Early Life & Partnerships

- Affectionately named “Jerry” after comedian Jerry Seinfeld, known for his cheeky, playful nature.
- Purchased as a 2-year-old by Rick Platenkamp & Helen Laycock; trained and shown successfully by Trish Wettenhall.
- Later purchased by Fran & Tim Christian for their daughter Liz, becoming a life-changing partnership from 2009 onward.

Performance Record

- Versatility: Points in 11 AQHA disciplines, excelling in Trail, Western Riding, Showmanship, Reining, Hunter Under Saddle, Horsemanship, and more.
- Achievements:
- 543 Open Trail points (highest to date).
- State winner in 10 disciplines.
- 144 State & National wins/runner-ups.
- 46+ End of Year Awards, including High Point Youth, Amateur, and Category 1.
- High Point Amateur across four states in one year (VIC, NSW, QLD, SA).
- Top 3 in Western Riding for 8 consecutive years.
- Awards: 85 AQHA awards, including 3 Gold Century Awards and the Performance Medal.

Contributions to the Industry

- Represented Australia in Youth World Cup, demonstrating trainability and temperament.
- Featured by Lyn Palm at Equitana in the first Western Dressage display.
- Introduced and mentored Youth and Amateurs through Showmanship—often competing in multiple back-to-back classes at Nationals.
- Embodied the versatility, good mind, and trainability of the Quarter Horse breed.

Legacy

- Jerry competed successfully until nearly 19 years of age before retiring to the paddock.
