UPDATES FROM POLICE CHIEF YODER:

THE MOTLEY POLICE DEPARTMENT WILL BE NOTIFYING RESIDENTS WHO HAVE VARIOUS PUBLIC ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS. THESE INCLUDE BUT AREN'T LIMITED TO:

- 1. UNSIGHTLY YARDS. (TOO MANY VEHICLES; DISABLED VEHICLES OR THOSE NOT PROPERLY LICENSED)
- 2. GARBAGE CANS SITTING BY THE STREET OUTSIDE OF PICKUP DAY
- 3. EXTREMELY LONG GRASS, WEEDS, ETC. (PER ORD. 171 NOT TO EXCEED 9")
- 4. Pets not licensed. (Ord. 182) max of 3 adult dogs \it{OR} 4 adult cats. (regardless of whether indoor or outdoor animal). No more than a \it{TOTAL} of 5 animals (this includes a mix of both dogs and cats). Licenses Expire May $31^{\rm st}$ each year.

WE WISH TO WORK WITH RESIDENTS TO GET THESE VIOLATIONS TAKEN CARE OF AND HELP MAKE OUR CITY APPEALING. OUR CITY-WIDE CLEAN-UP DAY IS ON MAY 10TH. USE THIS AS AN OPPORTUNITY TO GET RID OF UNUSED OR NO LONGER NEEDED ITEMS IF THEY CAN'T BE DONATED.



A NOTE FROM FIRE CHIEF OLSON:

Preparing for Spring/Summer storms:

Spring is coming! Which means severe weather is coming. Mother Nature can throw a lot at you. Below is a spring storm checklist to proactively protect your home and property from damaging storms.

- 1. Know your insurance policy information! Know what IS and IS NOT covered. Things like full siding replacement if your siding is discontinued. Pool or trampoline damage, etc.
- 2. If you use a sump pump, make sure to test it. Flooded basements are not fun.
- 3. Backyard items. We all love our backyard oasis for those stay-cations, but there are many items that can become "flight" risks and cause damage. Anything that can't be secured down (patio furniture, hanging potted plants, bird feeders) place in a shed or garage during inclement weather.
- 4. Trim trees. Dead branches can be dangerous projectiles causing damage that may not be covered by your homeowner's insurance. Are they near power sources? Most arborists recommend tree limbs be at least 10 feet away from your home. Hire one or a licensed and bonded tree trimmer to come out and identify any problem areas if needed.
- 5. Have a storm prep kit ready to go. (See Insert)

Keep Summer Fun...Fun:

As we move into Summer, always be "swim safe" around our many beautiful lakes, rivers, streams, and backyard pools! Use a life-jacket when required and do NOT swim alone.





From Public Works:

THANK YOU! We wanted to thank you for your cooperation in the exchanging to the new meter systems. Moving forward this will make meter reading more streamlined and efficient.

HYDRANT FLUSHING:

We will be doing our annual fire hydrant flushing throughout April. You may notice some decreased water pressure or coloration during this time.

LAWN CLIPPINGS:

Be mindful when mowing to avoid blowing lawn clippings onto city streets. Minimizing the grass, leaves, rocks, and trash getting deposited and built up in the streets and catch basins helps to reduce city staff time, and money, spent on sweeping and cleaning out catch basins. It also helps to reduce mosquito population and helps to keep the city looking nice.

MOSQUITOS: Reminder that there is a form on the city's website to submit when the mosquitos are bad in your area. Depending on weather conditions, we can come to your area and spray. We have found the best time to spray for mosquitos is right before dark or early morning when the air is heavy.

GARBAGE CANS: Cans are being left out in the street after pick-up day. Reminder there is an ordinance that covers placement of garbage cans. Please follow the instructions so we do not have to enforce any penalties for this violation.

50.03 (B) It shall be the duty of every person whose garbage and refuse are collected by the sanitation collection service to place their garbage containers directly behind the curbline of the street abutting their property or in the absence of a curb directly behind the ditch line abutting their property. In no event shall containers be placed in the street or on the sidewalk or in any manner placed where the containers will interfere with vehicular or pedestrian traffic. It shall be the responsibility of the subscriber to place the containers out no earlier than 6:00 p.m. of the afternoon preceding the collection day and no later than 6:00 a.rn. on the day of collection. Lid openings must be placed toward the street or alley (handle towards the house) and placed about 3ft apart to allow for mechanical pickup. Carts should be removed after collection on the same day.

ACCEPTED FREE:

NOT ACCEPTED: paint, construction/demolition materials (including carpet), hazardous waste.

ACCEPTED FREE ANYTIME (at compost site, located at end of Main Street East): Leaves (leaves being picked up $\underline{\text{must}}$ be bagged), branches less than 4" in diameter, branches larger than 4" in diameter must be de-limbed and cut in 4' - 6' lengths. Must be separated as follows: Pile 1 - grass, leaves & garden waste, Pile 2 - brush and branches with diameter of 4" or less, and Pile 3 - branches larger than 4" in diameter.


