KS2 Prompts

- **Opening the Letter:**
 - How would you start your letter to show respect and gratitude? ("Dear [Name], I admire you because...")
- **Explain Your Choice:**

 - What makes her inspiring to you?
- **Highlight Achievements:**
 - What has she done that you think is amazing or has made a big difference in the world?

- **Words of Thanks:**
 - What would you like to thank her for? ("Thank you for showing...")
- **Closing Thoughts:**
 - How will you carry her influence into your life?
 - End the letter with a kind and thoughtful goodbye.

Letter writing activity

- **Write a letter of thanks to an inspirational woman.**

KS3 Prompts

- **Introduction:**
 - How would you greet the woman and explain the purpose of your letter? ("I am writing to you because...")
- **Why She's Inspirational:**
 - What makes her stand out to you? Mention her qualities or achievements.
- **Connection to You:**
 - How does her work, life, or story connect to your life or dreams?
- **Acknowledging Challenges:**
 - Do you know any challenges she has faced?
 - How has she overcome them, and why does that inspire you?
- **Gratitude:**
 - What specifically are you grateful for?
 - How has her contribution made the world (or your world) a better place?
- **Future Goals:**
 - How does her example influence what you want to do or achieve in your own life?
- **Closing Statement:**
 - End the letter with a sincere thank-you and a thoughtful goodbye.

Poem writing activity

- Write a poem to an inspirational woman.

KS2 Prompts

- Think about a woman you admire. She could be someone from history, someone famous, or even someone in your life.
- Use these questions to guide your writing:
 - What makes her special or unique?
 - What has she achieved that inspires you?
 - How does she make the world a better place?
- Try to include:
 - Describing words (adjectives) to show why she is amazing.
 - A comparison to something strong, kind, or powerful (similes or metaphors).
 - A message about why she is important or how she inspires others.
- For example:
 - "She's as strong as the tallest tree,
 - Her voice spreads hope across the sea.

KS3 Prompts

- Choose a woman who inspires you.
 - She could be a historical figure, a famous person, or someone you know personally.
- Reflect on these themes:

 - Her struggles and how she overcame them.
 - Her impact on you or the wider world
- Use poetic techniques to make your writing powerful, such as:
