trails Reserve Fund established on April 13, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the cost of engineering professional services relating to the Project constitute costs that are properly incurred in the development of the Project itself, and therefore constitute part of the capital improvement for which funds from the Town of Newport Town Parks and Trails Reserve Fund may be expended and for which the Town of Newport Town Parks and Trails Reserve Fund was established; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board finds and determines that the funds of the Town of Newport Town Parks and Trails Reserve Fund may be used to finance the cost of such professional services as part of the capital improvement project, subject to all applicable requirements under law, including without limitation, such authorization of expenditure being subject to permissive referendum.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to the provisions of section 6-c of the New York State General Municipal Law, the total expenditure of \$48,500.00 for engineering professional services in furtherance of the Project is for a proper purpose for which the Town of Newport Town Parks and Trails Reserve Fund was established; and

BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER that upon audit and approval of vouchers/invoices for such services presented to the Town Board, the Town Board authorizes the total expenditure of \$48,500.00 from the Town of Newport Town Parks and Trails Reserve Fund to finance the professional services in connection with the Project; and

BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER that this resolution is subject to permissive referendum and shall only take effect as set forth in New York Town Law § 91; and

BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER that the Town Clerk is hereby directed to, within ten (10) days of the date hereof, post and publish a notice setting forth the date of the adoption of this resolution and containing an abstract of this resolution concisely stating the purpose and effect hereof and stating that the resolution was adopted subject to a permissive referendum.
