NOTICE

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

The Village of Ontonagon Winter Parking Restrictions are now in effect. Vehicles parked on Village streets between the hours of 2:30 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. are in violation and shall be subject to citation.

During winter parking restrictions no vehicles shall be parked within six feet of the plowed right-of-way or shoulder of the road between the hours of 2:30 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. Vehicles parked on the street or right-of-way that hindering snow removal will be towed away at the expense of the owner. This ordinance will be strictly enforced from October 15th to April 15th.

Sec. 46-4 Streets, Sidewalks and Other Public Places

It shall be unlawful for any person to leave any automobile or any other vehicle or apparatus standing or parked upon the right-of-way of any street or alley within the village between the hours of 2:30 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. on any day from October 15 through the following April 14, unless granted a permit to do so by the Village Clerk.

Sec. 46-6 Removal and Impoundment of Obstructions

Notwithstanding other penalties, any vehicle or other obstruction found in violation of this chapter may be removed by the Village of Ontonagon and no liability shall attach to the village by reason of such removal. No property so removed shall be returned to the owner until payment has been made to the village of the actual costs incurred by the village occasioned by such removal.

WINTER SNOW PLOWING & REMOVAL

It is unlawful to plow snow across or deposit snow on any road way or plow snow in a manner that obstructs the safety vision of a driver of a motor vehicle.

It is the owner's responsibility to clear snow and maintain access to their curbside mailbox. The Village will not be responsible for any damages to a mail box that is not clear of snow or clearly marked.

ADOPT A FIRE HYDRANT

It's important to remember that by keeping the fire hydrant by your home clear of snow and accessible, you're helping yourself. Seconds count when there is a fire. We have an All-Volunteer Fire Department. By keeping a fire hydrant clear of snow, you make the Volunteer's job easier and the house you save may be yours.

VILLAGE OF ONTONAGON ORDINANCE 2023 NO. 1

An Ordinance to Amend Chapter 46, Section 46-4 and Section 46-6 of the Code of Ordinances for the Village of Ontonagon.

The Village of Ontonagon ordains, that Chapter 46 (Streets, Sidewalks and Other Public Places) be amended as follows:

Sec. 46-4 Streets, Sidewalks and Other Public Places

It shall be unlawful for any person to leave any automobile or any other vehicle or apparatus standing or parked upon the right-of-way of any street or alley within the village between the hours of 2:30 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. on any day from October 15 through the following April 15, unless granted a permit to do so by the Village Clerk.

The restricted timeframe of parking restrictions along with the restrictive dates may be changed from time to time per Resolution of the Village Council of the Village of Ontonagon.

Sec. 46-6 Removal and Impoundment of Obstructions

Notwithstanding other penalties, any vehicle or other obstruction found in violation of this chapter may be removed by the Village of Ontonagon and no liability shall attach to the village by reason of such removal. No property so removed shall be returned to the owner until payment has been made to the village of the actual costs incurred by the village occasioned by such removal.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This Amendatory Ordinance shall become effective 20 days (January 9, 2024) from the date of adoption and will be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the community.

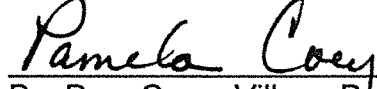
