For the Fielden and Jones family - Ryan, Nicole, Ty and Jett along with Dean and Julie - the journey of Miss Holly Rey Q-101378, affectionately known as Cloud, has been a story of heart, heritage and hard work. A homebred filly with deep family ties, Cloud has emerged as a standout performer in the cutting arena-backed by a team that believes in her every step of the way.

loud is out of Hollys Playn Q-46406, a mare owned by the Fieldens, and was born into a family breeding program that began just a few years ago as a shared passion. "We started breeding together as a family and it's been something really special," they say. And special it is—Cloud is one of several top-shelf siblings making waves in the sport.


Among them is Playin In The Sand Q-97476, currently in the show ring, and Playin Smooth Q-94814, who became the highest-selling mare at the 2022 Nutrien Masters. A two-year-old sister by Sanctus is being prepped for next year, and a Smooth Talkin Style filly is about to head

off to the breakers. And let's not forget her most celebrated sibling, Foo Licious Q-76808, who claimed the 2012 NCHA Open Futurity title under the guidance of trainer Phil Dawson—a major moment for the Fieldens.

A SHARED JOURNEY

Cloud is very much a family horse—not just in bloodlines but in the way her campaign is managed. "We all share the load," the Fieldens explain. "She spends time between both our farms, depending on our work schedules. It's great to do this as a family. We're incredibly proud of her, and seeing her get these results is something really special. Future plans are usually made over dinner—and maybe a drink or two!"

THE MARE WITH THE MIND

Cloud's standout quality is her unwavering consistency. "She's just a real cow pony who gets the job done," they say. "Nothing much bothers her. She's cool, calm and reliable in pressure situations." That mental toughness has made her a contender time and time again.

In the paddock and stables, Cloud is a no-fuss kind of horse. "She's kind-natured, but don't interrupt her while she's eating—that's definitely something she got from her mother," the family jokes.

DERBY DOMINATION AND AQHA GLORY

2025 has been Cloud's year to shine. She dominated at this year's 2025 Futurity, taking out two Derby titles, the Open & Non Pro. This was a moment the family describes as "the definite highlight" of her career so far. To top it off, she also earned the AQHA Open Derby Owners \$2,500 Cash Incentive, awarded to current financial AQHA members. A proud achievement for the Fieldens, and Jones Families who are long-time members of the Australian Quarter Horse Association.

"Dean, Nicole and Julie all represented Australia at Youth World Cup events in our younger years," they say. "So, to now be competing at the highest level with a homebred mare like Cloud—it's pretty special. Thank you to AQHA for your ongoing support of the sport and the breeders hehind it."

A TRAINING PATH BUILT ON TRUST

Cloud was first broken in by David Manchon in Tamworth, then spent her initial six months with Dean Holden before he moved to Yugilbar. She was then sent to Todd Graham in Tamworth to complete her training—an important step in her progression.

The results speak for themselves: top 10 in the 2024 Futurity, winner of the Amateur Futurity at the 2024 Victorian Futurity with Ryan aboard, and consistent performances throughout the southern show circuit earlier this year. She returned to Todd at Easter for her Derby preparation, which culminated in her most successful campaign to date.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

With a outstanding Derby season behind her, Cloud will continue to be shown throughout her aged event years, with embryo transfers planned along the way. Young Jett Fielden is also eager to have a go in Youth competition, bringing her journey full circle in the family.





AQHA TRAINERS PROFILE

Kane Skopp

1. Tell us briefly about yourself:

My name is Kane Skopp. I work mainly with Western Pleasure futurity and non-pro horses, and also train a handful of all-around horses for the AQHA events.

2. When did you begin training and what made you want to be a trainer?

I began training professionally in 2008 when I joined Carolyn Johnson's program in Tamworth NSW. From a young age, working with horses was all I ever wanted to do, that has driven my career ever since.

3. Which horse discipline is your passion?

I have a genuine passion for training Western Pleasure horses and I am continually striving to improve my program. I've travelled to the United States at least once a year to learn from the best in the industry. That said, I have a deep appreciation for all breeds and disciplines — I enjoy watching any horse perform at a high level and respect the dedication and skill it takes to get them there.

3. How long have you been involved in Quarter Horses?

I have been involved with QH's since primary school however didn't own one until 2002.

What and who has inspired you the most as a trainer/rider?

Becoming better at what I do every day. I'm driven by the responsibility of doing right by the horses: their health, soundness, overall well-being and understanding how they think and learn.

The trainers who have inspired me is my wife Holly and mother in law Carolyn.

How long have you been competing/training?

I showed my first futurity horse in 2010 and haven't missed a major show since!

Best advice you could give to someone starting out?

First and foremost, I'd recommend going to a major show where you can see the industry's leading horses and trainers. Spend time in the stands watching the horses and how they're presented. Look for a trainer whose horses show consistency and reflect the style you're drawn to, then don't be afraid to introduce yourself.

The AQHA community is full of people who are willing to help and point you in the right direction. Find your local affiliate, attend clinics, ask questions, and be willing to learn. Surround yourself with knowledgeable people and stay open to feedback — that's how you grow.


8. Who are the people who have helped you the most and influenced you?

Aside from Holly and Carolyn, who have both played a huge role in shaping my career, I've been fortunate to spend time with some of the top trainers in the United States. Their influence has gone beyond just training techniques — they've shared invaluable insight on breeding decisions, importing stock, and building a successful, sustainable program. I'm very grateful for the knowledge I've received along the way.

9. What is your proudest moment showing Quarter Horses so far?

One of my proudest moments was when Sumpth N Noble — the first horse I trained entirely from start to finish — won the \$20,000 2-Year-Old Western Pleasure Futurity at NPHA, which was the biggest futurity in the country at the time. That win was very special.

These days, I get enjoyment from watching our Non-Pros and Youth riders succeed. Seeing kids come through our program and grow — not just into great showmen, but into horsemen who







understand how to care for and develop a horse — is something I'm really proud of.

10. What are your future plans or goals with training & showing?

In the future, I hope to keep doing what I'm doing and continue learning how to do it better. There's always more to improve, more to understand, and I want to keep evolving for the sake of the horses and the people who trust me with them.

11. What other interests/hobbies do you enjoy or have?

I wouldn't say I have any hobbies outside of horses, but I have a lot of interest in the breeding side of the industry, it's a major part of our business. These days, most of the horses we're breeding are by imported stallions or semen and out of mares with strong imported bloodlines. Being able to travel to the U.S. and see these stallions in person, talk with trainers, and get a feel for how they produce talent, mind and structure has been very valuable.

It takes the right kind of mare to truly complement a stallion, and without doing your homework, it's easy to invest a lot of money

and end up disappointed. Understanding how to make the right crosses and produce quality, sound and trainable horses is something I really enjoy and continue to learn more about.

12. Any items in your tack room you just can't do without?

Probably a snaffle and my Chuck Letchworth short shank correctional. It's a great bit for transitioning horses as they advance in their training.

13. Hardest part of the job is:

I think the most challenging part of the job is to truly do it properly, stay competitive, care for the horses, manage clients, and maintain your property, it's a seven-day-a-week commitment. There are no office hours. Between horses and customers, you're essentially on call 24/7. Being able to remain enthusiastic without any downtime is a difficulty I think we all face.

That said, I'm grateful to do what I do every day and live the lifestyle that comes with it. As demanding as it is at times, I wouldn't want to do anything else other than training Quarter Horses.



he 2025 Ringers Western Gold Buckle Campdraft Championship delivered everything it promised and more: top-class horses, nail-biting scores, and a \$100,000 prize on the line. Thirty-two elite riders entered the final chase for the coveted Gold Buckle. Among them were some of the sport's most decorated veterans—and a few fresh faces riding in their first big final. It was also a day of deep emotion, marking the inaugural Terry Snow Memorial

Restricted Open, honouring the man whose vision built Willinga Park into the sport's most spectacular stage.

And at the heart of it all was the generous support of 4CYTE, Principal Partner of the event, whose ongoing commitment helps keep the dreams of riders, breeders and fans galloping forward. Big thanks go to them for backing one of Australia's premier campdrafting showcases.





HUGH MILES: A Champion in Full Flight

When the dust settled, it was Hugh Miles of Hugh Miles Performance Horses who stood tallest—claiming the 2025 Gold Buckle Championship aboard the exceptional Vintage Whiskey Q-81337. They entered the final just 1.5 points behind the leader. What followed was a masterclass: a blistering 91-point run (23-64-4) that sealed the title by the slimmest of margins.

Vintage Whiskey Q-81337, a registered Quarter Horse owned by Terry and Elizabeth Smith, lived up to every ounce of promise. Sired by RS Chisum Q-60660 and out of Winderadeen Whiskey Cat Q-60369, the gelding was powerful, precise and perfectly in sync with his rider. In doing so, Vintage Whiskey Q-81337 also claimed the Australian Quarter Horse Association (AQHA) Incentive Buckle, awarded to the highest-placed AQHA-registered horse under financial membership. Along with the title came a sash and rug—small tokens for a massive achievement.

And Hugh wasn't done yet. He also rode Summa Reyn Q-95700 into sixth place with a score of 178.5, one of five horses he had in the final round—a testament to both his horsemanship and his training program's depth.

The Best in the Business

Hot on Miles' heels was none other than Pete Comiskey, the three-time Gold Buckle champion (2018, 2019, 2023), who finished second with a cracking 180 on ROY (Nashvale Roy Ell Destiny). Tim Hollis and Dulkara Victoria weren't far behind, taking third place on 179.5. Troy Palmer, aboard Looks Smart in Blue, was fourth with 179.

Rounding out the top five was Evan Hiscock on Cartel (178.5), who also claimed ninth place riding Nix (177.5). His impressive showing underscored a strong family legacy—his father, Michael Hiscock, was the 2021 champion.

Saddled in Spirit The Unshakable Partnership of Jason & Moya Russell

On a quiet stretch of bushland in Queensland, where cattle graze and horses gallop under wide Australian skies, you'll find the heartbeat of an extraordinary couple: Jason and Moya Russell. Their journey through life, love, and reining has been built not only on mutual admiration but also on unwavering commitment, sweat, and more than a few shared tears in the dust of the warm-up pen.

FROM CAMPDRAFTING TO SPINS AND STOPS

Before reining, Jason Russell was no stranger to the saddle. A seasoned campdrafter with a deep respect for horsemanship, he always felt there had to be a better, softer way of riding. That answer came unexpectedly at a clinic with Ray McGee. Jason brought a paint colt, untrained in the finesse of reining, and walked away with eyes wide open.

"Ray didn't teach a lot of reining directly, but the way he moved a horse—spins, stops, rollbacks—it just lit something in me," Jason recalls. "That first clinic bit me on the bum. I was hooked."

Another defining moment came when Jason saw a video of John Wicks riding Hustlin For Chicks, known as "Teddy," at the Futurity. "That horse hit every single footprint in his circles. I watched it and thought, "That's

it. I'm in!" From that point, the pursuit of precise, disciplined, and beautiful horsemanship through reining became his passion.

MOYA'S QUIET STRENGTH

Moya's entry into reining came much later. A self-taught bush rider who once drove horses in weddings and ploughed paddocks with Clydesdales, she only began reining in 2021. But her roots with horses run deep. "I used to break in my own ponies, ride old trotters, and drive carts. I never had formal training, just a love for horses and a willingness to learn," she says.

What Moya may lack in formal reining experience, she makes up for with instinct, determination, and a deep emotional connection with her horses. Her strength lies in her quiet resolve and unshakable focus. She is methodical, observant, and thoughtful in her approach—riding with intention, always seeking to connect with the horse on its level.



A LOVE STORY IN BOOTS AND SPURS

Their love story is equally captivating. Jason met Moya through her brother's best mate, but it took a party at Moya's family farm for sparks to fly. In true Aussie fashion, Jason was initially cracking onto Moya's friend. "The penny dropped," Moya laughs. "I just knew he was the one."

They were young—Jason just 20 and Moya a year older—and they've been side by side ever since. Horses, farm life, and reining have become the fabric of their shared identity. Over the years, their property has grown into a haven for horses and cattle, where training and love go hand in hand.

Today, that bond is the foundation of a family steeped in reining and country values. Jason, a pump operator at a mine, rides after 12-hour shifts. Moya, a registered nurse on extended leave after nearly four decades of service, keeps their world running smoothly while advancing her own horsemanship.

MEET FLYNN: THE HORSE WITH HEART

Home bred, raised and trained Tellhimhesdreamin Q-99072, is the kind of horse every rider dreams of. Known around the yard simply as Flynn, this black stallion is soft, smart, and eager to work. He's the horse that waits by the gate, almost asking to be saddled up. "He's got a motor but a mind to match," Jason says proudly. "He just loves his job."

Jason and Flynn have built their bond slowly, with patience and purpose. And despite Jason's self-described tendency to overthink, particularly in the pen, he credits his progress to working with mindset coach Gil Friedman. "Gil changed everything. I used to be a mess on show day. Now, I can ride for the love of it again."

Flynn now stands at stud and represents not only Jason's growth as a trainer but the future of their breeding program. "He's everything we aim to produce—talented, quiet, trainable, and just loves his job," Jason adds. "Watching him grow and develop has been one of the most rewarding parts of this journey."

THE HIGHS, THE LOWS, AND THE LESSONS

Jason and Moya have seen it all—the wins, the flops, the unforgettable moments. One of Jason's proudest was watching Moya score a personal best on Wiggy, a mare trained by Jason but reprogrammed by Moya to suit her softer style. "We both burst into tears. It was a 69.5. That run meant more than any buckle."


And then there's the infamous hat story. "He ran (Jason) down for a stop and his hat flew off," Moya laughs. "Landed upright on the horse's rump and stayed there for the rollback. Classic."

But not every show ends in celebration. One difficult moment came when Jason patted Flynn mid-run and was penalised for it. "At the time, it was gutting," Moya says. "But we reminded ourselves: the run was brilliant. The horse was brilliant. That's what matters."

For Jason, it was a turning point. "I used to be hard on myself. But now, I focus on the ride. That day, even with the penalty, I was proud of what we'd achieved together."

RIDING TOGETHER, SEPARATELY

Jason isn't a full-time trainer—though many assume he is. He works 12-hour shifts as a pump operator in a mine,





coming home exhausted but still riding under lights late into the night. Moya, a registered nurse with nearly 40 years of experience, is currently on extended leave. Together, they manage cattle, tend to horses, and juggle daily farm life with competition prep. "Everyone thinks I'm a full-time trainer," Jason laughs. "But this is what we do after work."

While Jason rides almost daily, Moya prefers a more measured rhythm—riding only a couple of times a week, but always with clarity and calm. "I believe in quality over quantity," she says. "When I ride, I want it to matter—for me and for the horse." It's this balance of softness and intensity, restraint and readiness, that makes her a quietly powerful force in the arena and at home.

Come show day, Moya transforms. "She gets serious. Competitive. Focused. It's like another Moya comes out," Jason says proudly. At shows, Moya has become Jason's coach and second set of eyes, offering calm observation and technical insight. It's a dynamic that works—because they've learned how to give each other space and support.

A LEGACY OF PRIDE

Their story isn't just about themselves. Their son Caleb, once a fierce competitor, is currently focused on his young family and career—but the fire is still there. Their daughter Shae has a gentler connection to horses, preferring trail rides to trophies. With four grandchildren already and another on the way, the next chapter of the Russell legacy is just beginning. "If we can show them what hard work, love, and good horsemanship look like," Moya says, "we've done our job."

What do Jason and Moya hope people feel when they watch them ride?

For Moya, it's about possibility. "I want people to think, 'If she can do it, I can too.' I started late, I'm still learning—and I'm having the time of my life."

For Jason, it's about impact. "I want people to see the horseman behind the horse. Someone who's kind, who builds confidence, and who rides with respect."

When asked to sum up what reining means to them in one word?

Jason doesn't hesitate: "Addictive."

Moya smiles: "*Proud*." because they've learned how to give each other space and support.

TRUE TO THE REINING AUSTRALIA RIDE

As the sun sets over their bushland property, Jason and Moya Russell remain more than competitors or breeders—they are quiet champions of dedication, humility, and love for the long ride.

Their journey reminds us that success in the arena is never just about scores, spins, or stops—it's about the bond between horse and human, the strength of partnership, and the legacy left behind with every hoofprint in the dirt. For Jason and Moya, the ride continues—steady, soulful, and always side by side.

MAKING INFORMED DECISIONS WHEN

BREDING





BREEDING YOUR MARE - WAITING FOR THAT BEAUTIFUL FOAL TO BE BORN - HOW FANTASTIC WILL THIS BE

A FEW IMPORTANT ITEMS TO CHECK FOR THE STALLION:

Does the **IBF** box have **YES?** If not, then the stallion has not be recognised by the AQHA as a breeding sire and means that you could have a problem with your foal being registered, you can check with the AQHA Office 02 6762 6444, the stallion may be in the process of having its IBF completed.

Is the current owner a financial member of the AQHA and therefore eligible to lodge breeding returns for this stallion? Check with the AQHA as above.

GENETIC TESTS FOR HORSES

What are the genetic tests results showing for this stallion and does your mare have genetic results on file also if any of the following tests are applicable.

The below is lengthy but it is important that you are kept informed and can make your own decisions on breeding.

HERDA: Hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia is an inherited skin condition that is characterized by hyperextensible skin, scarring and sever lesions along the back of affected horses.

 Horses with N/N genotype will not have hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia and cannot transmit this hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia variant to their offspring.

- Horses with **N/HRD** genotype will not be affected by hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia, but are carriers. They may transmit this hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia variant to 50% of their offspring.
- Matings between two carriers result in a 25% chance of producing an affected foal.
- Horses with HRD/HRD genotype will have hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia. These horses are not registerable with the AQHA.

OLWS (LWO): Lethal white overo is a genetic disorder that results from two copies of the version of the gene causing the frame overo coat colour pattern.

- Horses with N/N genotype will not have the overo pattern and cannot transmit this lethal white overo variant to their offspring.
- Horses with N/CAR (N/O) genotype will have the overo pattern and are carriers. They may transmit this lethal white overo variant to their offspring.
- Matings with N/N horses will result in a 50% chance of producing an overo foal.
- Matings with between two carriers will result in a 25% chance of producing a lethal white foal.
- Horses with O/O genotype will have LWO, a condition incompatible with life.

HYPP: Hyperkalemic periodic paralysis (HYPP) is characterized by sporadic attacks of muscle tremors (shaking or trembling), weakness, and/or collapse. Attacks can also be accompanied by loud breathing noises resulting from paralysis of the muscles of the upper airway. Occasionally, sudden death can occur following a severe paralytic attack, presumably from heart failure or respiratory muscle paralysis.

Manifestation of clinical signs of HYPP depends on many factors including stress, diet, and changes in exercise. Some horses may manifest severe signs of the disease while others exhibit little or no signs.

• Horses with **N/N** genotype will not have hyperkalemic periodic paralysis and cannot transmit this hyperkalemic periodic paralysis variant to their offspring.

• Horses with **N/H** genotype can display episodes of hyperkalemic periodic paralysis and are **Carriers**. They may transmit this hyperkalemic periodic paralysis variant to 50% of their offspring.

 Horses with H/H genotype can display episodes of hyperkalemic periodic paralysis and typically are more severely affected. They will transmit this hyperkalemic periodic paralysis variant to all of their offspring.

 HYPP carriers are not registerable with the AQHA unless spayed or gelded.

PSSM1: Horses with Type 1
Polysaccharide Storage Myopathy (PSSM1)
have a muscle disease characterized by accumulation
of abnormal complex sugars (glycogen) in skeletal muscles.
The accumulation of abnormal sugars can cause breakdown
of muscle fibers (rhabdomyolosis) which leads to muscle pain,
weakness, skin twitching, sweating, and reluctance to move.

- Horses with N/N genotype will not have type 1
 Polysaccharide Storage Myopathy and cannot
 transmit the PSSM1 variant to their offspring.
- Horses with N/PSSM1 genotype will have the PSSM1 variant and may show signs of type 1 disease. Horses with this genotype may transmit the PSSM1 variant to 50% of their offspring.
- Horses with PSSM1/PSSM1 genotype are homozygous for the PSSM1 variant and may be more severely affected than N/PSSM1 horses. Horses with this genotype will transmit the PSSM1 variant to all of their offspring.

MH: Malignant hyperthermia (MH) is an inherited disease in which affected horses can be triggered by halogenated

anesthetics, succinylcholine, stress, or excitement, which can induce a hyper-metabolic state characterized by symptoms including muscle contracture, elevated temperature, and an irregular heart rhythm.

- Horses with N/N genotype will not have malignant hyperthermia and cannot transmit this malignant hyperthermia variant to their offspring.
- Horses with N/MH genotype will be affected by malignant hyperthermia. They can transmit this malignant hyperthermia variant to their offspring. Matings with N/N genotype will result in a 50% chance of producing a malignant hyperthermia-affected foal.
- Horses with **MH/MH** genotype will have malignant hyperthermia.

GBED: Glycogen branching enzyme deficiency (GBED) is a fatal genetic disorder that results from the inability to correctly store glycogen in several organs of the body.

 Horses with N/N genotype will not have glycogen branching enzyme deficiency and cannot transmit this glycogen branching enzyme deficiency variant to their offspring.

Horses with N/GED genotype will not be affected by glycogen branching enzyme deficiency, but are carriers. They may transmit this GBED variant to 50% of their offspring.

 Matings between two carriers result in a 25% chance of producing a GBED-affected foal.

• Horses with **GBED/GBED** genotype will have glycogen branching enzyme deficiency, a fatal condition.

MYHM: Myosin-heavy chain myopathy (MYHM) is a muscle disease that results in two distinct clinical disease presentations, immune-mediated myositis (IMM) and non-exertional rhabdomyolysis. Both presentations involve muscle loss or damage and are linked to the same genetic variant.

- Horses with N/N genotype will not have increased susceptibility for a myosin-heavy chain myopathy and cannot transmit the MYHM variant to their offspring.
- Horses with N/My genotype may develop a myosin heavy chain myopathy. They may transmit this MYHM variant to 50% of their offspring. Matings to horses with the N/N genotype will result in a 50% chance of producing a foal that may develop myosin-heavy chain myopathy.
- Horses with My/My genotype may develop a more severe form of a myosin-heavy chain myopathy. They will transmit this MYHM variant to all of their offspring.





INTER CARE DFEEDING

COOLER WEATHER MAKES WINTER A FAVOURITE TIME FOR HORSES. WITH NO FLIES, MIDGES, OR ITCHY SWEATING, HORSES CAN RUN FREE AND SOAK UP THE WINTER SUN!

Cool temperatures mean less stress and more time in the 'thermoneutral zone' (TNZ), the temperature range in which horses do not need to sweat or shiver. The TNZ varies with age, gender, breed, weather, exercise, and feed.

the temperature drops below 0°C for a weanling and - 15°C for an adult horse. The colder the air, the more heat they lose. However, the heat generated by digestion and movement helps them stay warm, so they only start shivering when it gets extremely cold.

PROVIDE PLENTY OF ROUGHAGE/FORAGE

To help horses stay warm in winter, provide plenty of roughage. Hay or pasture is best, and oats can also play a role in certain situations. High-fibre feeds produce body heat when fermented by hindgut bacteria, generating heat

ypically, horses don't shiver until: and nutrients for the horse. High-starch feeds, such as corn molasses and sweet feeds, do not generate this fermentative heat and do not make your horse 'hot'-they can increase energy and excitability but do not generate significant core body heat. You may notice your horses eating more hay as the weather cools down because this helps them stay warm from the body heat generated during digestion.

> The most efficient way to keep horses warm during winter is to feed more highly-digestible hay, at 2-2.5% of body weight, in a ratio of 50-60% lucerne and 40-50% grassy/oaten hay. Beet pulp can also be a beneficial source of fibre. When the weather is wet and windy as well, energy needs increase by 40-50%, and some



oats may be useful, but not more than 1-2kg per meal. Always start with a small amount and increase slowly to allow the gut bacteria time to adapt to the increased starch.

Yearling horses fed a high-quality diet free-choice can tolerate temperatures as low as -11°C with no ill effects. In cold weather, feeding good-quality hay free-choice is the simplest way to ensure that the horse meets its energy requirements.

BRAN MASH AND OIL

A warm bran mash is traditionally used for its laxative effect and is a great way to give horses a treat on cold nights. However, loose manure the day after a bran mash is due to the sudden change in diet, which irritates the gut wall and compromises the bacteria in the large intestine. Bran should be restricted to less than 10% of the diet, as it contains nine times as much phosphorus as calcium. An occasional bran mash is not harmful, but a separate calcium supplement may be necessary. High phosphorus and low calcium and minerals in grain can unbalance the

diet, especially for young, pregnant, or working horses - a well-balanced concentrate, based on vegetable protein meals, vitamins, and minerals, will correct the imbalances.

Increasing the oil in the diet is another safe and effective way of increasing energy, especially for working and performance horses.

IMPACTION COLIC & WATER ACCESS

Impaction colics are more common in winter, partly because mature hay and pasture have a lower water content than young pastures, but also because horses drink less if the water is below 2°C.

If your winter brings ice and snow, make sure clean, fresh water is available. Horses have to consume ten times their water requirement in snow conditions to meet their needs, and they need to use energy to raise the temperature of the snow to body temperature. This is a huge energy drain and, when hay is poorly digestible, can lead to gut impaction colic.

BODY CONDITION

Keep an eye on 'easy keepers' who can quickly accumulate body fat as they adapt to the cold. Energy requirements decrease as they get used to winter weather, and in no time can get too forward in condition, especially as the weather warms into spring, energy demands decrease, and pasture growth resumes.

FEEDING TIPS

Also, keep a special watch on timid horses. Groups of horses typically have a pecking order for feed and space, and timid horses can become thin, even if plenty of feed is available, because the dominant horses in the group won't allow them to eat. Ensure enough individual feeding space (3–15 meters between horses) is available for the horses in the group. Using feed bins rather than placing feed on the ground can reduce feed wastage by 25%. Always make sure a good quality, well-formulated salt and mineral block is available.

Enjoy the cooler weather and remember, every horse is different. Keep a watchful eye on body condition and growth, and enjoy watching your horses love the cooler weather.





ell Mingo came from a long line of champion performance Quarter Horses. He is by the 1950 born bay sire, Poco Dell, who was an AmQHA champion, holding Superior Performance, Superior Halter, High Point Performance and Register of Merit (ROM) Arena. Dell Mingo is out of a 1958 grey mare, Dusty Pat Star. Both her sire (Pat Star Jr) and dam (Browns Dusty) were successful performance horses. Jimmie Randals of Montoya in New Mexico, USA was one of that country's most successful young breeders at the time of breeding Dell Mingo.

By nature, Dell Mingo was very quiet, and while still in the USA was used by the Randal's 11 year old son for a youth activity program, winning a number of Grand Champions.

Dell Mingo arrived in Australia in 1968 with Eddie and Sue Wilson who settled at Bendemeer, NSW and established the New Frontier Stud which became the home of Dell Mingo for the rest of his life.

Dell Mingo became one of the most travelled Quarter Horse



stallions in the country as Eddie Wilson devoted himself to showing as many Australians as possible the remarkable attributes of the Quarter Horse. Dell Mingo was hauled all over the eastern States and into South Australia. He soon became recognised as a horse of good temperament, with cattle ability and a horse that had something to contribute to the working horse bloodlines in Australia. His list of competition events is wide; campdrafting, cutting, working cow horse, roping, reining, barrel racing, halter, western pleasure, trail class and even endurance. His speciality was cutting. Often at shows, Eddie would miss Mingo, only to find his son, Stacey, giving the local children free rides. This remarkable temperament came through in his progeny.

Dell Mingo's record as a performance horse speaks for itself. With the AQHA he achieved some significant awards:

Keith and Judy Button, living at Bendemeer, went to see what this new breed Quarter Horse stallion, which had come to their district, was all about. Keith recalls that he was "solidly built, but by comparison, didn't have the heavy hindquarter of the King Ranch horses of that time". They were impressed and Keith quickly responded by selecting two of his best station mares and returned to New Frontier to deal with Eddie for services for the two mares. The resulting two foals, according the Keith, completely converted him to the Quarter Horse breed. It is believed many more AQHA members have been converted to the Quarter Horse breed by this stallion.

The Wilson's returned to the USA in 1975 and sold the stud to Keith and Judy Button. With it they acquired the stallions Dell Mingo and his stable mate Ann's Hollywood, Q-183. From knowing nothing about this new breed from the USA, Keith became very involved as Vice-President of the AHQA. He also served as President of the National Cutting Horse Association and finally as the Executive Officer of the Australian Bushmen's Campdraft and Rodeo Association (ABCRA).

Dell Mingo obtained the National Cutting Horse Certificate of Merit, Certificate of Ability and was inducted into the NCHA Hall of Fame in 1994.

ust to mention the word "versatility" to the Western enthusiasts of the late 1970's and during the 1980's, and they would respond with one word – "RADOO".

Owned and ridden by the Schiller family, RADOO was soon to gain the reputation as an allrounder.

Not only was he a great competitor, but he was part of the family. It was not unusual to see both Schiller boys hop on his back with no saddle or bridle and do a neat reining run around the arena at the end of the day's showing.

They would then slide off him and RADOO would follow them to his stall on the showgrounds.

1999 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

PETER L. BAILLIEU

The Australian Quarter Horse Association honours PETER L. BAILLIEU with induction into the Hall of Fame.


eter Baillieu's involvement with Quarter Horses stemmed from his position at King Ranch as General Manager. Always having a great appreciation for top class horseflesh (which he never lost), he saw the benefits of this new breed of horse in Australia. King Ranch imported the first Quarter Horses to Australia and had a major influence on the breed for many years.

A small number of enthusiastic Quarter Horse devotees met at various times, with Peter Baillieu as chairman, forming the Australian Quarter Horse Association in 1964. Peter Baillieu, along with Sir Rupert Clarke, Mr. Sam Hordern, Mr. Martin Lemann, Mr. Jack Reilly and Mr. and Mrs Baillieu & Sarah Myer became the six permanent Council Members on 31st December, 1967.

Peter Baillieu stood as President of the AQHA from 1964 to 1968, and, although he was not actively involved with the breed in his later years, his interest in the Association never waned. In his earlier years, Peter rode quite a lot. One of his favourite mounts was King Ranch Elect, a gelding that was the High Point Horse at the first AQHA National Championships.

Peter Baillieu was a man of great foresight and possessed extraordinary management skills which he imparted to the AQHA in its creation. The solid foundation laid down in the Constitution and the creation of the Stud Book and Registry would be in no small part due to his expertise and involvement.

When he opened the new AQHA owned office building in Tamworth in 1995, Peter Baillieu expressed his pleasure at the growth of this Association and its influence on the horse scene in this country.



Peter's life became more hectic later on as he sat on the Boards of many large businesses which included Westpac, Prudential, Stanbroke Pastoral Co. and Incitec.

Peter was married to Edwina Hordern and had a son Peter, and two daughters, Anna Jane and Marina. His untimely death on 22nd October, 1998 was unexpected and sudden.

The AQHA owes a lot to the creative ability of a man like Peter L. Baillieu, one of the founders of the AQHA and our first President.





