



Dear Members,

The largest horse sale in Australia has just ended and its great to report that the Quarter Horses again proved the popularity with our breed topping all 3 categories with the top priced lots this year.

The top priced mare and overall top priced lot was "A Sandie Blonde" at \$180,000.00, a 4 year old mare sired by Sannman (I.S.) out of Nine Shades of Rey was bred by Barbara Williams and consigned by Jason and Rachel Leitch and the purchasers were Mac and Gayle Shann from Qld.

The top priced stallion was Tyrell Park Metallic Boon at \$80,000.00, sired by Boons Metallic (imp) out of Tyrell Park A Lil of Luck who was bred and consigned by the Brian Elliot Family Trust from Victoria.

The top priced gelding was Game Changer at \$100,000.00, sired by Times Up (imp) and out of Fair Lady Flash (imp), bred by Peter Shumack and consigned by Rob Hodgman of Pinkett, NSW.

There were several incentives offered by the AQHA for the leading registered Quarter Horses in some of the events with payouts going to the owners and also to the breeders.

The sale grossed \$13,463,000.00 and averaged \$27,417.00 across the sale.

Nutrien also presented the 1st Hall of fame awards for the Classic sale and campdraft and Acres Destiny (imp) along side One Moore Romance and Hazzelwood Conman who is a registered foundation sire with the AQHA inducted into the Horses Hall of Fame.

Also inducted was John Breckleman and Terry and Chris Hall and John and Jen Corbet who are all AQHA members, sadly we lost John Breckleman a few years ago and AQHA would like to congratulate these outstanding horses and people for there induction into the Nutrien Hall of Fame.

Another highlight was to see Blythe Stranger who works for the AQHA and represented us in the Classic ladies Foundation Young Ambassadors where

she was the Runner Up and has been recognised for her work initiative, dedication to the community and kindness to others, qualities that truly embody the work and spirit of the Classic Ladies Foundation who since inception has raised over \$1,000,000.00 which has been given to charitable institutions throughout Australia.

This was the 1st time that AQHA has fielded an entrant and we are so pleased to see Blythe achieve this award.

Q25 is fast approaching and if the last years nationals is anything to go by, it should be a bumper show and I would like to wish all members safe travels and the best of luck at this years show. The AQHA board has approved an increase in prizemoney on offer and of course we will have 2 American judges officiating over the show. The members welcome dinner will be on again and I look forward to seeing you all there, I believe the youth will be once again hosting there annual auction as well to raise funds for programs they have coming up.

Speaking of the youth, we will have news on the Youth World Cup in the near future, Kim Johnson who is the International Portfolio holder will be traveling to the AmQHA annual convention were there will be meetings on the future of this competition so stay tuned for updates very soon.

When it comes to feeding horses, we should be focusing on the laws of nature and the physiological requirements of horses as a species.

We often talk about species specific feeds. Each species has its own unique dietary requirements. Cats are carnivorous, so we don't dish them up a plate of grain.

Dogs can't eat chocolate or onions, and if we did feed it to them, we would make them extremely ill. Horses too, have remarkably simple evolutionary rules around their diet and digestive processes. Horses have eaten a 100% plant fibre diet for millions of years and nothing has changed.

The first horse was built more like a dog and was around 25cm – 50 cm tall. That is about half the size of today's miniature horses. He resided in the forest and was a browser, seeking soft leaves from above.

Over time this horse increased to around 100 cm tall and started to browse and graze. It is not clear why, but he eventually moved out into the open grass plains.

Around 4.5 – 5.5 million years ago, Equus appeared in the timeline. All modern-day horses evolved from Equus. Equus is predominantly a grazer.

Horses are adapted to run fast for long periods, to escape predators. Large heavy meals are not conducive to this behaviour.

As the horse evolved to eat tough materials such as grass and herbage containing cellulous fibers, his dentition changed. The teeth have developed very efficient grinding surfaces, and they continue to grow throughout life.

The horse's sensitive and prehensile lips with their attendant whiskers are very well adapted to locate, assess, and handle the feed he wishes to eat. The lips are used almost like a hand. The sensitivity, mobility, and power of the lips is extraordinary.

The front teeth, together with the lips and tongue, are used to get hold of the food and bring it into the mouth for grinding by the molars, or back teeth. The horse's powerful teeth reflect the coarse grasses he has evolved to eat, which require considerable chewing to break down the tough fibers. The constant process of grinding such food has the effect of wearing the teeth down. For this reason, the horse has developed open-rooted teeth which continue to grow

throughout his life.





The reason the modern horse must have his teeth regularly rasped reflects the fact that common feeding practices do not wear down the surfaces correctly. Proper maintenance of the teeth is vital to your horse's digestion.

The horse's digestive system is designed to process small amounts of forage frequently. A state of homeostasis occurs when appropriate amounts of energy are supplied for various life functions. The horse's gut should be viewed as an eco-system. Horses require a variety of different plants which contribute to a diverse gut microbial population. Each microbe plays an important role in the break down, conversion and digestion of nutrients. When this population gets out of balance it is called Dysbiosis.

Horses survived millions of years without us complicating things. So why can't we just let them eat grass and live happily as their predecessors did?

Unfortunately, this is where the complexity comes in. Paddocks and pastures around the world are often unsuitable for our domesticated horses. Not through evolution of the horse but due to current and historical farming practices.

Introduced species of grasses can often play havoc on a horse's digestion. A constant supply of high fibre, low energy plant

matter is a species-specific diet.

Most native grasses did not survive the introduction of high calorie, high sugar and high starch pastures, suited for rearing cattle and sheep for the milk and meat market. These grasses were selected for their hardiness, meaning that they just keep

coming back even after intense grazing. Most of our pastures do not contain the diversity in fibers to encourage a healthy

population of gut microbiota.

Dysbiosis (or imbalanced gut) follows on from consuming high sugar, high starch, high protein pastures or feeds, and a lack of diverse fibers.

ana showed Thomas Ritchie's horse, RQH Just Call Me Gus Q-75349, with Thomas initially teaching her Showmanship, and often still helping her today.

'Two years later, I showed Lynda Cavallo's horse, Triandibo Super Diva, Q-74111,' Dana says, 'We won an AQHA National title in 5-11 Showmanship, earning a place on the front cover of AQHA magazine, and it awakened me to excel in my talents in Showmanship. 'I grew up having parents as trainers, which can be a little stressful and timeconsuming, as theirs is a 24-7 job, meaning holidays aren't that common. But I learned early on how to handle and care for a sick or injured horse, and my parents taught me everything I know about handling, riding & showing horses. I've not only learned how to lift a horse's shoulders and make them work, with both, their front and hind ends, but to encourage a smooth rhythm at all gaits, the main steps to riding and showing. Horse shows mean no such thing as free time for Mum and Dad, but they're always there to help me go through my patterns, or sit on the sidelines to watch my rail classes. They've been my biggest sources of advice—talking me through classes, and giving me feedback after classes. That helps me gain knowledge and improve for next time. I also often pick up things by watching other youth and trainers through their showing and riding.'



Explaining why her favourite classes are Western Horsemanship, Trail and Hunter Under Saddle highlights Dana's heart and passion for showing.

'In Horsemanship, I love looking sharp and enjoy sitting tall and performing each maneuver. Trail classes, with the different patterns every time, get me excited. Riding over and through the different obstacles and experiencing how they flow is a thrill, especially when my horse clears all the poles and performs a great pattern. In Hunter Under Saddle, I love the saddle, and how smooth and forward-moving a Hunter Horse is to ride, with the rhythm of their canter and the extension of their trot.'

The 2025 Nutrien Classic Campdraft and Sale saw many highlights. The ten days were celebrated with both strong sale results and outstanding competition in both the Challenge and Campdrafting events, alongside big announcements on the future of Open Age horses at the February Classic event and the induction of eight recipients into the Inaugural Classic Hall of Fame.





he 18th Nutrien Classic Sale results continued to confirm the Nutrien Classic as the premier Performance Horse Sale in the country. With sales still settling, the result stands at a gross of \$13,584,500, producing a sale average of \$27,498.99 which is an increase of 10% on the 2024 average and a clearance rate of 92.68% which ensured many satisfied vendors.

There was good demand for proven female lines again this year, with a range of quality mares and fillies grossing \$7,494,000 at an average of \$33,909. Lot 469 A SANDIE BLONDE Q-100612 (Sannman X Nine Shades O Rey) was the star of the show as top price mare and lot of the sale, selling for \$180,000 to Mac & Gayle Shann of Claremont, Queensland. She was proudly presented by Jason & Rachel Leitch.

The gelding market grossed more than \$5,132,000 and averaged over \$20,777.33 with 246 notable lots sold. Top priced gelding was Lot 443 – GAME CHANGER Q-97234 (Times Up X Fair Lady Flash) on account of Rob & Monica Hodgman. The beautifully presented 4-year-old gelding sold for \$100,000 back through Nutrien's Roma Branch.

There were 25 colts/stallions sold averaging \$36,865.38 topped by Lot 320 TYRELL PARK METALLIC BOON Q-97930 (Boons Metallic x Tyrell Park Alil Luck), an impressive 4-year-old colt presented by Mark Buttsworth and sold by Brian Elliott Family Trust of Nandaly, Victoria.

Sunday night February 2nd saw the first final, the Prvdes Easifeed Australian Performance Horse Challenge with the 11th trophy trailer donated by long term sponsors Peel & Jody Tribe of Navaho Trailers. Warming up with the A massive crowd gathered on

They were the leaders of the field heading into the final, who claimed victory with a stunning Aggregate score of 350.25.

The Young sire is by the Hall of Fame Inductee Acres Destiny, out of One Moore Diva and owned by Emma and Morgan Webb. He was purchased in 2022 as a 2 year old colt off Russ Bradley for just \$20,000.

the hill for the first of numerous Campdraft event finals Wednesday afternoon, where the Coverdrive Gelding Incentive kicked things off at 5:30pm. This feature event exhibited the top 16 geldings from the Classic Campdraft, who competed for a total prizepool of over \$13,000.

It was a tightly contested final and in the end, the great competitor Lead Read claimed victory riding Rayman owned by Wellington Cattle Company, with an 87 point run quaranteeing the \$6,000 winners cheque thanks to Coverdrive Promotions who operate popular bar services at AELEC.

The Campdraft feats arena continued in the hotly contested 4CYTE Charlie Maher Young Guns final running as the last event of Day 6. Always a popular occasion, the final did not disappoint spectators with 30 young talents demonstrating some of the best Campdrafting of the week yet.











There was a nail biting run off between Joe Mckinnon on Bushy (Owned by Carl Green) and Hannah Riley riding EB S BLUETOONZ Q-91431 (owned by Troy and Fiona Palmer). Hannah was number one out, she ran an 88 together with her 179 gave her a 267. Then it was Joe's turn at number two, where he ran a 90 together with his 179 he took the lead by two points with 269. Joe and the open gelding by Lillacreek Willow Oak and out of Territory Teddy, Bushy have an incredible partnership. Joe said he was lucky to secure the ride on the great gelding.

Another afternoon of Campdraft finals excitement kicked off on Thursday February 6th with the Jimmy Matthews Memorial Ladies Dash for Cash, featuring the top lady riders from this weeks events competing for an impressive

prizepool. The winner was a popular one, Leah Whitehead who rode Geoffery & Jennifer Porges mare for 88 points – a beautiful run.

The Martins Stock Haulage Open Campdraft Final was also exciting viewing, with the top seven combinations coming into the final with only 3 points between them.

It came down to a run-off between Mat Holz riding a horse owned by Kooyoong Pastoral PTY LTD and Wyatt Young on Metallic Storm A2-3151 owned by the Metallic Storm Syndicate. The run-off was spectacular between two graduates of the sale, Mat Holz horse was sold

Fame Inductees Terry and Chrissy Hall, and Metallic Storm A2-3151 was sold in 2020 for \$100,000 from Jim & Lynda MacCallum.

Mat Holz took home the victory and the \$10,000 cheque. The 7 year old black mare by the Hall of Fame inductee. The astonishing partnership between Mat and Hazelwood produced a 91,90,90 and an 88 in the run off, claiming the victory with a three point lead totaling 359.

The last and most anticipated event of Thursday night was the Nutrien Classic Campdraft Final – the main incentive event and one that all buyers come to win. The crowd was electric up on the hill, as spectators watched some of the most exciting young Australian performance horses at work.

It was fantastic viewing throughout the field, and it was one of the industry's favourties. Matt Stanger aboard Rhondhu Cats R Double Q-97230 (Highlightcat x Erin Crackin Double Spin) owned by K.J Gilligan & M.R Stanger and bought from Rhondhu for just \$15,000. They took the title with scores of 89,88 and another 89 in the final for a 1 point victory totalling 266.


CLASSIC LADIES FOUNDATION

wners, determined to outdo their mates on the track, began to look further afield for horses of pure running blood. Things started to grow. With no fanfare and no actual plan short distance racing gradually extended beyond Normanton. As word trickled out some of us began to keep an eye on what was happening in the north.

The 2024 sprint racing season in north Queensland got under way with time trials at Normanton on 6th June. Dennis Manns good mare Jet Lunar Eclipse was the winner here. This was followed by Eureka Creek in July and it was here that Troy Gallagher's Mr Hanky Panky got his taste for winning. Ridden by Miranda Shepherd this 4 year old gelding by Chicks Regard (USA) came second to Dennis Mann's Sullivans Maid in the classic heat then won the Progressive, with Ashley Gallaghers Sullivans Hollywood in second place. Mr Hanky Panky was to go on to be unbeaten in his next 6 starts and end the season with 7 straight wins, including 4 cups –

a sterling achievement for a horse who had been sidelined with a serious hoof injury for months and was still being treated at the time of Eureka Creek.

Next on the program was the iconic Mailman Express at Mt Isa on 8th August. Mr Hanky Panky, together with Troy Gallagher's very consistent Jabelle Aint She Fancy (Winning Deck), made the 500 km trip from Normanton and Troy had hopes one of his horses would make the final 10 in this race. Mr Hanky Panky went into the finals in second place behind Jabelle Aint She Fancy. Ridden by Courtney Gray he got up to win the 2024 Mailman Express in a remarkable time of 11.9 seconds for the 200 m journey. In second place was Hudson (Winning Deck), owned, trained and ridden by Lee Chappell while Jabelle Aint She Fancy (Winning Deck) came in 3rd spot.

The action moved to Sedan Dip on 17th August where Mr Hanky Panky ridden by Miranda Shepherd won both the heat and the Cup. Innaminka hosted their Bush sprints on 31st August.

On 7th September Normanton held their annual Rodeo and Race Meeting with all up prizemoney of \$20,000 across the board for the sprints. The major races, the Classic, worth \$7,500 and the Normanton Cup were won by Mr Hanky Panky with Jock Connelly on board.

14th September saw it all happening at Richmond where John Wharton and his committee had the grounds and track in immaculate condition. A five race program featured the 4th running of the Merrie Elliott Breeders Cup posting prizemoney of \$20,000. This concept was the brainchild of Allan Sullivan and modeled on similar events that were successfully running in USA. It involved a lot of long term planning and of course numerous hiccups along the way.

8 horses fronted up for this race. The winner was Sullivans Fleetwood (Wagon Tales USA) owned and trained by Tony Smith and ridden by Cheryl Bethel. In second place was Sullivans Maid (Sullivans Rocket) owned by Dennis Mann and trained and ridden by Lee Bowker while third was Sullivans Eyesa Cat (eyesa Special USA) owned by Jody Murray, trained by Lee Bowker and ridden by Miranda Shepherd.

Tony Smith had set out with Fleetwood from his base in Albury on the Victorian/NSW border 8 days before the race. 800 ks into the journey he met with an accident at Bourke. Refusing an ambulance, this determined 73 year old turned around and drove 800 km back to his home. A couple of days later he and Fleetwood set off again for Richmond, arriving a day before the races. Fleetwood was entered in the first race of the day, the Progressive over 320 metres. With Cheryl Bethel in the saddle she won this ahead of Ashley Gallagher's Sullivans Hollywood in ridden by Emmy Gallagher, followed by Sensational Secretary (Eyesa Sensation) ridden and trained by Lee Bowker for Dennis Mann.

Fleetwood and Cheryl Bethel then fronted up to win the Breeders Cup later in the day – she might have looked a bit gaunted up after 3700 kms but the determined mare was full of run.

The Maiden carried prizemoney of \$5000 and was won by Sullivans Gotcha Tale ridden by Kyle Sharpe. His owner/trainer Paul Edwards has been a long time stalwart of the northern sprint racing scene

and has had some champion runners in that time. Paul has won the Mailman Express times. Hudson ran second to in this race for owner Lee Chappell and ridden by trainer Lee Bowker. In third place was Packer Too for owner/trainer Lee Bowker and ridden by Lee's 17 year old son Billy, having his first season on the track.

The third race was a bit of a innovation. It was over 360 metres and restricted to Thoroughbred horses. 3 horses contested this which was won by just a love song.

The final race of the day, the Novice 360 m was won by Sullivans Hollywood (Wagon Tales USA) for owner/trainer Ashley Gallagher and ridden by Emmy Gallagher. Second place was Likea Rockchic for owner/trainer/jockey Cheryl Bethel, who had earlier ridden Fleetwood in both her victories. Third spot was Sullivans Eyesa Cat for owner

Jody Murry and Lee Bowker/trainer/Jockey.

A little story behind the win of Hollywood - he had arrived the previous day with the Ashley Gallagher family after a 600 km trip from Sawtell Creek. His Jockey, Emmy Gallagher, had injured her hand in an incident just prior to the start.

Hollywood was led into the barrier for Emmy to mount. Ashley noticed his daughter flinching from pain and gave her some fatherly advice "Its only 20 seconds – suck it up and go and win" and Emmy did just that. Hollywood is a small horse who Ashley describes as 'the total package' for when he is not racing he is out mustering, he is roped off and he runs a mean barrel race and despite his lack of size carries Ashleys 100kg all day.











On 6th October Jundah racing club held the second running of the \$15,000 Brady Prow Memorial Sprint. This was run over 200 metres under the time trial format where each horse individually runs against the clock, same as the Mailman Express. The winner was Wakandra Boy (SLR Mojos Workin) owned by Andrew Jansen and ridden by Alisha O'Dell. Second was Sullivans Eyesa Cat (Eyesa Special USA) owned by Jody Murray and ridden by Miranda Shepherd. Eyesa Cat won the inaugural running of this race in 2023. In third place was Morns Roc Jack (Traditional Spinner) owned and ridden by Cassy Moroney. The win of Wakandra Boy (alias Roughtrot) was quite fitting for this race in honor of a good stockman and horseman. Andrew Jansen had specifically bred this horse from his noted time event mare She's Winken Flash to be a steer wrestling mount. Roughtrot is just filling in his time being a racehorse while he is growing up enough to become a time event horse.

Also on 6th October other sprinters gathered for the Georgetown Bush Races. Mr Hanky Panky, ridden by Jock Connolly, continued his winning ways taking out the Georgetown Cup ahead of Exsplosive Girl and Sullivans Gotcha Tale, as well as winning the Open 250 with Jabelle Aint She Fancy and Sullivans Maid deadheating for 2/3. Dennis Mann's Sensational Secretary (Eyesa Sensation) won the Progressive followed by Fastmans Manung and One Famous Fling while the Open was won by Sullivans Gotcha Tale with Explosive Girl TB and Just a Love Story TB in the placings. Lee Chappell's Hudson, ridden and trained by Lee Bowker was successful in the Maiden.

19th October saw the Torbanlea Picnic Races – a great programe of 9 races and beautiful grass track but no results are available.

26th October saw the last 2 meetings for the season when the Banana Battle of the Bush coincided with the Diamontina Bush Sprints far to the west at Winton. Mr Hanky Panky chose to make the 800 km trip to Winton where, ridden by Cameron Creevey, he took out the \$4500 Open Dash for Cash. Jabelle Aint she Fancy was relegated into second place in this her final race of her career. This mare has been a most consistent racehorse for Troy Gallagher with 14 wins to her credit.

At Banana Bush Bash Wakandra Boy, winner of the 15,000 Brady Prow Memorial earlier that month sped away with the \$7000 winners purse. He had also been sold for \$5800 in the Calcutta.

There is much more to be told – the dedicated owners, trainers and jockeys who somehow fit in all the racing with their regular occupations and travel massive distances to widespread meetings, hardworking committees who organize great community events around the races and who go to so much effort to prepare tracks and provide officials.

And then, over and above all, an amazing array of sponsors whose generosity ensures it can all happen. Yes, they 're racing in the north and may it continue to grow.

aquero (imp) holds the honour of being allocated "Q1" to his name in the Australian Quarter Horse Stud Book, Volume One 1968, Purebred Registry.

Vaquero arrived in Australia in 1954 as part of a King Ranch consignment of four stallions and was sent to the King Ranch stud, "Risdon" at Warwick in Queensland.

At that time he was only a colt (he was foaled in 1952), and the son of Hired Hand. Hired Hand has been described as the last and greatest son of Old Sorrel. Through Old Sorrel, Vaquero's breeding goes back to Hickory Bill, Peter McCue, Cold Deck, Old Billy, Shilo – along the classic line to Sir Archy (1805-33), certainly one of the very founders of the breed.

In 1971 Vaquero was awarded the Australian Quarter Horse Association Award of Honour for his contribution to the breed. His progeny included the gelding, King Ranch Quarter Banjo (awarded the Association's first Register of Merit), and many

other high ranking performance horses. A total of 208 progeny have been recorded by him, with an even greater number of Australian Quarter Horses who can claim him as part of their pedigree. We honour him now as the first horse inducted into the newly established Hall of Fame.

GREGORY PAUL LOUGHER

1915 - 1986

The Australian Quarter Horse Association honours Gregory Paul Lougher with induction into the Hall of Fame.



reg Lougher was born in California. A keen athlete, he won the San Francisco 100 metre Swimming Championship and was the first intercollegiate rodeo champion riding for the University of California at Davis where he was studying to become a vet.

Before going to Davis, Greg spent a few years running wild horses, breaking them in and selling them; driving the big teams of horses making hay and competing at Rodeos to make enough money to go to College. His studies were interrupted when he was called up to serve in the Army during World War II. He was an instructor in horseshoeing, riding and shooting. He was first out of 5,000 men in marksmanship. He was stationed in China, India and Burma with the U.S. Cavalry and the mule regiment where he was assigned to Merrills Marauders. They had to pack guns and ammunition through swamps, mined jungles and parts of the Himalayas. Greg had to keep the mules on their feet and he was able to build a foot with packing, Stockholm tar and a makeshift shoe when necessary. His brief veterinarian training and his experience in Asia just added to his skills as a horseman.

After the War, Greg started training horses professionally. He started with Thoroughbreds, and then showed and trained hunters, jumpers, American Saddlebreds and Tennessee Walkers. He schooled polo ponies, drove trotters and showed and trained California Bridle horses and was one of the first cutting horse trainers in California.

Greg was said to be the best Hackamore reinsman of his time and his skill with the hackamore endeared him to Luis Ortega, the world's foremost rawhide craftsman, who showed Greg some of his secrets. Greg made many hackamores with a feel that only someone with his touch could do. His work is still respected.

Greg Lougher received the Silver Medal from the SPCA (RSPCA) for his act of bravery in swimming through a flooded river in the Big Flood of 1955 and rescuing a great bridle mare he had shown and three other mares. It was quite a feat to save them and he had to head and tailed them then ride the bridle mare through the flooded river to the bank. He then went back for a child's pony and together they struggled to the safety of the bank. Many animals were killed in that flood and

the courage that Greg Lougher showed was recognized on National television in April, 1958.

Whilst running a successful training and breeding operation in the U.S. Greg met David Briggs and Bill Gunn. They went into partnership and brought 31 Quarter Horses to Australia. The trip to Australia involved a six month quarantine stay in England and at least two months at sea - or so Greg thought. He loaded the horses onto a freight ship at the Stockton, California wharf in June, 1965. He then said goodbye to his friends, helpers, wife Carmel and two daughters (Gail and Lori). Alone, he looked after the horses for six weeks in their tie stalls. He fought seasickness, the oppressive heat going through the Panama Canal and the rough Atlantic seas. Keeping the water up to the horses was a full-time job and there was feeding and stalls to clean, as well as keeping the health of the horses in top order. The horses could not lie down and had to stand the whole trip. Due to an unscheduled stop at Le Havre, France, the horses were not permitted to unload in England as, at that time, there was an outbreak of Swamp Fever in southern France. Greg was told he had to destroy the horses or take them back to the U.S.

Belgium came to the rescue and Greg and his horses spent three months in quarantine there. He was asked to give demos at horse shows. The people had never seen Quarters Horses ridden, let alone reining or whatever Greg could demonstrate in the limited spaces. They loved what they saw and Greg took every opportunity to promote the breed. The interest did not waver when he finally arrived in England.

He was invited to exhibit them at some of the largest horse shows – he even took them fox-hunting. No one ever used stallions, and to be well behaved was even more unbelievable. Many of the top horsemen and women came to him during that six month stay in England. He worked with Pat Smythe, one of England's top showjumpers. He showed her his training methods and gear that helped her to reach the top of the tree that year.

Greg could not get all the horses on one ship out to Australia, so they landed in two shifts in September, 1967. All the horses were taken to Sam Hordern's property at Penrith where they spent another few months before they finally reached their home at Murrurundi, N.S.W. While Greg was in Penrith he was asked to give a cutting demonstration on Clover Cherry at the Warwick Gold Cup. He was then given special dispensation to enter the Gold Cup on Clover Lori (neither had competed in a campdraft before). Clover Lori had only been off the ship three weeks and had not had much work.

Greg and Clover Lori were tied for first going into the final but he ended up fourth overall. This was a remarkable feat, and he even straightened his glasses and hat before he reached the first peg! The interest in Greg Lougher and his horses grew. Greg gave demonstrations in cutting, reining and cowhorse in country shows in N.S.W. Then the big breakthrough came, not only for Greg but the Quarter Horse breed. The Sydney Royal Easter Show asked Greg and his two daughters to demonstrate his horses in the main arena as a main attraction. Thousands of people filed past the four horses in 'A Block'.

Spectators would gather to watch the horses being exercised. Clover Cherry, Clover Lori, Clover Drift and Clarence Robinson paraded down the main street of Sydney to open the Show. Quarter Horses had been in Australia for quite some time by now, but never had they received such publicity. Greg was asked to return next year. He went to the Adelaide Royal as well.

Perhaps the reason Greg Lougher was so well admired was the fact the he was a true horseman. He could ride any style of horse (he even rode the famous horse, Five Minutes to Midnight) and saw good in every breed. He gave schools at Ron Males stud to Arabian enthusiasts, at Gatton College he worked with Reg Williams, educated Sinclair Hill, the great polo player and his horses and Sinclair even credits Greg's helping him achieve his ten goal rating. He gave schools at Clover Leaf where Jim Haydon and Ian Johnson, Jim Page, Graham and Merv Lamey, Joy Peel, Brian and John Cobcroft, Terry O'Hanlon and many, many others came. Graham Amos, Donald Gunn and even Chilla Seeney, all at some stage were inspired by Greg Lougher.

Greg Lougher served as a member of the AQHA Board, was given a Life Membership and a special award from the Association for his contribution to the breed. Clover Cherry, Clover Lori and Clover Drift were also recognized with a special award – the Award of Honour.

Few people are ever held with such respect as Greg Lougher was, and still is in the horse world. His name is mentioned when Australian Stock Horse breeders get together remembering about starting their breed. Greg Lougher created so much interest in the Quarter Horse, something had to be done. In no way would Greg Lougher ever say he was solely responsible for the popularity of the Quarter Horse. The horse has a lot to do with that, as did many other hard working devoted breeders and members, but he sure did get the ball rolling!

Greg Lougher died in 1986 in California. He was cleaning a stall and had a heart attack. Some friends of his took his ashes to Battle Mountain in Nevada where he used to run wild horses and which he loved so dearly.

They scattered his ashes on that mountain. As they did, a band of wild horses bolted past in the valley. He will always remain with horses, his true passion, but let's hope in heaven they're all Quarter Horses.

With pride and respect, Gregory Paul Lougher was the first person inducted into the AQHA Hall of Fame. ◆

The Australian Quarter Horse Association honours King Ranch (Aust) PTY. LTD. with induction into the Hall of Fame.




n the early 1950's Robert Kleberg Jnr. began to consider the possibility of expanding the Company's ranching operations beyond the United States. He considered the possibility of breeding Santa Gertrudis cattle in tropical and subtropical climates and subsequent investigation and negotiations led to ventures in Australia.

The Company's Australian operations were conducted on more than seven million acres, almost all under lease. Incorporated in 1951, King Ranch Australia owned the freehold properties of Milton Park, Retford Park and Deltroit in N.S.W. Milton Park and

Retford Park (about 3,000 acres between them), were run as a single operation whose principal activities included a Santa Gertrudis stud, a Quarter Horse stud and an artificial insemination centre.

King Ranch Australia also owned ranching properties called Avon Downs, Disney, Elgin Downs and New Twin Hills. A King Ranch Australia subsidiary operated a Northern Territory station called Brunette Downs. The vast pastoral interest of King Ranch certainly must be recognised, however it was for their introduction of the Quarter Horse, and their involvement in the growth and development of the breed



in this country, that they are now honoured as part of our own AQHA history.

In 1953 four stallions were selected to be sent to Australia. They arrived in 1954 with Vaquero and Jackaroo going to "Risdon" at Warwick. Gold Standard went to a property in Clermont, Queensland. These three were imported by King Ranch, and the other was Mescal, imported by Sam Hordern. It was another seven years before any more Quarter horses arrived in this country. This was a shipment of three stallions including Tejano Chico and Pronto Mio with eight mares all destined for the King Ranch breeding pastures. Then in 1963 came a shipment of fifteen. There were five stallions, one of these went to Isis Downs in Queensland, and the other four were for King Ranch properties, as were eight of the mares.

King Ranch Australia principals were the key to the development of the Australian Quarter Horse Association in 1964. Starting initially, and based at Milton Park, New South Wales, Peter Bailleau and employees of King Ranch Australia started the Australian Quarter Horse Association. Martin Lemann wrote the first Constitution, and it was King Ranch Australia that drove it in its first few formative years. Peter Bailleau was the first President of the AQHA, and it was King Ranch Australia Directors and their families that were included on the first Board of Directors. These were Sidney Bailleau Myer, Sarah Myer (formerly Hordern), and Martin Lemann (Assistant to the King Ranch Australia General Manager, Peter

Bailleau), who was in charge of Quarter Horse stud operations which were run by such great horseman as Stan Shephard , and assisted by Greg Gilpin. It was the performance and Halter horses bred and shown by King Ranch that set the early standards of showing and conformation in Australia.

The important nexus that King Ranch Australia made between the Santa Gertrudis and the Quarter Horse saw many of our great early Quarter Horse breeders like George Greenup, and Barney and Raul Joyce have a connection through their owning both Santa Gertrudis and Quarter Horses. This saw Quarter Horses spread rapidly throughout Queensland and New South Wales. Quarter Horses were sold at every King Ranch bull sale, held annually at Milton Park. They created the high profile of the Quarter Horse that saw their popularity skyrocket.

King Ranch brought American trainer Ronny Kellum to Australia, and he gave demonstrations of cutting at some of these bull sales. He was one of the first U.S. trainers to come here, and ignited enthusiasm for Western events. King Ranch Australia owned the first Q registered horse (Vaquero Q-1); the first registered Q mare (Maquina Q-5); the first registered Q gelding (Quartermain Q-72); the first R1 registered horse (Chester R1-1); and the first registered R2 horse (Colorado R2-1).

It is now fitting that King Ranch Australia be the first Corporation to be inducted into the AQHA Hall of Fame. ◆

BREEDING YOUR MARE - WAITING FOR THAT BEAUTIFUL FOAL TO BE BORN - HOW FANTASTIC WILL THIS BE

A FEW IMPORTANT ITEMS TO CHECK FOR THE STALLION:

Does the **IBF** box have **YES?** If not, then the stallion has not be recognised by the AQHA as a breeding sire and means that you could have a problem with your foal being registered, you can check with the AQHA Office 02 6762 6444, the stallion may be in the process of having its IBF completed.

Is the current owner a financial member of the AQHA and therefore eligible to lodge breeding returns for this stallion? Check with the AQHA as above.

GENETIC TESTS FOR HORSES

What are the genetic tests results showing for this stallion and does your mare have genetic results on file also if any of the following tests are applicable.

The below is lengthy but it is important that you are kept informed and can make your own decisions on breeding.

HERDA: Hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia is an inherited skin condition that is characterized by hyperextensible skin, scarring and sever lesions along the back of affected horses.

 Horses with N/N genotype will not have hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia and cannot transmit this hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia variant to their offspring.

- Horses with N/HRD genotype will not be affected by hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia, but are carriers. They may transmit this hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia variant to 50% of their offspring.
- Matings between two carriers result in a 25% chance of producing an affected foal.
- Horses with HRD/HRD genotype will have hereditary equine regional dermal asthenia. These horses are not registerable with the AQHA.

OLWS (LWO): Lethal white overo is a genetic disorder that results from two copies of the version of the gene causing the frame overo coat colour pattern.

- Horses with **N/N** genotype will not have the overo pattern and cannot transmit this lethal white overo variant to their offspring.
- Horses with N/CAR (N/O) genotype will have the overo pattern and are carriers. They may transmit this lethal white overo variant to their offspring.
- Matings with N/N horses will result in a 50% chance of producing an overo foal.
- Matings with between two carriers will result in a 25% chance of producing a lethal white foal.
- Horses with O/O genotype will have LWO, a condition incompatible with life.

HYPP: Hyperkalemic periodic paralysis (HYPP) is characterized by sporadic attacks of muscle tremors (shaking or trembling), weakness, and/or collapse. Attacks can also be accompanied by loud breathing noises resulting from paralysis of the muscles of the upper airway. Occasionally, sudden death can occur following a severe paralytic attack, presumably from heart failure or respiratory muscle paralysis.

Manifestation of clinical signs of HYPP depends on many factors including stress, diet, and changes in exercise. Some horses may manifest severe signs of the disease while others exhibit little or no signs.

Horses with N/N genotype will not have hyperkalemic periodic paralysis and cannot transmit this hyperkalemic periodic paralysis variant to their offspring.

Horses with N/H genotype can display episodes of hyperkalemic periodic paralysis and are Carriers. They may transmit this hyperkalemic periodic paralysis variant to 50% of their offspring.

H/H Horses with genotype display can episodes of hyperkalemic periodic paralysis and typically are more severely affected. They will transmit this hyperkalemic periodic paralysis variant to all of their offspring.

HYPP carriers are not registerable with the AQHA unless spayed or gelded.

PSSM1: Horses with Type Polysaccharide Storage Myopathy (PSSM1) have a muscle disease characterized by accumulation of abnormal complex sugars (glycogen) in skeletal muscles. The accumulation of abnormal sugars can cause breakdown of muscle fibers (rhabdomyolosis) which leads to muscle pain, weakness, skin twitching, sweating, and reluctance to move.

- Horses with **N/N** genotype will not have type 1 Polysaccharide Storage Myopathy and cannot transmit the PSSM1 variant to their offspring.
- Horses with N/PSSM1 genotype will have the PSSM1 variant and may show signs of type 1 disease. Horses with this genotype may transmit the PSSM1 variant to 50% of their offspring.
- Horses with PSSM1/PSSM1 genotype are homozygous for the PSSM1 variant and may be more severely affected than N/PSSM1 horses. Horses with this genotype will transmit the PSSM1 variant to all of their offspring.

MH: Malignant hyperthermia (MH) is an inherited disease in which affected horses can be triggered by halogenated anesthetics, succinylcholine, stress, or excitement, which can induce a hyper-metabolic state characterized by symptoms including muscle contracture, elevated temperature, and an irregular heart rhythm.

- Horses with N/N genotype will not have malignant hyperthermia and cannot transmit this malignant hyperthermia variant to their offspring.
- Horses with **N/MH** genotype will be affected by malignant hyperthermia. They can transmit this malignant hyperthermia variant to their offspring. Matings with N/N genotype will result in a 50% chance of producing a malignant hyperthermia-affected foal.
- Horses with MH/MH genotype will have malignant hyperthermia.

GBED: Glycogen branching enzyme deficiency (GBED) is a fatal genetic disorder that results from the inability to correctly store glycogen in several organs of the body.

> • Horses with N/N genotype will not have glycogen branching enzyme deficiency and cannot transmit this glycogen branching enzyme deficiency variant to their offspring.

> > Horses with N/GED genotype will not be affected glycogen branching enzyme deficiency, but are carriers. They may transmit this GBED variant to 50% of their offspring.

• Matings between two carriers result in a 25% chance of producing a GBED-affected foal.

• Horses with GBED/GBED genotype will have glycogen branching enzyme deficiency, a fatal condition.

MYHM: Myosin-heavy chain myopathy (MYHM) is a muscle disease that results in two distinct clinical disease presentations, immune-mediated myositis (IMM) and nonexertional rhabdomyolysis. Both presentations involve muscle loss or damage and are linked to the same genetic variant.

- Horses with N/N genotype will not have increased susceptibility for a myosin-heavy chain myopathy and cannot transmit the MYHM variant to their offspring.
- Horses with **N/My** genotype may develop a myosin heavy chain myopathy. They may transmit this MYHM variant to 50% of their offspring. Matings to horses with the N/N genotype will result in a 50% chance of producing a foal that may develop myosin-heavy chain myopathy.
- Horses with My/My genotype may develop a more severe form of a myosin-heavy chain myopathy. They will transmit this MYHM variant to all of their offspring.
