Do you have a project planned? With summer here – a reminder to check with city hall and get a building permit. Whether it be for a building, deck,



landscaping, fence, driveway, etc. Failure to do the proper paperwork before you begin can cause delays and even removal of what you have already completed. Please take the time to review the city's zoning ordinances to see if your project requires a permit or call city hall.

Postage: The cost of postage has increased and adds to the expenditure for mailing of utility bills. Beginning August 1, the cost of your utility bills will increase \$1.00 for sewer and \$1.00 for the base water rate. As an incentive, the city will be offering a \$1.00 per month reduction on your utility bill for all who sign up for "Email Statements" and ACH withdraw.

The City Office has been receiving complaints regarding motorists not abiding by the speed limit signs. This applies to all motor vehicles, including side by sides and 4-wheelers. Let's keep our community safe. (all ATV drivers need to be 16 years of age with a valid license, this includes golf carts.)

The department has done multiple trainings this past quarter included a live burn trailer, as well as a joint training, live burn with the Park Rapids Fire

The City does road projects every 5 years, in 2025 we will be doing a project. This summer we will be looking at roads to determine the ones that look like thy will need replacing. At the time of the projects, we also try to address any water run off issues and fix if possible. If there are any concerns of this nature, please stop by the City Office and let city staff know. Not all problems can be addressed but all will be considered. If buildings are placed below the road surface there are some cases that there is not a lot the City can do, a good rule is to always place the foundation of the structure a minimum of 6 inches above the crown of the road.
