The Australian Quarter Horse Association honours WINDERADEEN PEPPYCOSE with induction into the Hall of Fame.

WINDERADEEN PEPPYCOSE was purchased at five months old and is known as “Cody”. His sire, LITTLE PEPPY DOC (IMP) was six times top two leading sire and his dam, PICOSA MENDIGA (IMP) a top five leading performing dam for many years.

Verging on two decades ago this amazing gelding started to leave his mark in the history of Australian Quarter Horses. His statistics are unmatched even to this day.

WINDERADEEN PEPPYCOSE life time cash earnings is over \$46,500. This does include the many buckles, trophies, awards, saddle or the \$14,000 Bill French Bronze Sculpture he was awarded.

“Cody” was retired in 1994 due to bone degeneration. He amassed a total of 1785.5 life time AQHA points in a life total of 88 shows. This is even more amazing as this averaged as 20 AQHA points per show (at this time futurity events did not gain any points).



HALTER

"Cody", as a yearling halter horse, was awarded the AQHA Superior Halter Award. He won three Yearling Halter Futurities and was Champion Halter Gelding of the Australian Quarter Horse Championships, N.S.W. Championships and VIC. Championships earning \$10,000 in his first year.

For seven years from 1988 until 1994 he was undefeated Grand Champion Halter Gelding at the N.S.W. Quarter Horse Championships. He was two time Grand Halter Champion at the Australian Quarter Horse Championships.

Earning all awards up to and including Halter Gold Century Award with 328.5 halter points.

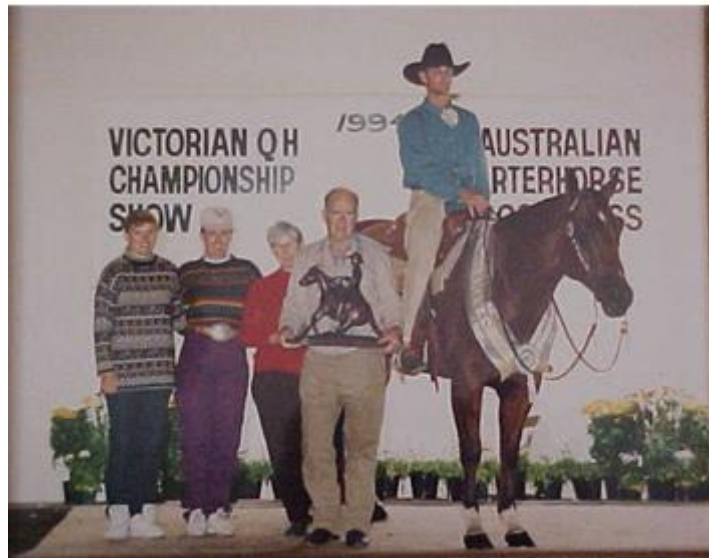


PERFORMANCE

WINDERADEEN PEPPYCOSE was awarded AQHA Performance Champion at two years of age (31/05/89). Upon retirement he had been awarded a total of forty (40) AQHA awards including the AQHA Special Recognition Award in September, 1994. Cody accumulated his 1785.5 AQHA points and awards at major shows under the majority of American Judges who graced our shores.

Cody has been the winner of 27 Performance Futurities, of Western Pleasure, Hunter under Saddle, Trail or Versatility events. At prestigious events as National Pleasure Horse Association, N.S.W. & VIC. Championships, the Southern Circuit events at Lillydale, Halter Extravaganza and Australian Championship Futurities.

In 1994 he was the Australian Quarter Horse Congress 'Super Horse' winning the much competed for 'Straight Arrow' limited edition Bill French bronze sculpture valued at \$14,000. After competing in Halter, Western Pleasure, Hunter under Saddle, Trail and Reining events.



Cody has held 21 Australian Quarter Horse Championships in his short career, and has covered a multitude of events such as Western Riding, Dressage, Showmanship, Equitation, Horsemanship, Trail, Reining, Western Pleasure, Hunter under Saddle and Halter.

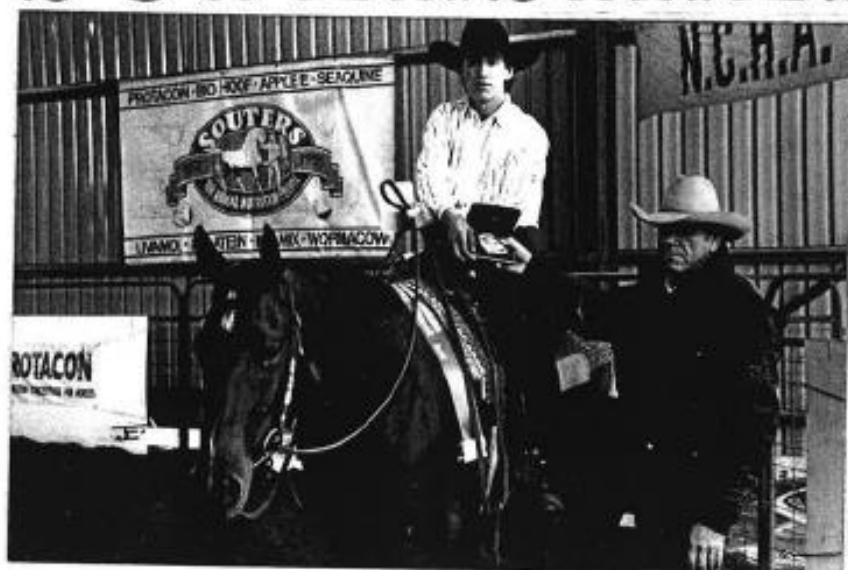
PROMOTIONAL

Not only has Cody proven himself as a most capable versatile individual, but as a gentleman who loaned himself to Youth over the years, such as John Mitchell who won the NCHA Super Sires Western Pleasure Futurity and 2nd at the NPHA Youth Western Pleasure Futurity; Kristy Gray who was so small she had to watch the Judge under his neck in the Showmanship and attracted applause; Melissa Green (nee Dean) won three AQHA National Showmanship titles with Cody, and not least, American Quincy Cahill who showed 'Cody' also at the NPHA in Youth Showmanship.



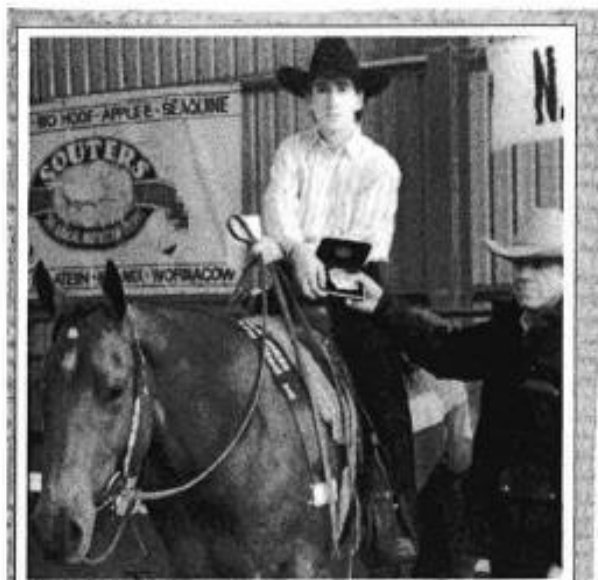
In 1994, WINDERADEEN PEPPYCOSE'S name was put forward by the then AQHA President Jan Miller to participate in representing the Australian Quarter Horse Breed in a Burke's Backyard television special to "Road Test the Quarter Horse". This was accepted and 'Cody' was used showing a beautiful correctly conformed Quarter Horse running free at full speed on the green grassed large oval at Sugarloaf Cobbitty, then quickly stopping and rolling back to be at full speed again only to stop square and alert like the halter champion he is. 'Cody' presented to the public as a free moving athletic specimen who was as kind and willing as he had been throughout his career.
