For Your Information:

- **Cemetery Clean up:** October 15–November 15
 - Please have all personal property, that you do not wish to be discarded, removed by October 15
- **Dog license are needed for new dogs**
 - \$10 for spayed/neutered & \$20 for unfixed dogs
- **No Elections for the remainder of 2025**
- **Second Installment of Property Taxes**
 - Can be paid to: Outagamie County Treasurer

- **Snow Season Parking**
 - From November 15–April 1st there is no parking on any street from 3AM – 6AM unless given permission from the Hortonville PD
- **Ice Build-up on Sidewalks**
 - Shoveling & de-icing of sidewalks (including fire hydrants) is the responsibility of the property owner within 24 hours of completed snowfall
- **Trickling of water**

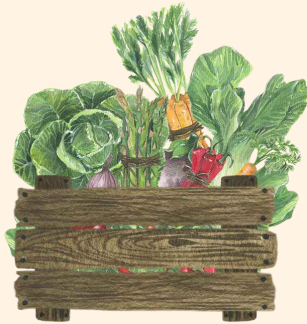

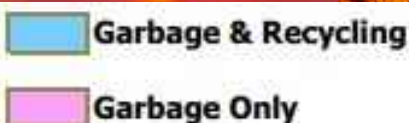
