



ACROSS the country, the popular sport of Western Dressage embraces an open-minded acceptance of all breeds and styles of horses, and in many parts of Australia, the Quarter Horse is fast proving to be a super contender! This was confirmed when Western Dressage returned to the AQHA Nationals in a big way, bringing with it, a fabulous sponsor in Dynavyte, much to the delight of the Q21 competitors, and AQHA judge, Ms. Lorelei Payne.

fter two years the Western Dressage was back, and it was enjoyable, but serious business! It was the first class for the AQHA National Show, and a total of 13 enthusiastic & well-prepared competitors, hoped to present the perfect test to the judge, with the chance to take home one of four beautiful Trophy Buckles. With that, a massive note of thanks is extended out to Dynavyte, Queensland, who generously sponsored the event and donated the Buckles, each proudly displaying the Q21 logo, for each of the Western Dressage divisions; Open, Amateur, Select Amateur and Youth.

As judge for the event, Lorelei says that she was extremely grateful to obtain this substantial sponsorship from Dynavyte and was very proud to hand the Buckles out to each of the winners, perhaps more so, as they were the only buckles at the Nationals emblazoned with the Q21 logo.



Everyone was pleased to see the positive interest shown. Lorelei says. 'Each of these competitors deserves some praise as they'd prepared their horses wonderfully and competed so well. I really enjoyed judging the class and it was great to see such lovely forward moving horses, which is a must for Western Dressage. It was also encouraging to see that no horse was shown in a forced frame and each showed with very natural head carriages.'

Lorelei remarked that she loved seeing the ease of free-flowing movement displayed, and while the horses showed athleticism, there was still lightness in the forehand. While the test pattern asked for precise movements and correct leg yield, a must in the test, she says that everyone tried very hard and showed her correct movement scores. Lorelei also says that she had some people chat with her after the event, commenting on how great it was to see horses going forward and looking happy.

2021 AQHA NATIONAL CHAMPION OPEN WESTERN DRESSAGE

How Cool Am I Q-59935 & Debra Watson

Debra Watson purchased How Cool Am I, aka Humphrey, from Jo-anne Brown, QLD in 2015, on the recommendation of AQHA Judge, Leanne Bartlett.

I was looking for a Quarter Horse that had the movement to be competitive in open Dressage competition,' Debra begins. 'Humphrey is by Ima Cool Seeker, who most people know to produce horses with an outstanding movement combined with good looks. I was definitely not disappointed with how he turned out. Humphrey went on to win and place in many open Dressage competitions. Standing at only 15.3hh, he held his own against the much bigger-moving Warmbloods.

In 2017, Humphrey was awarded the National High Point Dressage Horse of Australia, a testament to the



temperament and versatility of the Quarter Horse that he could achieve such success.'

The introduction of Western Dressage into Australia combined Debra's two loves in the horse industry and with Humphrey's Dressage training behind him she decided to take the opportunity to combine this with her western background.

'Our first attempt showing at Western Dressage was competing at the 2021 Australian Quarter Horse Championships. Humphrey produced an amazing test for me and knowing how much hard work had gone into his training over the years, I was extremely proud to be announced the winner of the class. Western Dressage can appeal to a lot of competitors looking to improve the suppleness, softness, obedience and responsiveness in their horses while riding in western tack and attire. The popularity of Western Dressage in many states is increasing rapidly with Dressage Clubs now looking to host events, and I look forward to seeing continued growth.'

Western Dressage classes are designed to provide a systematic and progressive means of stepping up through the various levels of training, producing versatile, calm and attentive riding horses, while promoting improved riding and a greater level of horse and rider partnership. Judges of Western Dressage have a great desire to see each horse and rider develop a useful working partnership, which is pleasing to watch. The way of going for a Western Dressage horse, should sit somewhere between Western Pleasure and traditional Dressage. It should be more active and ground covering than a Western Pleasure horse, but more relaxed, although not as intense, as a traditional Dressage horse. Judges want to see a confident, obedient horse that is a pleasure to ride and works in harmony with its rider.

'Western Dressage is a class where horses that are being shown in either Ranch, Reining or Cutting can also take part,' Lorelei concludes. 'It can add another level to their training and build on a better partnership between horse & rider. There are clubs in various parts of the country that run Western Dressage events each month, with the main Western Dressage Association Australia, based at Maryborough, in Queensland holding their Nationals in September, with competitors and spectators coming from everywhere. The sport has a great following in South Australia, and far & wide in Queensland, with events being held in Bundaberg, Dalby, Caboolture, Maryborough, Gladstone and in North Queensland, with many areas getting together to get classes going. It's a growing sport where a horse can compete, feel comfortable and look natural in body and soul. We ran the Q21 event under the banner of WDA-AUS.'

Along with Lorelei Payne, all competitors in the Q21 Western Dressage class wish to thank the AQHA for including this event in the program, allowing Western Dressage to gain more exposure, and to further extend & display the versatility of the Quarter horse. Many thanks go out to the event steward, Jill Wagner, from Armidale, and Kyle Mobberly and the AQHA staff for setting up the Western Dressage arena.









VALE MR GREGORY ALLEN GILPIN; One of the Greats






Greg offered his knowledge and training services, and conducted clinics in many disciplines and breeds, but specialised in the western performance area. He was an incredible horseman who trained many horses to become great horses. He was a master of the event of Western Riding, widely referred to as being one of the best at training a horse for those impeccable lead changes.

Always very kind and generous, Greg was instrumental in introducing and starting many people off in the western industry. He gave much of his time, consideration and care to his own horses, horses in training, and personally, to his clients, sharing his wealth of knowledge and expertise wherever he went. Many western industry people will remember Greg, as he was well-known around the around the Sydney area's western show circuit, as well as at many shows throughout NSW, VIC & QLD. Greg consistently demonstrated the versatility of the Quarter horse across many events, fronting the winners circle at the Sydney Royal Easter Show, County of Cumberland, AQHA Championships and many more events throughout Australia.

Greg started as a dairy hand at 'Retford Park', a property then owned by the Hordern family. Greg's calm demeanour, work ethic and ability with animals, especially horses, saw him promoted to breaking-in and showing the Welsh Mountain ponies the stud bred.

When King Ranch purchased Retford Park & Milton Park, Greg accepted a position with the Australian division of King Ranch, to become one of their trainers working with the new management. Martin Lemann, Assistant to the King Ranch Australia General Manager, Peter Bailleau, was in charge of the early Quarter Horse stud operations, managed by Stan Shephard, and assisted by Greg Gilpin. Later, Greg replaced Stan as Stud Manager.

During the 4th importation of stock from the USA, Greg was tasked with managing the transfer from England to Australia, via cargo ship. The valuable livestock were secured in wooden crates, which were tied onto the open deck. In the midst of a particularly violent storm, a near disaster occurred when the lashings on a Quarter horse mare's crate came loose, and a section of the crate was actually hanging over the edge of the ship. Greg and the crew clambered onto the deck and hauled her back on board. Not bad for a man that never knew how to swim!

In 1969, King Ranch Australia's Milton Park Quarter Horse Stud celebrated the introduction of the Quarter Horse to the Sydney Royal Easter Show, boasting a 'double win', with Greg Gilpin preparing and showing both, King Ranch Valido to the Sydney Royal Supreme Champion Stallion, and King Ranch Quarter Chime Q103 to Champion Quarter Horse Mare.

Among others over the years, Retford Park & Milton Park later stood such Quarter horse stallions as King Ranch Jubilee Q-2113, King Ranch Falcon Q-764, King Ranch Iron Hand Q-1652, El Pajote Q-1447, and Peppy Snake Q-1448.


Greg trained and showed King Ranch Quarter Banjo R1-251, to win the Open Trail Horse at 1971 Moe Quarter Horse Championships, Victoria, as well as King Ranch Amber Q138, who became an Australian Quarter Horse Champion. With a great affinity with young riders, Greg trained and mentored many to become High Point Youth competitors, some even venturing over to the USA to become successful trainers & competitors there.

As a note of interest, in 1974, when HRH Princess Anne and her then husband, Captain Mark Phillips, visited Sydney, Greg Gilpin was called upon to supply some Quarter horses for them to ride. The horses chosen were arguably some of the best of their times, brought across from King Ranch, Bowral, NSW to Camden Park by Greg. Princess Anne rode King Ranch Quarter Banjo, an 8yo first cross gelding who'd been performing well in competition during that time.

Greg's passion was Polocrosse, and as one of the best in the country, he represented Burradoo Polocrosse Club, he competing alongside his brother, Neville, and some of the best riders in the Southern Highlands. Greg's involvement with Quarter horses saw the breed playing at the highest levels of Polocrosse all around Australia.

A great family man, Greg and his wife, Pat, had three sons Geoff, Michael & Ian (who unfortunately died at an early age). Both Geoff & Michael were trained by





their father, to become top Youth competitors, showing off their abilities on the 'Ranch' team. Greg sadly lost his lovely wife, Pat, in 2014, after a long illness. This wonderful couple had time for everyone, and will always be remembered by AQHA members, as well as the greater equine community.

Great friend, Richard Mulcahy, spoke very highly of Greg, and believes he did so much for the King Ranch brand in Australia.

'A Greg Gilpin trained horse could do anything,' Richard recalls. 'Competing on the one mount in just about every event was often the case for Greg at the County of Cumberland Quarter Horse Association shows. From Bridle Path Hack, Western Pleasure and Trail to the more

demanding classes of Western Riding, Reining, and Working Cowhorse, Greg really did touch so many equine disciplines. He never took anyone or anything for granted and was always appreciative of the amazing opportunities presented to him! Greg Gilpin was a friend, father, mentor, master horseman, teacher, critic and an all-round good guy. I'll miss breaking my mate out of the Bowral retirement home for a Chinese lunch and picking his brain for tips whenever I'd forgotten something. Greg helped me to feed my family for years with the skills he taught me, and I'll forever be in his debt!'

R.I.P. Greg Gilpin, with condolences extended out to his family & friends. An inspiration to many people, Greg will be sadly missed.

IT'S ALL ABOUT PROTEIN©

ENGINES are usually measured and compared on the basis of their 'horse-power'.


Comparing the competition horse to a high-performance car, the speed, power and stamina are not determined by the size of the fuel tank. They are determined by the size of the engine! A smaller engine = less power and endurance. In the horse, the engine is the muscles.

to making a cake, you need flour, eggs and coca etc to make a chocolate cake. If you run out of cocoa, chocolate cake production stops. You might be able to make other cakes with the left-over ingredients, or you might have to throw them out. Either way, chocolate cake production ceases. In horses, unusable protein is converted to fat.

Proteins are made of chains of different amino acids. In nature there are roughly 500 amino acids, but just 20 amino acids make up the proteins found in the body. Of these the horse's liver can make 10 from the raw ingredients in the diet. The other 10 must come preformed in the feed. These are called 'essential amino acids'. The horse uses lysine, methionine, threonine, histidine, leucine and arginine in almost every tissue.



Just as a plank that is not in the correct amount to form the sides of a complete barrel will limit the contents of the barrel,adeficiencyofanysingleessentialaminoacidonewill place a limit on cell and tissue creation, building and repair.

Every protein in feedstuffs has it's own combination of amino acids – soybeans and lucerne are high in essential amino acids, but oats and grassy hays are low. This is what makes soy and lucerne good protein sources for a horse.

How much protein does a horse need?

It depends on age, breed, workload and bodyweight - but they all need a number of grams a day - not a percent! For example if a horse is fed each day 1kg of a 30% protein feed, it gets 300g of protein a day. If it is fed 2kg each day of a 15% protein feed it still gets 300g of protein. So % protein is not a basis on which to compare feeds. And is the protein in a feed does not have the correct essential amino acids, it might only be 50% useable protein. This is why % protein tells you nothing about how well your diet is meeting the amount of protein and the essential amino acid requirements of your horse. Some studies have concluded that performance horses do not need additional protein for health, soundness and performance - but these studies do not take into account the quality of the protein and how much is unusable. And, no matter how balanced the diet, exercise causes a disruption to metabolism. As well as providing the correct proteins

in the daily diet, there are additional opportunities to help your horse be stronger, fitter and support muscle.

When does your horse need it?

Hard training and competitive events cause muscle damage which must be repaired rapidly to alleviate muscular stiffness and delayed muscle soreness, support rapid recovery, allow training to continue and to prepare the horse for the next event. In fact, preparation for the next event or ride begins as soon as the last one is finished. For performance horses, the timing of feeding protein is super important. It is during recovery after work that protein will be working hardest - repairing tiny microscopic rips and tears in muscles, tendons and ligaments, increasing muscle fibre size, creating new blood capillaries etc. The 'timing' and composition of protein are the most important factors influencing muscle growth because no matter how balanced the diet is, exercise causes a disruption. The performance horse need key nutrients at higher levels as the muscles look for the nutritional support to adapt to work. By ensuring nutrients are available the nanosecond the muscle demands them, we can transition the body to an anabolic state of tissue building - instead of a state of tissue breakdown (catabolic). The timing and strategy of pre- and post-work feeding strategies makes a big difference to recovery and increasing strength and fitness.

During exercise blood flow to the working muscles increases and hormones released during exercise program the muscle to increase its nutrient uptake. These remain elevated for up to 2 hours after work – then everything returns to resting levels. By providing the correct balance of essential and branched chain amino acids before and as soon as possible (ideally within an hour) after work, we can transition the muscles to building and repair. 



Elgrando was a remarkable horse who, with limited opportunity, has left a considerable legacy. He was bred by Sam Hordern and purchased at the age of 13 months by Max McTaggart. He was broken in at 14 months and spent 22 months on the road droving sheep.

hey formed a unique partnership which i. Silver and Bronze Century Award for Cutting encompassed many years together showing in all eastern States promoting the equine skills and versatility of the Quarter Horse.

Cutting was Elgrando's game, but he had other talents as well. At the Quarter Horse Show at Penrith in 1973 he won the \$1,000 Open Reining and at the same show his three year old daughter, Elamo, won the \$1,000 Open Cutting.

In those days there were limited opportunities for crossbred stallions so he was gelded as an eight year old, but not before Max McTaggart built his breeding program on a small band of well performed Elgrando mares, having left their mark on the AQHA Performance registry in a significant way.

From 1976 onward, Elgrando was owned and shown successfully by Hugh Sawrey, one of Australia's most famous artists. He was retired from Open Cutting at the age of 19.





In 1981, five of Elgrando's daughters were given Q status by the AQHA Board on their performance and/or the performance of their progeny. Elgrando was the sire of NCHA High Point Mare of Australia, "Elamo" in 1974 and that brilliant little grey gelding, "Wagga", who was shown by some of the best AQHA Youth riders of his era.

Elgrando's daughter, "Lee Jay" won every round of the Calf Roping with Gary McPhee at the National Finals Rodeo in Cootamundra. She was in foal at the time!

aving been involved in the industry and the WAQHA / AQHA for around 25 years and Secretary of WAQHA for the last season, Sharon has seen some ups and downs and some fads come and go, but she wouldn't change it for the world.

Sharon first competed in unofficial hacking, then found western. "I attended a show in WA many years ago and watched Shane Massingham riding Colonels Gold and thought, wow, I want to do that. I attempted to turn my off the track Thoroughbred into a western horse, meeting Dawn Holliday and my journey started from there. I had a mini mid life crisis around 30 and had lessons with an A grade showjumper and was going to purchase a jumper. Then I got a job in the country, met my hubby and western just seemed to stick," recalls Sharon.

Bullsbrook WA is home for Sharon, she works as a Clinical Social Worker in St John of God Subiaco Private Hospital—working with patients regarding



respiratory, palliative, orthopedic, gynecology, general medicine, with a specialty in Cognitive Impairments / Dementia. Sharon also had an Equine Massage business, Broke Az Therapeutic Services, for six years, but the work was a bit unforgiving on her body.

Her work colleagues know Sharon's horse mad, and people find amusing as it takes her twice as long to get to work than a show. Every morning, up at 5.30 to put her horses out/change rugs/feed/muck out and leave home for work at 6.30. Back home from work at 5.30 pm, they are brought back in, given afternoon tea, and depending on the day, Sharon works one of them. Then they are rugged, fed and put to bed. "I have lights at home, which are great but tend to have two nights midweek where I don't work horses and do house stuff instead. Consistency is my key, but it's a struggle in colder months," says Sharon.

"In WA, we are pretty limited to the number of competitions, so usually we have around 6-8 events in the calendar year, across our three western clubs here. I'm fortunate as most of our shows are held at the State Equestrian Centre, about half an hour from home in the Swan Valley. I still pack up and head down and camp for 2-4 days to show. I would love to attend shows over East more, but a 4–5-day drive to get there would equate to 3 weeks off work which makes it very hard. We have considered having a horse with a trainer, but I'm a hands-on person, so that's not an option for me just yet," Sharon said.

"I was blessed to be able to have three months away from work and home in 2017 thanks to a very supportive hubby. I competed in the VIC State Show, Q17, including pre and AmQHA shows, a club show in Ballarat, the NSW State Show and the NPHA. I appreciated the level of training and fitness the horses and riders need, given the amount of travel alone to get to shows and compete at such a high level regularly. A wonderful experience. I will never forget what I learnt, the people I met and the friends I made. To ride with people of that caliber regularly did so much for my riding and was very inspiring, to say the least."

Mark Shaffer, Vanessa Hancox, Brian Cramp, Elise Young, Karen Cornish, Karen Nicoletto. All very talented horse people I have been involved with either training, lessons, clinics and shows."

"The resilience of people is what I love the most in our industry. The majority of people will reach out and help others and are generally a supportive group. We need to encourage our youth and make this industry more family friendly. A lot of mums go into it and then step back when the kids start riding, so we gain some and lose some."

"There are a lot of very talented riders out there. Too many to mention and a great quality of horses coming through. Its inspiring sitting back and watching features at the NPHA and seeing trainers such as Kane Skopp, Holly & Caroline Johnson, Tash & Travis Humphries, Kyle & Kristy Mobberley ride consistently at the top over the years. It takes a lot of hard work and effort to stay at the top with those results and be consistent. They have my admiration and respect, that's for sure. Younger trainers are coming through like Matt Freiberg, Taj Carson, Lana Kelderman, and Will Hupp; they're all very talented horse people and great competitors."

Sharon says she's no expert and recognizes her weaknesses and works hard to overcome them to improve. Her honesty, asking for help and guidance contribute to her success.

Sharon would like to acknowledge the following people; "Dawn Holliday, my first western coach. Dawn helped me buy my first proper western horse, 'Winderadeen Just a Smooth Jet', and whom I still consider a mentor. Brian Cramp, for helping me in the early years and with 'Chips Sweet Rosalie'. Karen Cornish, one of the nicest, hardworking people I know, is a great mentor, friend, and competitor, always happy to lend an ear and give advice and calls a spade a spade. Elise Young, my coach and friend, a great source of knowledge and a good reality grounder as well. My hubby Josh for putting up with this all and encouraging me even when he complains about it all!"

Sharon future goals are to compete again on the East Coast hopefully at Q22 in the two year old events with her filly Elsa, if things progress well then possibly Sizzler, and Nationals and NPHA as a four-year-old. The ultimate goal/dream is to compete in the States at the Congress.

We wish her every success and will be watching to see what the future holds.

A HORSE OBSESSED GIRL
GROWING UP, THE ELDEST OF
FIVE GIRLS WHO ALL RODE, HER
CHILDHOOD WAS FILLED WITH
HORSES AND THE OUTDOORS.

ith no formal training, their experience came through trial, error and fun. Although Julie Breed didn't attend many Rodeos as a youngster, when the opportunity arose, she found herself drawn to the Barrel Racing and dreamt one day to compete. Although her career didn't start until 17, Julie has been competing for around 35 years now. She has racked up some accomplishments along the way, including the recent ABHA State Championships held in Marrabel, SA, where Julie not only won the title but placed second and third as well.







"As a young girl growing up in Nangana, Vic, I was totally obsessed with horses, and I still am today. I always loved being outdoors, and horses were my constant companion when exploring nature and playing games on the horses with my sisters. We rode them from sunrise to sunset on weekends, after school and holidays. They were involved with so much that we did around my parents' farm. We rode bareback a lot of the time, at home, in the bush, on the back roads and tracks. Sometimes we rode without bridles, with just a hayband around their withers! We didn't have much formal training when we were young; however, I was an avid reader, and I read a lot of horse books and a lot of books on reining as a teenager," recalls Julie.

"We tried things with the horses we had read, but at that time, we just wanted to have fun; we sure did have a lot of fun. We tried a lot of trick riding and had lots of accidents and just got back on; falls didn't matter that much when I was young. We also rode to Pony Club on occasions, which was about 5km from home, and I loved showjumping and cross country," Julie remembers.

Her parents rode horses, her mum only rode occasionally for pleasure, and her Dad began competing in Rodeos in the '70s. He broke in horses, worked horses for people, traded horses for Rodeo events, and the girls would assist with the workloads. "I broke in ponies, and I remember Dad would give me \$30 if I did a good job, which was rare," said Julie.

"Dad attended most of the rodeos on his own while we were young, but when we did go, I always watched the Barrel Racing. I loved watching it and dreamt about being a Barrel Racer. I started barrel training thoroughbred x quarter horses that Dad had bred for sprint racing early on in my teens. Dad established a roping club, and we would push up cattle, saddle and unsaddle horses. If we had time, we would set up a barrel course in the arena and practice after they had finished."

Julie competed in her first Rodeo at 17 years of age, placing 2nd in the Ladies Open Barrel Race on a 4-year-old homebred horse her father gave her, 'Euchre' continued to place for her consistently. Twelve months on, Julie's younger sister Barb would ride Euchre in the Junior Barrels, and Julie would compete in the Open Barrel race.

Barb went on to win 2 x Australian Jnr Barrel Racing and All Round Titles consecutively just competing in the Vic run; Julie was so proud of them. Barb never competed again due to her parents' divorce. Julie started working, and with no time for horses or competing, her younger sister Diane took over the reins of 'Euchre.' Diane also won 2 x Junior Australian Barrel Racing and All round titles on 'Euchre' another proud moment. Julie started competing again at about 22 years of age with 'Euchre' and his little brother, 'Curly'.

In February this year, the ABHA held its State Championships in Marrabel, SA. Held over two rounds of competition, Julie and 9yo Bay Stallion 'Ballistic Titan' not only set the fastest time of the day but were the eventual winners of the Open Division. Taking home a Trophy Saddle, Bob Berg Buckle and feed donated by Johnsons Formula. But it doesn't stop there. Julie also placed 2nd on 'Catman' and 3rd place on 'Elektra Remembers.'

Ballistic Titan Q-76148 (Mr Spin N Freck x Quickadee Boom) "We own 'Quickadee Boom', Titan's Dam; purchased from friends, Craig and Brenda Meinhold. I have had many successful progenies from Titan's dam with three stallions before Titan. Titan's Sire has an exceptional mind, athleticism and is one of my favourite stallions," Julie says.

"Titan has lots of natural ability like his Sire but is accident-prone, so he hasn't competed extensively. He has won a maturity, and I ran him at the last APRA NFR in Warwick when my two other horses were out; amazingly, he placed. He's a bit of a freak; when I do get to compete with him, he's incredible. He's had no accidents this year, so it's looking good for him, although I had my horrendous accident three days after winning the SA ABHA Finals in mid-February. Fracturing my right hip, and had some severe nerve, tendon, and ligament damage to the right side of my body. I worked hard mentally and physically to heal. I'm back riding and competing now, but it will take some time to get full mobility back."

"Titan is super smooth to ride, extremely intelligent, a quick learner and a willing participant. He displays intensity and focuses in a very calm manner. He is very fast, and I certainly haven't unlocked his full potential. I would love to get to some more events with him in the future to see what his possibilities could unfold."

BREEDZ CATMAN

(Morns Miss Miller x paint stallion)

"I was given Catman when he was six months old by friends. The 12-year-old Palomino gelding is 15.2hh and has Morn Deck breeding, a prevalent breed for barrel racing in Australia. He is super fast; however, I've never pushed him to his utmost. Catman won many futurities when he was younger. He isn't the most willing horse but has matured into a very consistent barrel racing horse. He excels in most heavy large open ground conditions. He placed at the big Mt Isa Rodeo when I competed there on him two years ago."



ELEKTRA REMEMBERS AX-1014

(Elgrando Four Flat x Karrung Crème De Menthe)

"12yo Bay Mare Elektra stands 14.2hh and has been my main Rodeo mount for six years. A very energetic mare with a big heart that excels in the Rodeo Arena. It's hard to get off her to ride the other horses. She is small like me, so she's a great fit. Her only weakness is heavy ground conditions. She is a low maintenance horse and would run on three legs; she is always ready to rock."

"Fitness regime for a Barrel Racing horse is a little different than the younger horses or other competition horses. I don't ride the Open Barrel horses excessively and certainly, consider recovery when training/riding. But to give a basic overview, each horse has a different program. Fitness may include some or all of the following: trail riding - this is the main activity in winter months, swimming - summer months only, mustering, roping, long trotting, sprinting, groundwork, flatwork, stretching, and jumping. They receive regular Chiropractic treatment, and I also use an Equissage machine, sound wave machine and a PEMF machine," Julie said.

Julie has been competing for around 35 years and loves the passion, devotion and dedication she sees from the horse industry. "The grace, beauty and playfulness of the horses and the ones with unique characteristics" Julie loves.

In Australia, some of the best Barrel Racing competitors Julie has seen are Ellie Gard, Steph Gard, Cherie O'Donoghue,

Adele Edwards, Katina & Calla Matthews, Wendy Caban, Leanne Caban, Elley Corney and Nichole Fitzpatrick.
