Kay Hill King was born in Texas, USA in 1966. Sired by the legendary King bred stallion, Zantanon H (a top sire of arena performers) and out of the mare, Miss Paula Kay who was by Hill King. Kay Hill King carries two crosses of King.

One of the first groups of mares imported to Australia by the Winderadeen Corporation, along with Beggar Bingo, Kay Hill King has become a major part in the foundation of the famous broodmare band at Winderadeen.

Sent out with her on the boat to Australia was her daughter by Beggar Bingo; Bingos Babe (Q-917) who became the dam of:-

- Winderadeen Just A Babe (Q-2002) – AQHA Champion.
- Shadybabe(Q-4123) – AQHA Champion and AQHA Youth Champion.
- Jet a Babe (Q-6942) – AQHA Champion, Superior Western Pleasure.
- Booms Babe (Q-6371) – Winner Sires Classic Pleasure futurity as a two year old.
- Babes Beggar (Q-15110) – AQHA Champion
- Jet Babe (Q-10371) – Dam of top 1998 Western Pleasure 2yo – Got the Blues (Q-34111).

Kay Hill King's second foal was the immortal Kay Bingo (Q-911). This mare was to take out the honour of not only winning the Champion Mare but Supreme Halter exhibit at the first ever Australian Quarter Horse Championships. A final day attendance of 6,000 with yet another 5,000 turned away from the Melbourne Showground illustrated the massive publicity campaign to present the breed to the general public. The well performed daughter of Kay Hill King looked immaculate despite, according to Phil Webb, the difficult time of year for Southern horses (July), but Kay Bingo looked every bit the champion of champions. Proving she was not only good looking, the mare partnered Tania Palmer to three National titles. Excelling in her field of Western Pleasure, Kay Bingo made a name for herself as a great ambassador for the Quarter Horse breed.

Kay Bingo joined the Winderadeen broodmare band carrying a bag full of credentials. She already had made a name for herself as a halter and performance ambassador for the breed but went on to pass on her qualities to her 14 progeny:-

- Riskay Boom (Q-15108) – High Point Horse of Australia and dam of High Point Horse of Australia – (Golden Elms Happy as Larry Q-27803).
- Bingos Profit (Q-17380) – AQHA Champion, AQHA Youth Champion, Superior Halter and Performance Horse.
- Winderadeen Mickay Boom (Q-21313) – AQHA Champion & Superior Western Pleasure.
- Winderadeen Kameo Boom (Q-26631) – AQHA Champion, Superior Western Pleasure, Special Achievement Recognition and winner of every two year old Western Pleasure Futurity in which she contested including the NPHA.
- Cagie Boom (Q-10372) – AQHA Champion, Superior Western Pleasure, Trail & Halter and High Point Horse of Australia.
- Special K (Q-6938) – Champion Youth Horse, Reserve Champion Moonbi Western Pleasure Futurity.

- Crokay (Q-12467) – AQHA Champion, Champion Youth Horse, Superior Western Pleasure & Trail.

Other progeny of Kay Hill King include:-

- Beggars General (Q-913) – Superior Western Pleasure and ambassador for the breed in Dressage and Hacking.
- Begger King (Q-1344) – National Champion in Western Riding.
- Winderadeen Billy Jean King (Q-1988) – National Champion at Halter.
- A Okay (Q-3528) – Moonbi Western Pleasure Futurity 1983
- Bo-Kay (Q-6141) – 1980 High Point Performance Horse of Australia. Runner UP High Point Trail Horse of Australia. Three times High Point Horse at the AQHA Nationals. Four times High Point Horse of the NSW State Championships. High Point Junior Horse at Queensland State Championships. High Point Junior Horse Victorian State Championships. Dam of three- time National Champion (Winderadeen Bojet Q-28057).
- Kaytee Boom (Q-10373) – dam of Yulgilbar Elegant Chick (Q-24117).

Kay Hill King was the dam of 11 progeny, eight were AQHA Point earners and two were AQHA Champions.
