## RESOLUTION TO ADOPT VILLAGE MILLAGE BALLOT LANGUAGE

BE IT RESOLVED that the Village of Ontonagon approves the following millage ballot question language and directs the Clerk to submit it to be placed on the August 2, 2022 primary election ballot:

## PROPOSAL FOR VILLAGE MILLAGE TO FUND MERS PENSION OBLIGATION

Shall the limitation upon the total amount of general ad valorem taxes imposed on real and tangible property for all purposes in any one year under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution be increased in the Village of Ontonagon by 20.0000 mills (\$20.00 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value of all such property) for a period of 6 years, 2023 through 2028 inclusive, for the purpose of funding the MERS pension obligation stemming from the sale of the Ontonagon Memorial Hospital in 2007. Shall the Village of Ontonagon be authorized to levy such millage for said purpose?

The amount of revenue the Village of Ontonagon will collect if the millage is approved and levied by the Village of Ontonagon in the first year is estimated to be \$544,158.72. If approved, this would authorize a new millage to pay the above referenced MERS pension obligation.
