Look Instructions

Often we know people who are interested in dialoging about spiritual things, but are not ready to make a commitment to Christ. We need to be ready to personally engage them in an "extended conversation" that focuses on the gospel.

Characteristics of Look

Four meetings
One-on-one
45 min to one hour long
Flexible in meeting time and location
Personal and warm

How to lead a "Look" Bible study

1. The invitation

I know you have questions
I'll buy coffee for you and we can do this study together
It is only four meetings
You can stop at any time
At the end, you will know what the Bible says about how to have a relationship with God
Will you do it?

2. The meeting

Give or lend them a Bible
Put the "Look" envelope in it
Give them only the first lesson — the others come one at a time.
You have an envelope as well — with the rest of their lessons
The Scripture is printed in the study — but it is even better if you look at it in the Bible
Spend time on the questions — and make each of them a discussion
Feel free to go on rabbit trails — as long as you come back to the main point.
Keep to the time frame that you promised

3. Other suggestions

Remember that this is spiritual warfare — don't let the enemy get you off track or make you afraid Pray often!

Be pleasantly direct in both your invitation and conversation

If they put their faith in Christ, meet at least one more time in the same format for follow up. Then get them connected with a small group.
