- WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 4 of Village of Ontonagon Ordinance 2023 No. 3, Village of Ontonagon, the non-refundable fee shall be in an amount of not more than \$5,000, and
- WHEREAS, the fee shall be paid with the initial application as well as with each subsequent annual renewal application, and
- WHEREAS, the annual application fee is for the purpose of helping defray administrative and enforcement costs associated with the operation of a Marihuana Related Business in the Village.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the non-refundable license application fee to operate a Marihuana Related Business in the Village of Ontonagon shall be \$5,000, and
