Changes that have occurred over the last 3 months:

Ordinance #56, An Ordinance placing a Moratorium on the operation of Cannabis businesses within the Nevis City limits has been updated.

Ordinance #57, An Ordinance creating use of Cannabis in Public within the City of Nevis.

Ordinance #36: Planning and Zoning will hold a Public Hearing on October 28th for an update to the Ordinance adding “Cannabis Businesses” to its list of uses within the B-2 District of the City of Nevis. This Public Hearing will begin at 6:00pm.

Hydrant Flushing
October 22, 23, 24, 2024
. Hydrant flushing is necessary to clean and maintain the water distribution system. During the flushing period, water can become discolored. If this occurs, run your cold water tap for a few minutes until the water clear. If this does not correct the problem, wait approximately one (1) hour and flush the cold water again. Do not run your hot water until the cold-water tap has cleared. This discoloration is not hazardous for human consumption; however, clothing can become stained during laundering.

Even though it still feels like summer, October ushers in the fall season. A few things to think about through the months ahead:

The City dump is open for yard debris (depending on the condition of the road). Pick up a key to get in, leave a \$5 deposit (returned when the key is returned). Our maintenance department has done a fine job of designating where to place the different types of yard debris.

With the dry summer and fall, please be extra careful with campfires, etc. They can quickly get out of control. Brush fires are difficult for our firefighters and we want to keep them safe.

The October and November city council meetings will be held on the second *Tuesday* of those months because of two federal holidays (Indigenous Peoples Day and Veteran’s Day) that fall on those Mondays. Same time, same place, just a different day.
