GRASS CLIPPINGS

When you are mowing or mulching grass, or blowing or raking up leaves, please keep them out of the street.
Grass clippings and leaves flow down the gutter during rain and eventually plug catch basins. You will receive a fine if you are found to have blown grass or leaves into the street.

GRASS CUTTING

Per Village Ordinance 26-26, it is the responsibility of the property owner to keep the grass cut the entire grass cutting season. Failure to keep the grass cut may result in a fine.

BURNING RESTRICTED

Village Ordinance 14-3 all burning (other than campfires) shall be conducted only between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. Monday through Sunday.

Controlled burning of dry leaves and other non-offensive dry yard debris, and small campfires should be located at least 30 feet from any neighboring structure. Burning brush piles or controlled burning of grass or similar vegetation for environmental management purposes requires written approval from the Fire Chief.



Beautiful weather and sunshine are on the way. With that, weeds are starting to grow in the lake. Just a friendly reminder, we are not allowed to start the harvesting process until June 1 due to DNR regulations to make sure fish spawning is not getting disturbed. We get asked yearly why we don't address the issue and trust us, we would love to. We are in discussion with our fisheries biologist to allow us to cut earlier to stay ahead of the weeds. So far, no luck. Make sure when you see our operators harvesting the lake when the time permits to wave and thank them for all the effort.

On May 3, 2025 we had Fox Wolf Watershed Alliance and Boy Scout Troop 36 at Black Otter Park for our annual lake clean up where we had another successful garbage haul.
