The rand is trading at R17.23 12 cents stronger in the last 2 weeks. The rand continues to trade in a very narrow range at this stage and seems uncorrelated from movements in the dollar as seen above. The dollar has gained some ground in the last 2 weeks with some better than expected economic data coming out, which has resulted in a lowering of the expectations of aggressive interest rate cuts. This could however be short lived as the dollar might come under pressure in the days ahead as it seems that a government shutdown is very likely as a budget deal is yet to be reached. This might turn out to be the catalyst the rand needs to break lower and go and test the low of September 2024 at R17.02.

### Soya bean meal:

Soya bean meal for Dec 2025 is currently trading at 272.1 dollars per short ton lower by 4.89% in the last 2 weeks with forward contracts also lower. Similarly, soya beans are down by 4.91%, with forward contracts also lower. Soya oil is sharply lower by 7.04% on the nearby with forward contracts also lower. The market has taken a significant beating in the last 2 weeks as a result of over supply, no clear trade deal between the US and China as well as several other factors. It took only 2 days for Argentina to sell \$7 billion worth of commodities under 0% export tax to try and raise foreign exchange reserves. This couldn't have come at a worse time for the US with the harvest coming in and the market took it on the nose diving straight to new lows on meal.





#### Midwest:

Warm, dry weather persists in the Midwest this week, aiding harvest. A front may bring showers over the weekend into next week, potentially disrupting maturing crops.

### **Southern Plains:**

Warm, dry conditions favour fieldwork across most Central and Southern Plains this week. Weekend front could bring showers into early next week, hindering harvest but supporting winter wheat planting via soil moisture.

### **Northern Plains:**

A front hits the Northern Plains Wednesday, with showers likely Friday through weekend—disruptive to harvest and unfavourable for immature crops.

#### Delta:

Warm, dry forecast aids Delta harvest but worsens river transport issues after last week's rain boost; dryness may persist through fall


#### **Brazil:**

Southern Brazil sees beneficial rain for planting/early growth this week. Central Brazil dries out with only spotty showers through next week, risking soybean germination/death after recent progress.

### Argentina:

Northern Argentina gets showers this week amid good soil moisture for early planting. Weekend front brings widespread rain; soybean planting starts soon, with main activity in late October.

The next week is forecasted mainly dry with isolated rain expected in parts of the interior, images above. The 7 to 14-Day period is more or less the same as this week with slightly better chances for rain mid-month, image on the right.
