

ACADEMIC PROPOSAL

Study Programme

On the first day at school, each student is interviewed by a senior teacher, who is in charge of designing a "Study Program" which is set up based on the academic objectives of each student. Students move up when they have passed the required skills tests. These tests are given in Week 3 and Week 5 of the 6-week Block.

Student Passport

The entire learning process is reflected in a document called "Student Passport" which is reviewed by the teacher and the student once every 6 weeks. If necessary, modifications are made for students to achieve their goals quickly.


Student Conferences

Every 6 weeks, "Student Conferences" are held between the student and the tutor. In these meetings, the student's progress and study goals are analysed; and if necessary, modifications are made to the study plan.

Online learning system

Additionally, the student will have access to the "Worldwide Online" (on-line learning system); created especially for the student to deepen their knowledge through specific exercises which are designed to improve their level of English. This system can be accessed from any electronic device.

ENGLISH PLUS INTERNSHIP PROGRAMMES

At Worldwide School we are offering two different options for unpaid work experience in Auckland, New Zealand; mainly for students who are interested in a unique and exciting experience beyond the classroom. *T&Cs apply

OPTION A Study English plus Full-time Internship*

The student will do a Full-time or Part-time Internship AFTER finishing English courses.

Depending on the English level the student must do at least 4 weeks of Full-Time English language study (minimum English level should be at B2) followed by an internship of 6-24 weeks in the area of the studies and/or previous work experience.

An applicant must first send the completed Internship Programme Application Form to Worldwide School along with information and documents to meet the entry requirements.

Requirements:

- Business Industry they wish to do an internship (including at least 3 areas of interest).
- ▶ CV of the applicant.
- Cover Letter.
- ▶ Time of year they would like to come and length of English study and Internship.
- ▶ The candidate must be at least Upper-Intermediate (CEFR B2)
- * It is operated by a professional placement company. The internships are UNpaid, non-permanent that enable a student to participate in, and observe, a professional work environment.



OPTION B Study and Internship (SANDI Programme)*

The student will do a Full-time or Part-time Internship AFTER finishing English courses.

This is a Joint Programme between Worldwide School and Crown Institute as part of their Tourism and Hospitality partnerships. Internship at a Tourism or Hospitality partner.

Requirements:

- ▶ CV of the applicant.
- Cover Letter.
- Students must have a minimum Intermediate B1+ level of English (Offshore pre-tests available)
- ▶ Minimum 4 weeks and maximum 12 weeks programme.
- * It is operated by Crown Institute of Studies.

ABOUT OUR EDUCATION GROUP



Worldwide School and Crown Institute collaborate closedly to enhance each other's educational services and offerings.

The two schools have partnered to create English & Vocational Study pathways and short-term internship programmes for many international students.

This relationship provides Worldwide School students with multiple pathways to English training plus numerous tertiary qualifications.

Worldwide students now have access to more training resources and facilities, more options for further studies like vocational qualifications or pathways to university studies, and employment opportunities.

We offer a unique practical and learning experience for our students:

- WWSE students will get to enjoy English + short course options (Health and Safety, Health and Wellbeing, Barista, Hotel, Restaurant, Event Management, and more).
- WWSE students will have access to Crown's training facilities.
- WWSE students will be in a position to connect with Crown's NZ-based and international industry and education partners.



Crown works with over 50 industry partners, big corporates such as FUJIFILM, Four Points by Sheraton, SEALIFE, AJ Hackett, iFLY, Argus Fire Protection, Ranfurly Hospital & Village, The Hotel Britomart, Ramada & Wyndham Hotels & Resorts...etc.

In terms of education partners, we have signed agreements with Massey University, the Technological and Higher Education Institute of Hong Kong (THEi), and the Hang Seng University of Hong Kong (HSUHK), providing students with an abundance of choice locally and internationally.

Students successfully completing our New Zealand Certificate of Business (Level 4) will gain direct entry to three of Massey's degree programs: Bachelor of Business / Information Sciences / Construction (Any major). For international students, this means they do not have to worry about fulfilling the higher English requirements to study at the undergraduate level.

HISTORY

Worldwide was established in 1989 by three businessmen, and the original premise was at 1 Queen Street. In 1996, the school was purchased by two of their senior staff and changed the school name and moved to its following location at 8 Commerce street.

Then in 2014, Worldwide School moved to their current location, 80 Anzac Avenue is a six-floor building that Worldwide School shares with another private provider, Crown Institute of

Studies. Moving there marked the beginning of another period of growth, where from 2016, Worldwide School had at any one time up to 250 students and usually from 25-30 different nationalities.

In September 2021, the owners sold Worldwide School to KIEL, a trusted partner who owns and operates the Crown Institute of Studies. The two schools will not be merging but will be working as partners to enhance each other's educational services. WWSE now has access to more training resources and facilities, more options for further studies (vocational qualifications or pathways to university studies) and employment opportunities.

ACCOMMODATION SERVICES HOMESTAYS & APARTMENTS





We place students with local family to live with while studying at Worldwide School. The homestay family will show them how to get to school on their first day.

As all our families live close to a bus stop, the commute is between 45-60 minutes by bus.

Please also note that there will be limited homestay availability for mid-week arrivals as host families prefer to take arrivals at the weekend.

The minimum booking period for apartments is 4 weeks.

The first 4 weeks of a homestay cannot be refunded. If a student wants to leave, a 2-week notice must be given to both the family and the Homestay Coordinator.



Apartments

The apartments we work with are within easy walking distance (5-10 minutes) to Worldwide School of English, Queen Street shopping area, pubs, café's, entertainment, and all public transport.

We offer a private single room with shared facilities. All rates included power and water; Wi-Fi fee is not included.

Accommodation payment is made to Worldwide School for the initial booking. Students wishing to extend (minimum 2 weeks) need to contact the school first to arrange.

The minimum booking period for apartments is 4 weeks.

Please note that as the City Apartments are not owned by Worldwide School, and we are not liable for any issues or problems a student may have.

The first 4 weeks of an apartment cannot be refunded. If a student wants to leave, 2-weeks' notice must be given to school staff member. These apartments are separate organisations and NOT owned by Worldwide School.
