The rand is trading at R19.12 against the dollar 24 cents weaker in the last week. The rand initially reacted well to last week's budget speech but has since fared negatively as the market digested the budget speech. Fitch rating agency yesterday stated that they aren't upbeat about the budget due to the government's inability to implement structural changes, especially the government wage bill. The rand traded as high as R19.39 on last week Friday but has since made up some ground on profit taking as well as worse than expected data out of the US. US durable goods orders declined by 6.1% in January, versus a decline of 4.5% expected. US consumer confidence levels also came in lower than expected at 106.7 versus 115.0 in January.

Soya bean meal:

Soya bean meal for Mar 2024 is currently trading at 331.1. dollars per short ton down 14.7 dollars which is 3.38% lower from a week ago. Soya beans are down by 3.72 while oil prices are down by 1.75% on the nearby. Argentina soya bean good/excellent condition rose 3 points to 84% compared to 41% a year ago better than the 5year average at 77%. Brazilian harvest is 76% complete, while 76% was recorded in the previous year and the 5-year average of 72%. Good conditions in South America as well as sluggish demand from China continues to put the market under pressure. Low soya meal stock levels in China is offset by high soya bean levels, as Chines crushers are yet to resume in full capacity following Chinese new year. Hog prices have also dropped by 7% last week on over supply which also puts further pressure on the demand for meal.

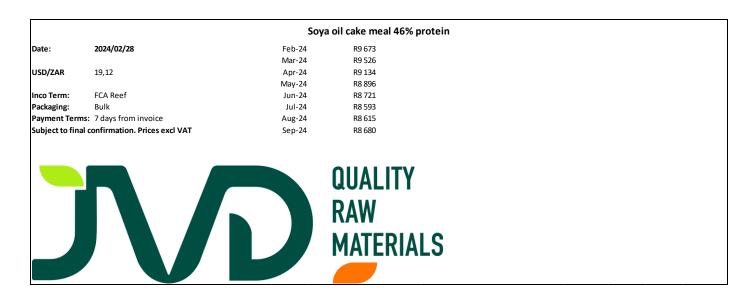

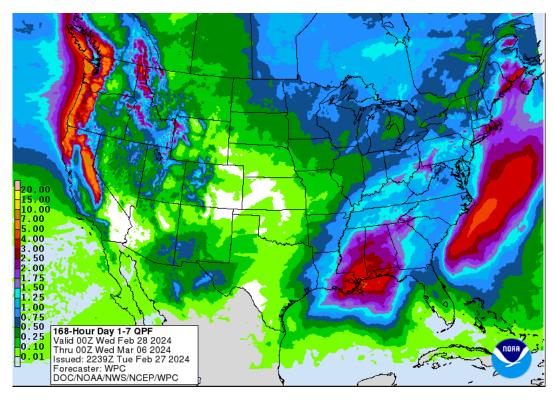
Moving averages

Midwest:

Some light to moderate snow moved through eastern areas of the Midwest Friday into Saturday, but quickly melted in the above-normal temperatures that followed. Extreme warmth continues early this week ahead of a strong cold front that will move through Tuesday and Wednesday. Widespread showers, including some light snow, will move through. Winds will be strong and temperatures will drop significantly behind the front. That will only last about a day or so before temperatures pop right back up well above normal again for Thursday or Friday. Another big storm system is forecast to move through early next week as well and could have similar impacts.

Southern Plains:

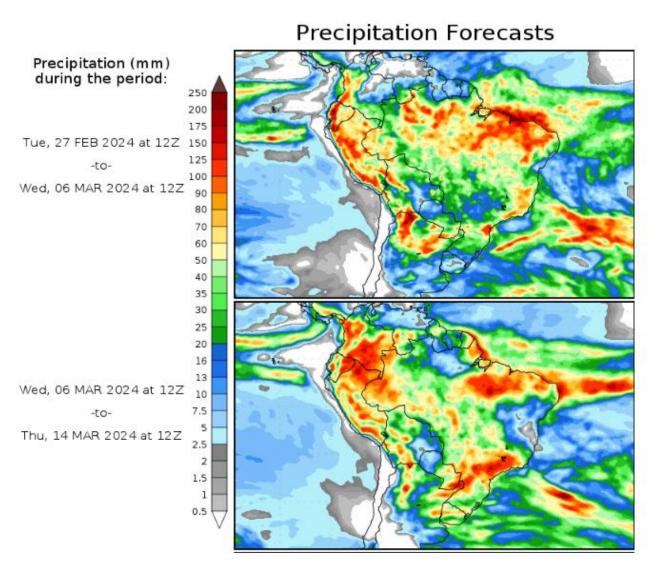
It was very warm and dry in the Central Plains over the weekend. A strong cold front will move through on Tuesday with limited showers, strong winds and a quick burst of cooler air. That won't last long as temperatures soar back above normal again on Thursday. A secondary piece to the storm should bring some showers across the south on Thursday. Warm temperatures again could be significant going through the weekend, but another strong system will move through Sunday and Monday. That system will likely bring areas of heavier precipitation, including the potential for heavy snow across the north, strong winds and another drop in temperatures, settling into a more seasonable range.

Northern Plains:

It was mostly warm and dry in the Northern Plains over the weekend, though there were some isolated showers on Sunday. A much stronger system and cold front will push through the region on Monday and Tuesday. Areas of snow are expected, along with a band of moderate to heavy snow in the northwest. Temperatures will fall dramatically behind this front but only last for about two days before they pop back

Delta:

It was dry in the Delta over the weekend. A cold front will move through with some isolated showers on Wednesday and more showers will follow behind it on Thursday night into Friday. Another system will move through with more showers early next week. Soil moisture continues to be much improved ahead of spring planting.



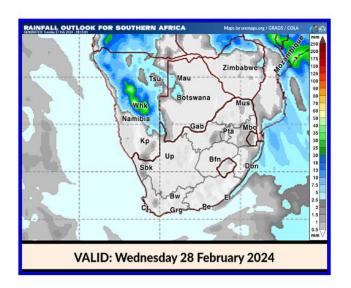
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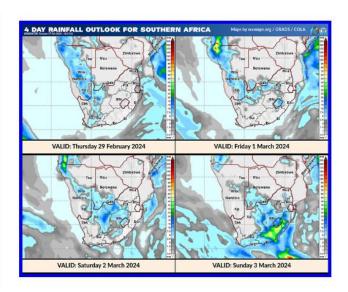
Brazil:

Wet season showers in central Brazil continued over the weekend but they'll be isolated this week. That won't last for long though as they fill back in this weekend. Southern areas saw showers increasing on Sunday and will see waves of showers through Thursday as a front waffles around the region. Showers are forecast to be more sporadic and shifting next week but fairly widespread, which should help with the long season crops in the south and the safrinha corn in the central.

Argentina:

Scattered showers fell across northern Argentina with a somewhat stalled front this weekend. That front will waffle around northern areas through Wednesday. Smaller disturbances will move through southern Argentina this week with more muted shower potential with a better shot this weekend. Showers are not perfect but as long as they keep coming with enough frequency, crop conditions may not fall from the overall good ratings currently enjoyed in the country. Some spots may be missed, however.

South Africa:

During the next week, very little rain is forecasted in the producing areas according to most weather charts of this morning. There are chances for isolated thunderstorms later this week in parts of the central and western interior with most rain expected in the Drakensberg areas the weekend and early next week The ongoing activities in the Indian Ocean will have a negative influence in the interiors weather patterns. Next week and weekend are indicated with limited rain in the producing areas at this point. Mixed temperatures are expected throughout the interior with heatwave conditions in the western and central interior.
