Winter is here, and along with that comes snow. Most vehicles are parked off street, but if you must park on the street and it is allowed, we will work around you. After the storm has passed, moving the vehicle will allow us to clean up that area.

Colder temps are also on the way. One thing you, as a resident, can do to help prevent water freeze ups is to check water temps (run the cold tap for 5 minutes and check water temperature). If water is colder than 34 degrees, please give the office a call and we can look at your situation.

Frozen sewer lines are usually caused by a slow leak. Most times, it will be a leaky toilet or your propane furnace. To check the toilet: put food coloring in the tank (not the bowl). If the color runs into the bowl, the flapper is leaking and may need to be replaced. Propane furnaces may have a small amount of water that comes out as the furnace is running. This, too, will freeze the sewer line.


FIRE DEPARTMENT


