Highlights of Regular Town Board Meetings

December 19:

Clerk's Report:

- *All town clerks have received a public records request from Columbus for Contemporary Journalism regarding elections going back to 2014.
- *The USDA has given the town approval to use the \$7.700 left over from the USDA grant to order a new refrigerator and freezer. The town only needed to add \$160 for this purchase. These items should be delivered soon.
- *The Rural Public Development is accepting grant applications.
- *Non-profit organizations are responsible for cleaning the town hall after using it.
- The town's 2017 budget was approved by the Board.
- The Snowmobile/ATV trail near Stoney Ridge has been rerouted to the Town of Goodman's property. All liability is covered by the town's insurance.
- > A larger dumpster is needed near the fire department building.
- > The 4th of July activities have been set as June 30 for the dance, and July 1 for the fireworks.
- A new V-box and chain will be purchased for the sander for a cost of \$10,890.
- ➤ The Historical Society reported their liability insurance has been paid, their craft show was a success, and they are selling 2017 picture calendars as a fundraiser.
- ➤ The Board announced a 3% raise in the town employees' salaries, which were already approved in the 2017 budget.
- Marinette County Board is asking for input on a resolution to add a 1/10 of 1% to the county sales tax to support economic development. This will be taken up at the full county board meeting and sent to Madison for approval. Everyone at today's town board meeting voted "no" on this increase.

January 23:

Clerk's Report:

- *The town's Internet system will be upgraded soon.
- *The new refrigerator/freezer has been installed in the kitchen
- *The old refrigerator was donated to the Goodman-Armstrong Creek School District.
- *There will be a primary election for Superintendent of Public Instruction on February 21.
- ➤ The Lease Agreement between the Town of Goodman and the Historical Society will need some changes and will be brought back to February's meeting for signatures.
- The town had previously suggested that 5th Street between Main Street and C Avenue could be abandoned due to its poor condition. Objection was raised by town citizens, and the town agreed to tear up that section of 5th Street and gravel it.

Feb. 20:

- The American Legion (representing the Town of Goodman) applied for a grant from M&M Area Community Foundation for improvements to the area around the Veterans' Memorial, e.g., benches and signage. M&M has approved a grant of \$750, and they will present it at Goodman's town board meeting in March.
- Clerk's Report:
 - *A new Wisconsin Officers Handbook will be ordered for \$40.
 - *Public Service will be pruning trees on town land. If anyone would like some wood chips, contact the county.
 - *The town has an easement for the flower boxes along Highway 8.
 - *The electric pole on the corner of Highway 8 and Snowshoe Drive is not being used; therefore, Public Service Corp. will remove it.
 - *Board of Review is coming up soon.
 - *The fire department's contract with the Town of Armstrong Creek is up. Armstrong Creek has requested a list of Goodman's fire dept. expenses.
 - *The assessor's term for the Town of Goodman expires the end of July.
 - *One position on the Goodman Sanitary District board expires in June. This position will be posted.
 - *The Town of Goodman's insurance contract will expire in July. It will be put out on bids.
- The town approved the sale of gravel and crushed gravel to the town of Dunbar.
 Goodman's Fire Department is rated the same as the one in Iron Mountain, Michigan.
- The Lease Agreement between the Town of Goodman and the Historical Society was approved and signed.
