This policy summary is subject to change as a result of Health Dept regulations E & OE.

The ABCRA COVIDSafe policy outlines the expectations of all participants and any attendees of ABCRA Sanctioned activity in the effort to reduce the transmission of COVID-19 and provide a safe environment for all.

Breaches of this policy at any ABCRA sanctioned activity will result in disciplinary action and may subsequently incur prosecution.

1.1 Key Principles

- The health and safety of members, participants, coaches, officials, Committee administrators/volunteers, visitors, families and the broader community is the number one priority;
- Affiliates, Members, participants, coaches, official personnel, Committee administrators/volunteers, families and the broader community need to be engaged and briefed on ABCRA's return to sport plans;
- Committee facilities are assessed and appropriate plans are developed to accommodate upgraded hygiene protocols, physical distancing and other measures to mitigate the risk of transmission of COVID-19;
- ABCRA Sanctioned Shows & Training days cannot resume until the arrangements for sport operations and facility operations are finalised and approved and
- At every stage of the return to sport process, ABCRA must consider and apply all applicable State and Territory Government
 and local restrictions and regulations. ABCRA & Committee Affiliates need to be prepared for any localised outbreak at their
 facilities, within their competitions or in the local community.

1.2 General Obligations

ABCRA expects all Show attendees, Affiliated Committees, general members & participants, coaches, official personnel, administrative staff and volunteers to:

- ✓ Comply with the health directions of government and public health authorities as issued from time to time;
- ✓ Understand and act in accordance with this policy as amended from time to time;
- ✓ Comply with any testing and precautionary measures implemented by ABCRA;
- ✓ Provide official test results to ABCRA where necessary;
- ✓ Act with honesty and integrity when completing the mandatory declarations as to the state of their personal health and any potential symptoms, recent contact;
- ✓ Monitor their health and take a cautious approach to self-isolation and reporting of potential symptoms;
- ✓ Follow attendance registry protocols at each sanctioned show using accurate contact details;
- ✓ Follow, comply and remain informed of updates regarding all COVID policies/protocols/procedures delivered by ABCRA Head Office:
- ✓ Follow any directives administered by Head Office, the Committee or sanctioned event staff without hesitation or confrontation.
- ✓ Follow recommendation to download and utilise the Government COVIDSafe app particularly during sanctioned events.

1.3 Persons prohibited from attendance

All show and premises attendees including but not limited to spectators, Employees, Members, Committee, Contractors, Officials and Personnel are prohibited from attending a show if they:

- (a) Have COVID-19 or have been in direct contact with a known case of COVID-19 in the previous 14 days;
- (b) Flu-like symptoms or who is a high health risk (e.g. due to age or pre-existing health conditions) or
- (c) Travelled internationally or had contact with persons who have travelled internationally in the previous 14 days.
- (d) Attended any of the reported case locations listed on https://covid-19-au.com/



How to Handwash?

WASH HANDS WHEN VISIBLY SOILED! OTHERWISE, USE HANDRUB



Duration of the entire procedure: 40-60 seconds



Wet hands with water;



Apply enough soap to cover all hand surfaces;



Rub hands palm to palm;



Right palm over left dorsum with interlaced fingers and vice versa;




Palm to palm with fingers interlaced;



Backs of fingers to opposing palms with fingers interlocked;



Rotational rubbing of left thumb clasped in right palm and vice versa;



Rotational rubbing, backwards and forwards with clasped fingers of right hand in left palm and vice versa;



Rinse hands with water;



Dry hands thoroughly with a single use towel;



Use towel to turn off faucet;



Your hands are now safe.
