KEY UPDATES

New NO SOLICITATION Ordinance #144: Our previous NO SOLICITATION ordinance (#102), required a City License to conduct solicitation in our city. After our city was overwhelmed with hail-damage solicitors last summer, we recognized that our all-volunteer city staff does not have the capacity to manage this licensing process. Therefore, we have updated our policy to define the rules for solicitation and empower each household to enforce this by posting a "No Solicitation" sign on their property (i.e. mailbox post). Please read the ordinance (search "144" from the city website) to understand your rights and the activities that are prohibited.

Speed Hump Design Confirmed: The topics of speed, pedestrian safety, and Complete Street design have endured significant discussion and deliberation throughout the road project's 4-year planning process. The City Council has unanimously approved the final design plan, which includes 9 speed humps, 3 raised crosswalks, 2 digital speed signs, and striping for 5-foot-wide walking lanes. We encourage everyone to experience our speed hump design by driving to Wayzata (nearby 215 Central Ave S). These soft-angled speed humps are much different from those on South Shore Drive (See map on Page 2). ...continued on page 2

Private-Well Testing: A big thank you to Michelle and Shaun Kennedy for coordinating the well testing for our residents. Many households participated in this effort to verify the quality of water in your private well as you contemplate connecting to city water. The city does not have access to your test results, but we've been informed that some wells have high levels of manganese. 

Election News You Can Use

The state primary election will be held on Tuesday, August 13, 2024. Our polling place for in-person voting on election day is Medicine Lake City Hall. You can check your voter registration status or register to vote online via Minnesota's Secretary of State website at www.sos.state.mn.us/elections-voting.

Vote Early by Mail/Absentee Voting. Medicine Lake's absentee voting, whether in-person or by mail, is coordinated by Hennepin County. You can find information about voting early in-person or by mail, including when and how to request a ballot, at www.hennepin.us/en/residents/elections/absentee-early-voting. That website includes answers to frequently asked questions, important deadlines, options to return your absentee ballot, voting early in person, and a link to track the status of your mail-in ballot to confirm that it was received and counted.

New this year, voters may now sign up to be on the **permanent absentee voting list**. Voters on this list can sign up once to be automatically sent an absentee ballot before every election. All eligible voters can choose to join the permanent absentee voter list by checking the box on the interactive voter registration application. The online and paper application can be found at mnvotes.gov/register.

There are other methods of voting early. Information about those other options can be found at www.sos.state.mn.us/elections-voting/other-ways-to-vote.

Are you interested in running for office in the November general election? The general election will be held on November 5, 2024. There will be two four-year term Medicine Lake city council seats, one two-year term city council seat, and one two-year term mayoral seat on the November ballot.
