## It's That Time of Year When We all Enjoy the MN Outdoors

- Recreational Fires
- Cannot exceed 3 feet in diameter.
  - Flames cannot exceed 2 feet in height.
  - Must be enclosed by a ring.
  - Must be constantly attended.
  - Must have a minimum of 4-A rating fire- extinguisher, dirt, sand, or garden hose available.
  - Only burn untreated or unprepared - wood or charcoal
  - Do not burn lumber, leaves, grass, paper, garbage, plastics, or other refuse.
  - Must be immediately extinguished when directed by a police officer, firefighter, fire warden or DNR officer.
  - No fires allowed when wind speeds exceed 15 mph.

## Desk of the Administrator

### City Ordinance #50

- Blight/Deteriorated/Unsafe Structures:
- Areas of the city are or may become blighted with resulting impairment of taxable values upon which, in large part, city revenues depend;
- Such blighted areas are detrimental or inimical to the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens and to the economic welfare of the city;
- In order to improve and maintain the general character of the city, it is necessary to rehabilitate such blighted areas;
- The conditions found in blighted areas cannot be remedied by the ordinary operations of private enterprise with due regard to the general welfare of the public, without public participation;
- The purposes of this division are to rehabilitate such areas by eliminating blight and blight factors within all areas of the city for the protection of the health, safety, morals and general welfare of the city; to preserve existing values of other properties within or adjacent to such areas and all other areas of the city; and to preserve the taxable value of the property within such areas and all other areas of the city;
- The necessity and the public interest for provisions set forth in this division are hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination to be a public purpose and for the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the city



**Tall Grass** It is a violation of city Code to have grass taller than 7 inches in height. Please cut your grass before it gets taller to keep the community looking nice. Please keep grass clippings and yard waste out of the streets. Yard waste is a major source of pollution in surface waters. That is because it is filled with phosphorous – both artificial and naturally occurring, that feeds algae. Algal blooms can cause health problems for humans and wildlife and create some unsightly and foul-smelling water bodies. Thank you.
