Pet Licenses are valid January 1<sup>st</sup> – December 31<sup>st</sup>. All dogs and cats 4 months and older living with the city must be licensed, Bring a copy of distemper and rabies vaccination to the City Office. Licenses cost \$5.00 and pet owners receive a metal tag to be attached to their dog's or cat's collar. The numbering on the tag helps get lost pets back to their owners.

If you planning a project for the 2025 year; permits are required for the following:

- Building construction
- Alterations or demolition
- Signs
- Sewage systems
- Grading or filling in shoreland areas
- Excavation, obstruction, and ROW work

Ice Rink Update

Over the years I've had many people ask me "it's 20 below why is the ice rink not ready?"

Well here you go, we use the water that is in the water tower to flood the rink even though the air temp is 20 below the water temp in the mains remains 50 degrees so at the start of the season we need to let the ground freeze and get 3-4in of frost in it. The rink is not 100% flat so in the low areas there can be 3in of water, if we flood to much the warm water will take the frost out and the water just sinks away. This is a slow process to build ice and takes several weeks to cover the entire rink.

The other challenge that we have is the storm sewer that runs in Co Rd 2, the water dumps into the rink with all the salt that is placed on the road there is a significant amount that will end up in the rink. This will also add to later ice making and earlier ice melting.
