MOVEMENT AND TRACEABILITY OF LIVESTOCK (NLIS Database)

All cattle used at an event must have their NLIS tag recorded, transferred on the NLIS database to and from the property of origin through the PIC number for the property at which the event has been held.



This is a national legal requirement.

Each state department of agriculture may have different requirements in how these transfers can be recorded (Please check your specific state regulations).

WHAT YOU MUST DO:

- 1. Have a **registered PIC** for the property the event is being held at.
- 2. **Register an account with the NLIS database** as a sporting organisation
- 3. Collect the RFID numbers from the livestock and complete a transfer from and to the property of origin. (some states may allow mob based transfers)

Movements (transport) are recorded on NVD's, Travelling Stock Statements, and Waybills. We suggest that the committee's collect a copy of these movement documents for all stock received at your event.
