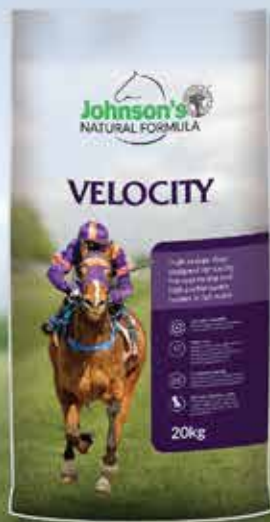

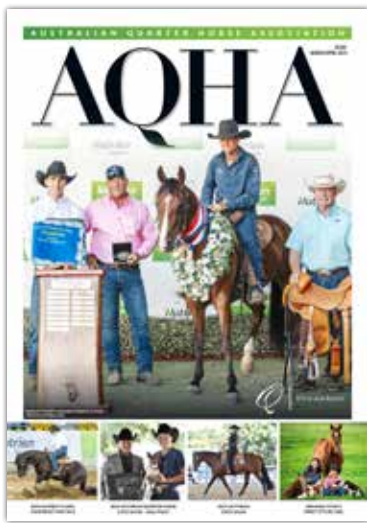

As a part of this I want to compliment the video with articles in the AQHA magazine, such as workout examples, exercises specific to our classes and so on. We are working hard to have this done in time for people to enter/be prepared for Nationals.

SHOWS AND BREEDING - FLIRT HAS PROVEN HER TALENTS!**

'When I was 10yo we went on our first and last big holiday to NSW. While there, our parents booked my brother and me into a Trick Riding Clinic. Although my brother was the athletic one with no fear, I loved it!! Once home, but with no idea how, we began training our mustering horses to become trick riding horses. Mum would spend hours at the arena so we could get some horses 'trained'. My brother decided it was too 'girly' to continue, so it just became me. Along the way I had a few friends join and we did some performances around local shows and rodeos.

At 13, with my parents help, I broke-in my first pony, Leroy. We helped with mustering around the property, and later, went campdrafting. Unable to forget Trick Riding, I soon started doing tricks on him. Leroy was kind and patient. Year 11 work experience saw me work for trainer, Scott Finlayson, near Rockhampton. I'm so grateful that Scott gave me the opportunity to work with trained Liberty horses, and learn the basics. It really inspired me and I began Liberty training with my horses.

My Mum bought an AQHA 2yo filly, called Sweet Stylish Girl Q-81783, a sensitive soul. I fell in love with the filly, happily reimbursing Mum for the purchase. I called her Flirt, broke her in and carefully commenced her training, which included Liberty, and she's proved to be very intelligent.'

LIBERTY AND VERSATILITY!

Today, Flirt's is one of my main Liberty horses. Flirt has helped fulfil my dream of performing Liberty Roman Riding, sharing the spotlight with my other horse, Scooter. Together, these two horses perform wonderfully. Flirt also excels in the Rearing trick. Being a Quarter Horse, she has the muscle, power and energy to get the height she does. I think it's actually her favourite trick in our Liberty Shows!

Although Flirt's a performance horse, I use her for mustering and allow my family to ride her. This time out of the arena helps keep her mind right. Depending on what event is coming up and how sassy she's feeling, I'll work her specifically on the task at hand prior. I keep things simple, never expecting daily perfect performances. When the performance dates get closer I can sometimes get frustrated, but if everything's always perfect, there's nothing to improve upon. Flirt has sometimes been a challenge, as she can be a little sassy and quirky— but she makes a performance interesting, and I do like a good challenge!

During our Liberty Shows, I think that most of the spectators are pretty impressed with how the horses perform. After we have performed, we take the horses for a walk around the perimeter of the arena. Many of the kids lean over the fence, and love being able to get up close to the horses. Of course, we stop often, so they do get the chance to pat them.

It's hard to express the amount of overall time it takes to get the horses show ready, but I do often receive some very positive feedback about the connection I have with my horses.

2023 saw us perform our Liberty Shows in Queensland, at Gympie, Roma, Rockhampton and down to the Sunshine Coast, and Brisbane, for Eatons and Sandstone Rodeos. As a business, we also hold clinics, mainly for kids to gain confidence and build a relationship with their horses. We were lucky enough to be involved with a number of Pony

Clubs during 2023, and we also got to perform alongside Guy McLean! We were so thankful for that opportunity, as Guy's achieved so much in the equine industry, and it was thrill!

I love that Flirt's developed into such a versatile horse. We've not only competed in Challenges and Campdrafts, but also in Two-handed Cutting, at the Monto Cutting Club. Flirt moves with elegance, but definitely won't let a cow get away, whether we're mustering or competing in Campdrafting. I love how quick she can be when required, and how she'll also slow down easily and work a cow in the Two-handed Cuttings, which we have actually placed quite well in. She accepts anything I throw at her, and we both have great fun competing. When it comes to working with any of our horses, I treat them all the same way, meaning most of my horses end up doing a bit of everything.

At 4yo Flirt strained a tendon, with no hope given that she'd ever be a riding horse again. I later put her in foal and she had the most beautiful filly, now a 3yo, currently in Cutting

training. Thankfully, after a year and a half of recuperation, Flirt did recover, and it was an amazing feeling to be riding her again. She felt fantastic, athletic and ready to get to work again! I love Flirt so much, I even bought her dam, Playgirl Reysn! I bred her back to One Stylish Pepto, resulting in another filly I named Squirt! Now a 2yo, Squirt has just been started under saddle!

So, while enjoying competing and performing with Flirt at our Liberty Shows, I'm looking forward to the future of Flirt's filly and Flirt's little sister! Not only do I plan on competing in events with them, but we'll also be adding them to our Liberty team!

At present, I've moved back home while I finish my studies, so I'm training all of my horses from there. Days off are spent helping to muster. Unknowingly, Dad kindly donates some of his weaners for training horses, but I suspect he's already worked that out!

I'm so grateful to have my family's support, and thank them from the bottom of my heart. No matter how big my horse dreams, I'd especially like to thank Mum for always being so supportive, encouraging and helping out. Thanks also goes to Jordan Fox, my mate, talented offsider, and a performer & business partner in our Liberty Shows, under the new name of Sweet Sol Horsemanship.'

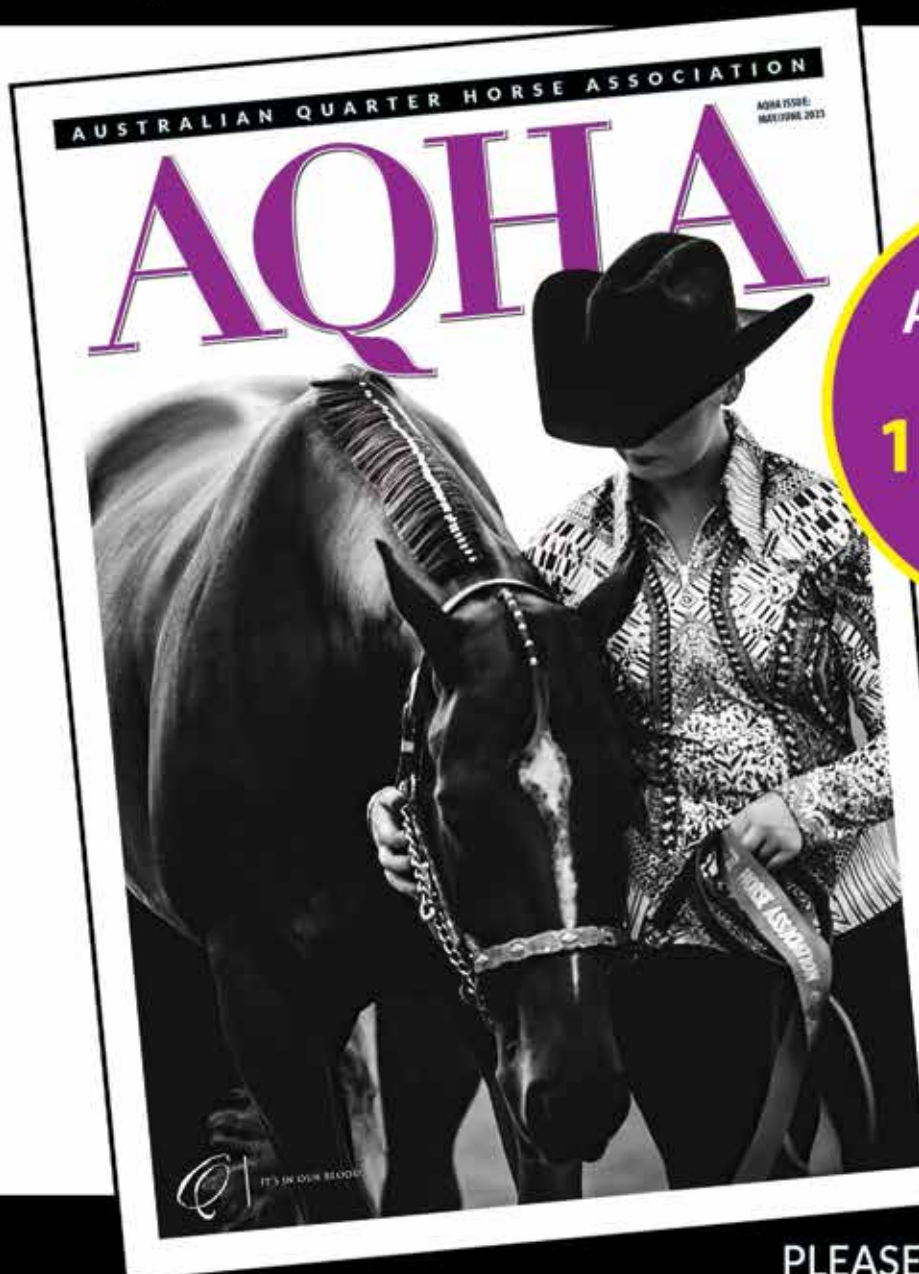

PERFORMANCE HORSE INDUSTRY HOLDS STRONG AT 2024 NUTRIEN CLASSIC

With the heat and dust on day one, and then giving way to rain on day ten. The 'mini-city' that amassed Tamworth's AELEC for the ten days disbands, we reflect on what was yet another positive outcome at the 2024 Nutrien Classic Campdraft & Sale.

Nutrien Equine are delighted with the 17th Nutrien Classic Sale results, which were in line with current economic markets and a reduction in horse numbers due to wet conditions preventing numerous vendors from attending the 2024 event. The strength in statistics is a true testament to the commitment and resilience of the industry and its members.

The level of competition at the Nutrien Classic is undoubtedly improving every year – with 2024 seeing some of the best performances from hundreds of competitors and horses throughout the week.

Monday night saw the first final, the Prydes Easifeed Australian Performance Horse Challenge with the 10th trophy trailer donated by long term sponsors Peel & Jody Tribe of Navaho Trailers. Warming up with the annual Happy Hour sponsored by Coverdrive Promotions, spectators were full of anticipation as they prepared for a showcase of some of the best hands in the industry.

It was, as always, excruciatingly close in the end – with the wet work element of runs proving a true leaderboard decider – but it was the quality combination of Leah Read and LETHAL KING COLE Q-94012, leaders of the field heading into the final, who claimed victory with a stunning 174 point performance (a breathtaking 90 point Dry Work showcase and 84 for Wet Work)! They topped the scoreboard with an Aggregate score of 341.5.

The Young sire by NRR Cat King Cole Q-90230, out of Tassas Lethal Spin Q-78199 and owned by the “Challenge Syndicate” (a powerhouse partnership between Peter Shakespeare, Matthew Crane & Leah) was described by Peter Shakespeare as a “legend in the making”. An accurate description for the young sire who was purchased back in 2021 as a 2-year-old colt for \$80,000 from breeder and vendor Brydie Hughes.

On Tuesday we saw the final round of the Prydes Easifeed Champion Rider Title –the National Campdraft Council of Australia (NCCA) event hotly contested by some of the most competitive Campdrafters from around Australia.

It was a nervous wait until the last rider in the draw - legendary Ben Hall on CHISUMS CASH Q-76877, to determine which team would win the Aggregate and the major cash prize for their chosen charity. Ben and his roan RS Chisum mare put one around for 82 points, enough to bring home the win for the Australian Campdraft Association (ACA) team whose charity of choice is the Common Ground Foundation. Congratulations to all member organisations and competitors, this event provided another 3 rounds of excellent Campdraft viewing and for a great cause.

The rain did not deter a crowd gathering on the hill for the first of numerous Campdraft event finals on Wednesday afternoon, where the Coverdrive Gelding Incentive kicked things off at 6pm. This feature event exhibited the top 15 geldings from the Classic Campdraft, who competed for a total prizepool of over \$8,000.

It was a tightly contested final and in the end, came down to a run-off between Mitchell Hoy on Mick & Lenore Cole's horse and Will Durkin.

However it was the Guyra competitor Mitchel Hoy who claimed victory, with another 88 point run guaranteeing the \$5,000 winners cheque thanks to Coverdrive Promotions who operate the popular bar services at AELEC.

The Campdraft arena feats continued in the hotly contested 4CYTE Charlie Maher Young Guns final running as the last event of Day 6. Always a popular occasion, the final did not disappoint spectators with 33 young talents demonstrating some of the best Campdrafting of the week yet.

There were a phenomenal three scores each of 90 and 91 through the field, but it was a spectacular 92 point run from Fergus Friend, a competitor from Mt Garnett in Queensland, which clinched the title - a fine show of horsemanship. Riding their family owned horse, Fergus added to a 90 from Round 1 to claim victory with an Aggregate of 182.

Fergus also impressed on his second finalist ride - another Nutrien Classic graduate in horse, placing =5th! This mare was purchased at the 2020 Nutrien Classic from Craig Ervine & Sue Kirkby, the Tarraway Partnership, for \$17,000. Congratulations - an amazing achievement and fantastic to see the Friend family achieving such great results with their Classic purchases.

Another afternoon of Campdraft finals excitement kicked off on Thursday with the Jimmy Matthews Memorial Ladies Dash for Cash, featuring the top lady riders from this weeks events competing for an impressive prizepool. The winner was a popular one, in the Walcha horsewoman Laura McNaughton who rode her husband horse for 89 points - a beautiful run.



The Martins Stock Haulage Open Campdraft Final was also exciting viewing, with the top five combinations coming into the final with only 3 points between them. It came down to a run-off but reigning champion Will Durkin on Evan & Kim Acton's talented mare continued an absolutely trail blaze of big scores throughout each stage of this event to claim the title. Another incredible 91-point run secured the win, with a total of 364. Across three rounds, their scores were 92-91-91! Spectacular Campdrafting and a great result for long-term Classic supporters Evan & Kim, from Millungera Station in north-west Queensland.

The last and most anticipated event of Thursday night was the Nutrien Classic Campdraft Final - the main incentive event and one that all buyers come to win. The crowd was electric up on

the hill, as spectators watched some of the most exciting young Australian performance horses at work.

It was fantastic viewing throughout the field, but it was one of the industry's best in Mark Buttsworth aboard HARD CURRENCY Q-99043 (Hard Hat Henry x Yulgilbar Bails Cachet) owned by Dave Kennedy of Copabella Quarter Horses, who claimed victory with a spectacular 91-point run.

This win is a special one for Dave, who enjoyed watching his gelding compete in both the Classic and Challenge finals - under TWO jockeys, Mark Buttsworth and his protégé Paxton Pulford! HARD CURRENCY Q-99043 was a sentimental (and surprise) purchase at last year's sale - Dave claims he did not expect to buy a horse last year.

The gelding's sire in HARD HAT HENRY Q-67747 was owned by Dave and sadly lost prematurely in 2016, and he couldn't resist taking home one of his progeny to bring back for the 2024 incentive events. A worthwhile decision.

HARD CURRENCY Q-99043 was in fact sold by Dave in this year's Classic Sale, fetching \$40,000 in the sale ring on Thursday morning - one of the highest priced geldings of the day. He heads to the McClymonts of Hughenden, Queensland, to continue his Campdraft career - which is quickly proving illustrious.

With sales negotiations still underway, the 2024 Nutrien Classic Sale has generated over \$12 million for the Australian performance horse industry. From 554 horses offered for sale, 87.73% sold for an overall average of \$25,067.

There was good demand for proven female lines again this year, with a range of quality mares and fillies bringing an average of \$32,563. Lot 496 was the star of the show as top price mare and lot of the sale, selling for \$180,000 to Ben & Rae Hill of Thallon, Queensland.

She was presented by the talented horseman Will Durkin on behalf of Terry & Christine Hall, who have been returning vendors at the Nutrien Classic Sale since its inception in 2008.

Terry & Christine also celebrated an Australian-first milestone during this years event, with their sire "Hazelwood Conman FS-22426" reaching a remarkable \$10 million in progeny sold through the Nutrien Classic and Masters Sales. Amongst these has been more than 10 progeny winners of events at the Nutrien Classic, from Campdrafts to Challenges. An amazing achievement for a sire who has certainly cemented himself as a legend of the industry.



Conman genetics were a common theme amongst other top prices of the 2024 sale, with Lot 292, the 3-year-old filly on account of Will Durkin the runner up sale topper. The black mare by Hazelwood Conman FS-22426 boasts proven genetics on both sides and was purchased by the Trustee for the Moy family for \$160,000.

The gelding market grossed more than \$4.4 million and averaged over \$17,807, with 251 notable lots sold. Top priced gelding was sold on Sunday at Lot

538 - HALO SPRINGS ROMERO A2-3746 on account of Tsidkenu Pty Ltd. The beautifully presented 4-year-old gelding sold for \$92,500 to Sasha Mylrea.

22 stallions sold averaged \$35,318, topped by Lot 285 CALL ME DADDY Q-101277 – an impressive 2-year-old colt sold by a local vendor who has had a lot of success at the Nutrien Classic in Holly Clayden.

CALL ME DADDY Q-101277 is one of the first Call Me Mitch Q-94942 progeny in Australia and out of open winning mare Moore Park One Moore Rose Q-74531. He sold to WEC Industries Pty Ltd for \$80,000 and was well presented by Ben O'Reilly.

This year's Nutrien Classic was attended by competitors, vendors, purchasers and spectators from every corner of Australia and beyond. The livestream was viewed from countries including the US, Canada, New Zealand, UK, and Hong Kong. Over 1200 bid cards were registered, one of the highest levels of interest ever seen from buyers.

Nutrien Equine would like to extend thanks to staff, sponsors, cattle donors and vendors for their hard work in preparation for the sale and traders, spectators,

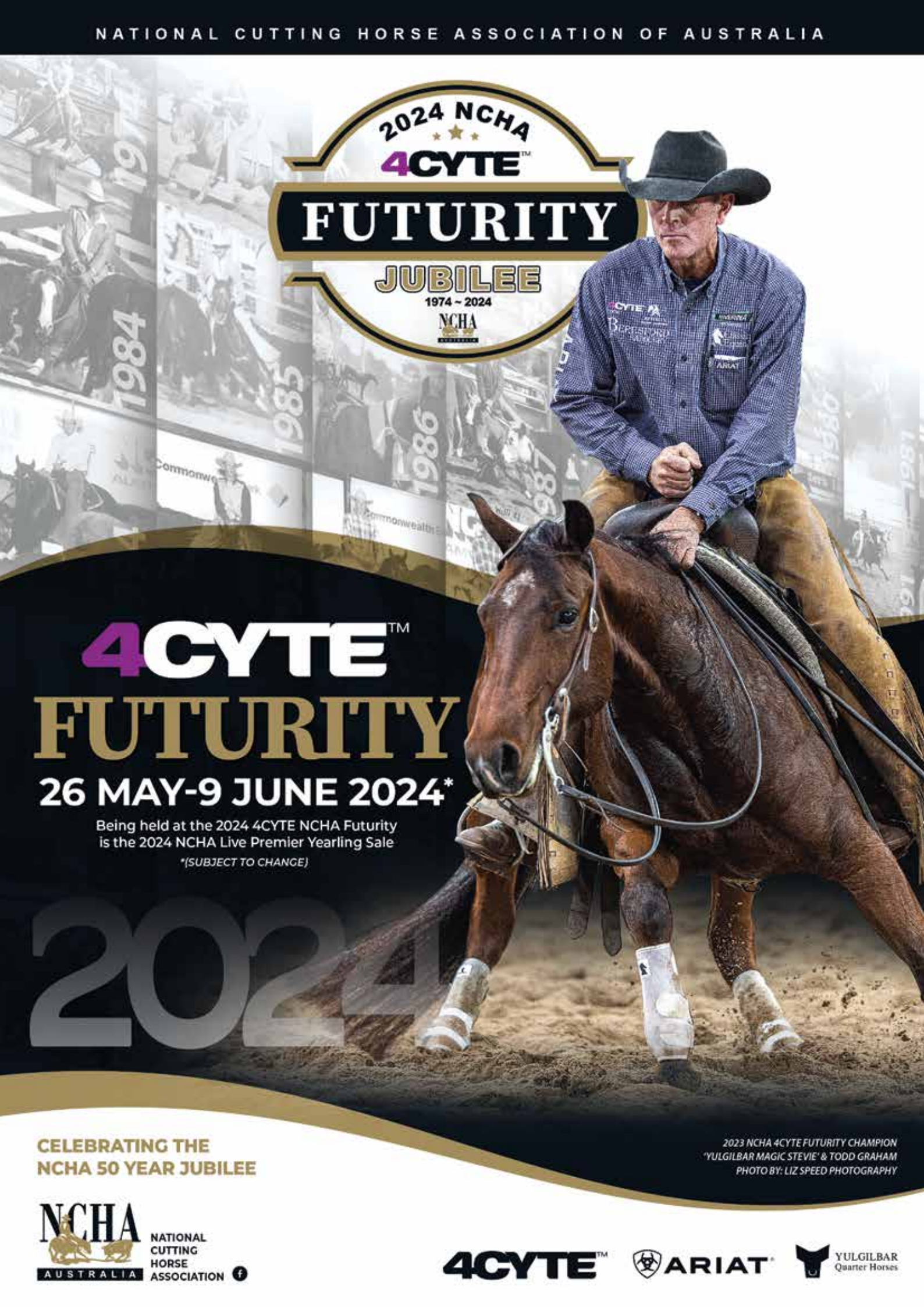

TRAVELLING WITH HORSES

Being away with your horse is just like being at home, right?

Wrong!

Horses can be fussy or easy going, some travel well, some throw everything at you while you are away. The calmest of horses may find something they don't like in their new environment, including the horse that they get stabled next to.

You should do your best to be prepared for all situations, whilst not exceeding your GVM limit and bringing your entire stable and tack shed. That is a skill in itself.

There are some must pack items that will make the trip more comfortable for you and your horse.

Australian Summers are very hot. Competitions are more likely to be cancelled due to extreme weather, these days, however I have been away from home competing and the weather dialled up to low 40's. It was horrendous for humans and horses. It is not usually possible to pack up and leave, as travelling in that type of heat is unbearable for the horse.

Horses may refuse to drink the local water. Even if at home they are good drinkers, sometimes the taste of the water is unpalatable and even dehydration can't convince them to drink it.

Bring a minimum of 20L of water from home

A horse that wont drink can become seriously ill, very quickly in hot temperatures. A loss of 10% or more of body water can lead to severe dehydration, collapse and death.

In hot weather or hard exercise a horse requires 10-15L per 100kg body weight of water per day.

Some people prepare by adding molasses or flavoured electrolytes to the water. These are introduced for a week before the trip. I don't recommend molasses as it can add to the dehydration status of your horse. Molasses is also at risk of fermenting in the hot weather due to the high sugar content. This will produce toxic mould growth, following on to toxicity and colic if consumed by the horse.

Bring at least 20 litres of water from home, or more if you can safely carry it, and slowly introduce the new water to the horse.

Put a small bucket of water in the stall from home, along with the new water in a big bucket. Bit by bit they will change over to the new water.

Having two buckets in the stall reduces the likelihood of you coming back in the morning to find manure floating in their water or that they have knocked over one bucket and have been unable to drink for hours.



Symptoms of Electrolyte imbalance

- Diarrhoea
- Excessive sweating
- Exhaustion
- Slow recovery post work
- Muscular tissues tying up
- Dehydration

Another important item to pack is a something to settle the gut. Travelling, the actual float trip, plus being away from their paddock buddies can give horses higher levels of stress. Signs of stress are not always externalised as bad, anxious or nervous behaviour. Stress can sometimes shut the horse down or cause digestive issues.

Stress causes high levels of cortisol. Excess cortisol causes digestive issues and so the vicious cycle begins. Settle the gut and you can usually settle the stress.

Competition Recovery

- Check for swelling in legs. Hard exercise, followed by restricted movement can cause the lower limbs to swell
- Look for stiffness and tightness in muscles
- Check the horse over for bites or scratches
- Make sure there is sufficient shavings or bedding in the stall so that the horse can lie down and be comfortable.
- Provide down time for your horse. Make sure you don't over handle them at the show. They need time to relax and unwind, just like we do.

When it comes to rehydrating the horse's cells and for muscle tissue repair, it is important to have Electrolytes on hand.

Electrolytes will re-establish the imbalance caused by the losses from excessive sweating an hard work. Look for an electrolyte with no flavours, fillers or additives. Use one that contains tissue salts that can be absorbed directly into the bodies cells.

Electrolytes should contain Calcium, Magnesium, Potassium, Chloride, Sodium, Iron, and Zinc

Check list for gut health

- Listen for gut sounds in all four quadrants. Know what is normal for your horse before you leave home.
- Output of manure, make sure it is on a par with normal output of between 4-12 piles per day.
- Consistency of manure, is it too dry, changing from pasture to hay will reduce the laxative effect that grass has on the horse.
- Diarrhoea, this can escalate to dehydration very quickly and should always be treated as a serious condition.

Next I like to make sure I have some natural pain relief and muscle support on hand. Reducing inflammation after a long hard day of competition is vital. Don't use a treatment that will mask an injury, instead provide natural healing support to help the horses own body repair and recover.

The dusty environment of a horse show can sometimes bring out allergies and coughs. Keeping remedies on hand to address these conditions is also beneficial.

I also keep Flyaway insect repellent on hand. I make sure my horse is covered in this in the stall. Insects have a habit of biting horses and mostly this doesn't worry them too much.

On rare occasions the horse may have an allergic reaction to the bite and develop hives.

When away from home in colder weather make sure you have enough layers to keep your horse warm. I like to bring a layering system with my rugs so that I can adapt to the different climate with precisely the right rug/ rugs combination.

Look out for draughts in the stall / stable. It is very hard for a horse to get comfortable when there are draughts. Remember they cant run around to warm up like they can in the paddock.

MAKING INFORMED DECISIONS WHEN BREEDING

Breeding your mare -
waiting for that beautiful foal to be born - how fantastic will this be.

AFEW IMPORTANT ITEMS TO CHECK FOR THE STALLION:

Does the **IBF** box have **YES**? If not, then the stallion has not been recognised by the AQHA as a breeding sire and means that you could have a problem with your foal being registered, you can check with the AQHA Office 02 6762 6444, the stallion may be in the process of having its IBF completed.

Is the current owner a financial member of the AQHA and therefore eligible to lodge breeding returns for this stallion? Check with the AQHA as above.

GENETIC TESTS FOR HORSES

What are the genetic test results showing for this stallion and does your mare have genetic results on file also if any of the following tests are applicable.

The below is lengthy but it is important that you are kept informed and can make your own decisions on breeding.

HERDA: Hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia is an inherited skin condition that is characterized by hyperextensible skin, scarring and severe lesions along the back of affected horses.

- Horses with **N/N** genotype will not have hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia and cannot transmit this hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia variant to their offspring.

- Horses with **N/HRD** genotype will not be affected by hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia, but are carriers. They may transmit this hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia variant to 50% of their offspring.
- Matings between two carriers result in a 25% chance of producing an affected foal.
- Horses with **HRD/HRD** genotype will have hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia. These horses are not registerable with the AQHA.

OLWS (LWO): Lethal white overo is a genetic disorder that results from two copies of the version of the gene causing the frame overo coat colour pattern.

- Horses with **N/N** genotype will not have the overo pattern and cannot transmit this lethal white overo variant to their offspring.
- Horses with **N/CAR (N/O)** genotype will have the overo pattern and are **carriers**. They may transmit this lethal white overo variant to their offspring.
- Matings with **N/N** horses will result in a 50% chance of producing an overo foal.
- Matings with between two carriers will result in a 25% chance of producing a lethal white foal.
- Horses with **O/O** genotype will have LWO, a condition incompatible with life.



HYPP: Hyperkalemic periodic paralysis (HYPP) is characterized by sporadic attacks of muscle tremors (shaking or trembling), weakness, and/or collapse. Attacks can also be accompanied by loud breathing noises resulting from paralysis of the muscles of the upper airway. Occasionally, sudden death can occur following a severe paralytic attack, presumably from heart failure or respiratory muscle paralysis.

Manifestation of clinical signs of HYPP depends on many factors including stress, diet, and changes in exercise. Some horses may manifest severe signs of the disease while others exhibit little or no signs.

- Horses with **N/N** genotype will not have hyperkalemic periodic paralysis and cannot transmit this hyperkalemic periodic paralysis variant to their offspring.
- Horses with **N/H** genotype can display episodes of hyperkalemic periodic paralysis and are **Carriers**. They may transmit this hyperkalemic periodic paralysis variant to 50% of their offspring.
- Horses with **H/H** genotype can display episodes of hyperkalemic periodic paralysis and typically are more severely affected. They will transmit this hyperkalemic periodic paralysis variant to all of their offspring.
- **HYPP carriers are not registerable with the AQHA unless spayed or gelded.**

PSSM1: Horses with Type 1 Polysaccharide Storage Myopathy (PSSM1) have a muscle disease characterized by accumulation of abnormal complex sugars (glycogen) in skeletal muscles. The accumulation of abnormal sugars can cause breakdown of muscle fibers (rhabdomyolysis) which leads to muscle pain, weakness, skin twitching, sweating, and reluctance to move.

- Horses with **N/N** genotype will not have type 1 Polysaccharide Storage Myopathy and cannot transmit the PSSM1 variant to their offspring.
- Horses with **N/PSSM1** genotype will have the PSSM1 variant and may show signs of type 1 disease. Horses with this genotype may transmit the PSSM1 variant to 50% of their offspring.
- Horses with **PSSM1/PSSM1** genotype are homozygous for the PSSM1 variant and may be more severely affected than N/PSSM1 horses. Horses with this genotype will transmit the PSSM1 variant to all of their offspring.

MH: Malignant hyperthermia (MH) is an inherited disease in which affected horses can be triggered by halogenated

anesthetics, succinylcholine, stress, or excitement, which can induce a hyper-metabolic state characterized by symptoms including muscle contracture, elevated temperature, and an irregular heart rhythm.

- Horses with **N/N** genotype will not have malignant hyperthermia and cannot transmit this malignant hyperthermia variant to their offspring.
- Horses with **N/MH** genotype will be affected by malignant hyperthermia. They can transmit this malignant hyperthermia variant to their offspring. Matings with N/N genotype will result in a 50% chance of producing a malignant hyperthermia-affected foal.
- Horses with **MH/MH** genotype will have malignant hyperthermia.

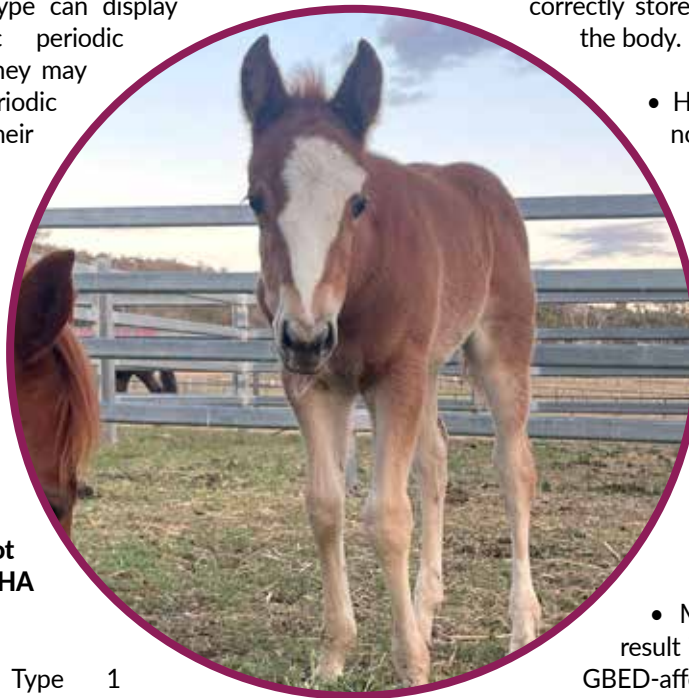
GBED: Glycogen branching enzyme deficiency (GBED) is a fatal genetic disorder that results from the inability to correctly store glycogen in several organs of the body.

- Horses with **N/N** genotype will not have glycogen branching enzyme deficiency and cannot transmit this glycogen branching enzyme deficiency variant to their offspring.
- Horses with **N/GBED** genotype will not be affected by glycogen branching enzyme deficiency, but are **carriers**. They may transmit this GBED variant to 50% of their offspring.
- Matings between two carriers result in a 25% chance of producing a GBED-affected foal.

- Horses with **GBED/GBED** genotype will have glycogen branching enzyme deficiency, a fatal condition.

MYHM: Myosin-heavy chain myopathy (MYHM) is a muscle disease that results in two distinct clinical disease presentations, immune-mediated myositis (IMM) and non-exertional rhabdomyolysis. Both presentations involve muscle loss or damage and are linked to the same genetic variant.

- Horses with **N/N** genotype will not have increased susceptibility for a myosin-heavy chain myopathy and cannot transmit the MYHM variant to their offspring.
- Horses with **N/My** genotype may develop a myosin heavy chain myopathy. They may transmit this MYHM variant to 50% of their offspring. Matings to horses with the N/N genotype will result in a 50% chance of producing a foal that may develop myosin-heavy chain myopathy.
- Horses with **My/My** genotype may develop a more severe form of a myosin-heavy chain myopathy. They will transmit this MYHM variant to all of their offspring.

THE AUSTRALIAN QUARTER HORSE ASSOCIATION HONOURS
GARRY MCPHEE WITH INDUCTION INTO THE HALL OF FAME.

Garry McPhee has dominated rodeo since his arrival from New Zealand in 1965. He joined the Australian Rough Riders Association (*later to be known as the Australian Professional Rodeo Association*). In 1967 Garry McPhee purchased a horse called CHUCK from former Canadian, Mel Stephens at Teen Ranch near Sydney.

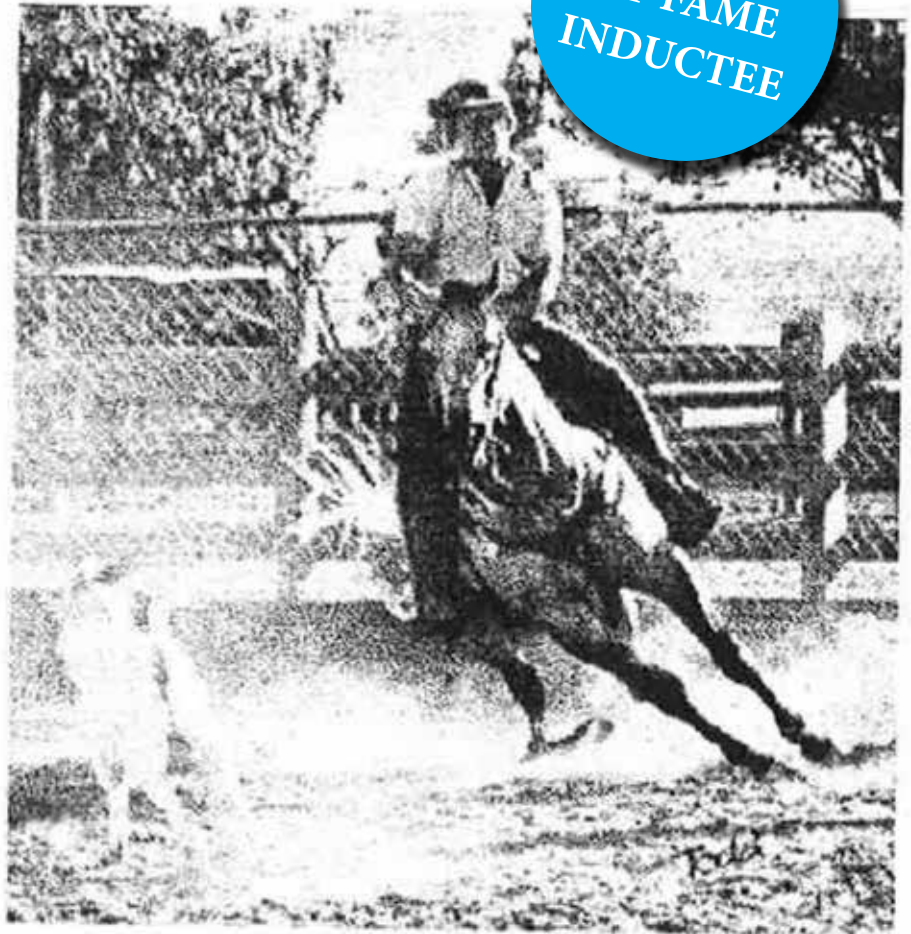
Garry believes that Chuck was an infused Quarter Horse and it was this early association with a good horse that started Garry on his way to win 12 Australian Rodeo titles in five years. In the early 1970's Garry and Cheryl McPhee (nee McTaggart) were both winning titles on "Molsie" (A-82), by Quarter Alman (R1-1204) by Mescal (imp) (Q-35) and it wasn't until 1974 that Garry started riding a stout Del Mingo bred gelding registered under the name of Trapper (R1-8718). Garry first saw the big foal in Eddie Wilson's paddock and was not impressed. The weanling later passed to Garry in a deal and was taken to Victoria where he finished growing. It didn't take long for Garry to realise the potential of Trapper once he had some arena work with cattle.

It's now history that the gelding has gone on to win over \$200,000 in both roping and steer wrestling contests in rodeos in five States.

Garry showed extreme versatility, mastering both ends of the arena winning the 1971 Bull Riding Champion, Steer Wrestling and coveted All-Round Australian Champion. Garry and Cheryl teamed up to breed, train and compete on some of Australian Rodeo's foundation Quarter Horses.

Garry McPhee has had his own breed of Quarter Horses since the early 1970's. He started with the Quarter Elgrando (R1-167) daughters, Elgrando Cupie (Q-33069), Elamo (Q-22922) and B.V. (A-161) and is still breeding from their descendants. He bred them and others to Rojo Dynamo (Q-542) and Bobbies Cutter (Q-4073) (leading sire of rodeo time event horses) and later Hank Man Leo (Q-1490) and Diplomatic Jet (Q-15124) – a brilliant calf roping horse. Garry trained Bobby Blair (Q-14840) who went on to win the calf roping horse title at the Australian Quarter Horse Championships for his next owners.

He showed reining and cutting horses in the 1970's including Bueno Brandy (R1-994) and Elgrando Cupie (Q-33069) who won the reining futurity at the Hordern Pavilion in the early

1970's. He won the cutting futurity at Walgett on Bueno Brandy and has partnered many of the top timed event horses such as Polo Buzz, Cadillac (Sonny Boy) and many more.

In 1974 Garry won four All-Round Championships and another 13 National titles. The name McPhee in rodeo also extends to Rodeo Stock Contracting with the McPhee Rodeo Company having the reputation as owning some of the most consistent and toughest bucking stock in Australia. McPhee stock has received many bucking stock awards for Saddle Bronc of the Year, Bareback Horse of the Year and Bull of the Year.

The Company have won over 69 Bucking Stock of the Year awards spanning over the next 40 years. Good management, hard work and the breeding program that Garry put in place in the 1970's allowed him to continue winning so many of these awards, year after year, decade after decade.

In 1985 a new generation of stock were eager to take the stage - Toss-Up won 10 Bareback Horse of the Year titles - Chainsaw

was a bull that captured the hearts of thousands of fans, television broadcasters, brewing companies and many more giants in the Australian Corporate world.

Today Garry can still be found passing on his experience and knowledge, of the required skill needed to be a successful competitor, to many potential young cowboys and indeed his own family with sons Guy and Blair and daughter Dusty following in their father's footsteps.

Garry has created the market for Quarter Horses in his field of Rodeo and has arguably contributed to the promotion of the outstanding qualities of the Quarter Horse in Rodeo Time Events to the point where, today, they are dominant breed for Barrel Racers, Steer Wrestlers, Calf Ropers and Team Ropers. Garry McPhee's ambitions are simple; he wants to continue competing in rodeos as long as he is able and lift the standards for the sport to the highest possible level.

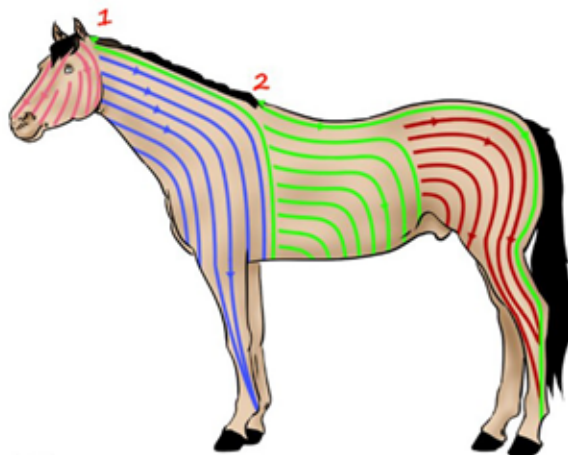
