From Our Mayor

Hello Neighbors!

As the cool morning air settles in, with fog drifting across the lake, and the trees starting to reveal their vibrant display, we bid farewell to a wonderful summer and welcome the fall season. With our road construction at its peak of activity, the changing of seasons is also an exciting transformation to our city, as we look forward to the completion of our new road—hopefully just in time for Halloween. This fall also brings the November elections, where we exercise our cherished freedom by voting for our city, state, and federal leaders. It's a time to reflect with gratitude on the many blessings we share.

Key Updates

We Have Fire Hydrants! I'm excited to announce that our first fire hydrants are now fully operational, and household hookups are about to begin! This marks a significant milestone, enhancing our city's fire protection and providing households with access to city water. The fire department will begin training with the new hydrants once the road installation is complete, and household water connections will follow in the coming weeks. If you've found a reliable plumber to do your city water connection, please share their information on the city's Facebook page to assist others. Additionally, once city water is officially available for household hookup—estimated around September 30th—the new ordinance will take effect, which requires connection upon property transfers, major remodels, or lot splits, and prohibits the digging of new wells.

2025 Preliminary Budget is Set: We have finalized the preliminary budget at \$662,284, a 5.0% increase from 2024. Despite rising costs from inflation, debt payments, and compensation for the city's leadership positions, we are proud that our annual increases remain among the lowest in the state and our neighboring cities. For reference, our budget grew by 5.8% in 2023, 5.3% in 2024, and now 5.0% in 2025. Considering the financial uncertainties we faced a few years ago with \$9M in road, sewer, and water capital projects, the fact that we've kept taxes low and implemented \$0 in assessments is an incredible achievement. Our city is now equipped with a solid financial foundation, which fortifies our forward-focused operations.

Election Clerk – Open Position: Please join me in thanking Josh Hauble for his years of service as our Election Clerk. Josh is ready to pass this important role to a new person by the end of the year.

ELECTION NEWS!

The general election will be held on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 5</u>, <u>2024</u>. Our polling place for in-person voting on election day is Medicine Lake City Hall. You can check your voter registration status or register to vote online via Minnesota's Secretary of State website at <u>www.sos.state.mn.us/elections-voting</u>.

Vote Early by Mail/Absentee Voting. Medicine Lake's absentee voting, whether in-person or by mail, is coordinated by Hennepin County. You can find information about voting early in-person or by mail, including when and how to request a ballot, at www.hennepin.us/en/residents/elections/absentee-early-voting. That website includes answers to frequently asked questions, important deadlines, options to return your absentee ballot, voting early in person, and a link to track the status of your mail-in ballot to confirm that it was received and counted.

Vote Early In Person. You can vote early in person for the general election at the Hennepin County Government Center (skyway level), 300 South 6th St., Minneapolis, MN 55487, during the following dates and times:

October 30 – November 1: 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. (Wednesday – Friday)

November 2: 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. (Saturday)

November 3: 9 a.m. -3 p.m. (Sunday)

November 4: 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. (Monday)


