
I personally thank each and every portfolio holder for the effort they have put into their portfolios.

EMLYN Broad and Will Hupp met and became friends in 2011, when they had stables in the same isle at a horse show. Their friendship grew and things just developed from there. Today, while running individual training businesses, Will and Emlyn work alongside each other every day.

affiliated events as an 8yo, with opportunities to show many beautiful, talented horses. Standout Youth horses that Emlyn leased were Hypnotize Q-65477, and She's Hot Stuff Q-69935. Each had their challenges, Em says, but made her the rider she is today.

Now 26, Emlyn was inspired by Natasha and Travis Humphries, for the horseman they are, and the love and care they give their horses. She's been a part of the TNT barn since she was thirteen.

'I showed the dual-registered gelding, Hypnotize at Open, AQHA and PHAA shows, in Youth and Open classes, and Futurities,' Em says. 'Tiger started me off in the western industry. At 14, I had to write an article about what I wanted to be in ten years—my subject—a horse trainer! At 18, I began my apprenticeship with TNT, and four years later, I started Boutique Show Horses.'

mlyn started showing in AQHA Will showed Paint Horses as a Youth at 9yo, at Open affiliated events as an 8yo, with and PHAA shows and wanted to be a horse trainer, opportunities to show many beautiful, even back then.

'At 12, lessons with Carolyn and Holly Johnson cemented that dream. I started showing at AQHA shows in 2018, and began training for the public. I run Real Deal Training Stables and over the last 6 years, I've shown some great Quarter Horses. I'm excited for the horses we have coming.'

Travel opportunities have allowed Will and Emlyn to meet people with similar goals and aspirations and they say that to be amongst so many like-minded people at events is very cool.

'We like to follow some American trainers,' Emlyn says. 'It's so we can better our programs. I watch for Beth Case, Katy Jo Zuidema, Jay Starnes and Aaron Moses in the USA shows.'



While looking to the States to keep up with all the latest trends and training methods, Will says that he's most inspired by his peers.

'Carolyn Johnson, and Kane and Holly Skopp have played an integral role in the horse trainer I am today. I believe to be the best you need to surround yourself with the best. In Australia, we have some great horse trainers and the quality of horses they turn out is something to strive for every year.'


Each value the similar showing advice given them early on, and for Emlyn, her best was, 'Show like you're on the best horse in the class, and train like you're going to win, even if you don't think you can.' Will's was, 'Ride the horse you're on. You can't always be the best mounted in the class, but you can be the best prepared.' Both say that the major shows can be full of lessons, assisting them to become better trainers, exhibitors, and people.

'Major shows can bring out the best and worst in people,' Will says. 'If you put enough different personalities together in a competitive setting you're bound to see some true colours. It's important to remember that no matter how stressed you are, how much money you've spent, or how hard you've worked, the horses' happiness and welfare should always come first.'

I totally agree,' Emlyn says. 'I also believe that when you're a trainer, you're also a role model for your barn. How you act or react is how your clientele will as well. So, no matter how tired or grumpy I may be, I do try to remain upbeat. It doesn't always occur, but I do try!'

Will and Em say that their last two years of east coast showing was wild! After Tropicana 2023, they left for the States, worked for Gillespie Show Horses, and then came home to relocate to Toikan Park, Mudgee NSW, a barn full of breakers and students keen for single or group lessons.

'We run a well-rounded barn and large show team,' Emlyn says. 'Some talented horses came through our barn resulting in great



success. The quality of horses at major shows now is comparable with the states. Making Top 5 in Open events is something to be proud of. Most of the 11 horses we took went home with at least one National Championship.'


The following results indicate that Em and Will's barn is geared toward Amateur and Novice Amateur success. Candice Goulding's LP Very Elegant Q-100430, and Cassandra Huyshe's Doubtful Dax Q-99843, won many 2yo Led events. Danielle Franchina and Mitchell Tuza's Code It Blue Q-96418, a consistent powerhouse, went top two at Summer Sizzler, NSW QH State Show and NPHA. Blayze Williams' Sinnin For Pleasure Q-93285, had wins in Senior Horse HUS with Emlyn, Amateur HUS with Blayze, and Novice Horse Pleasure with Will and Emlyn. Bianca Thomas' Simply Lopin Q-83643, placed in Amateur Pleasure and Showmanship and made Top 5 and Limited Open Pleasure with Emlyn. Sandy Hollier and CP Ima Lopin Machine Q-80075, placed well at majors in EWD, and with Will in Novice Horse Pleasure. Novice Amateurs, Vicky Pizarro and DP Graceline Q-85536, had wins and placings in Showmanship, Pleasure, Horsemanship and Hunters. Crystal Harris and Don't Doubt Milly Q-98031, had wins and placings in Showmanship, Pleasure, and won Limited Rider and Amateur Incentive in 4 & 5yo Feature at Tropicana.

'We love seeing clients achieve and don't believe that achieving with your horse is showpen limited. Satisfaction is when clients nail something they've once struggled with.'

A 2025 trip to the US is inevitable for Will and Emlyn, and though the plans aren't concrete, they say that they can't wait to head back and learn more from the best there.







she's the palomino Quarter Horse mare with the red tinge in her mane and tail. Vince Bonello says she's the matriarch of most of what he and Sally have bred at Delta Quarter Horse Stud, situated at Duri, near Tamworth, NSW. At the ripe old age of 37, Lady In Red, no longer has all of her teeth, but is assured of plenty of the love and care she deserves, spending most of her days in the Bonello houseyard.

red and owned by Vince and Sally Bonello, Vince says that 'She may be old, but if you're not quick enough, she'll still beat you out of the open gate'. He describes Lady In Red as being a quirky sort of a mare, very much like her dam, Clover Cherry Ripe Q-953, and grand-dam, Clover Cherry Q-56.

Today, Lady is deserving of the spotlight shining on her. The mare has been a prolific producer of outstanding AQHA progeny. Many of her progeny went on to make their mark in the high performance world of Cutting and Campdrafting, but have also produced incredibly talented progeny that have, and are still 'carrying the baton'.

Lady was foaled in 1987, to the JackHammer Q-47 sired, Clover Cherry Ripe, whose dam, Clover Cherry, was imported by Gregory Lougher, of Clover Leaf Stud. In 1968, Greg famously rode Clover Cherry to give a Cutting and Western Horsemanship demonstration at the Sydney Royal Easter Show, in front of thousands of spectators, and it caused quite a buzz across the Australian equine industry. Vince says that when you go back to Clover Cherry, every branch of her tree 'has fruit on it'.

Lady in Red's sire, Smart Little Diablo Q-18444, by Smart Little Lena, was found in the USA for Vince and Sally by Hamish McCallum, the talented horseman, and Sally's late brother. Vince imported Smart Little Diablo to Australia, as a weanling colt.

Fast forward to 1991, Lady In Red and her half-sister, both by Smart Little Diablo, were each paid up for the NCHA 'Lady In Red' Q-19674 - 1999 ridden by Warren Lowrey

Futurity, plus more Cutting Futurities. Unfortunately, through no fault of their own, the fillies did not get the chance to be shown, which did disappoint Vince.


But Lady proved her abilities in Campdrafting when Warren Lowrey competed on her, but no points were recorded with the AQHA. However, Lady won and placed in many Campdraft events from big numbers. Lady was ridden by Michael Rapley, from 1991 to 1995, and those points were AQHA recorded. Eventually, Lady went home to begin her biggest contribution to Delta Quarter Horse Stud, and to the Quarter Horse breed in Australia. Over the years, she was paired with standout stallions, carefully chosen by Vince. Lady proved herself, producing 20 foals, many of whom grew to be very competitive Cutting and Campdraft horses, and some were great producers themselves.

SELIGMAN SPIN Q-43083

Sire: Docs Spinifex Q-5015 / Dam: Lady in Red One of Lady In Red's most successful offspring was the result of Vince and Sally breeding their mare to the legendary Cutting champion, and sire of Cutting champions, Doc's Spinifex. A 1998 colt, Seligman Spin was purchased by Peter and Debbie Gesler in 2002, and went on to contest six years of Cutting magic, with over \$65,000 LTE, making him the highest money-earning son of Docs Spinifex.

Seligman Spin was outstanding, and one of the most consistent cutting horses ever. His performance record is incredible, and he placed no lower than 6th, in 11 out of the 12 major aged event Cutting shows he contested. Seligman Spin went on to stamp himself as an incredible producer, siring 430 AQHA registered progeny, including many champions that excelled in multiple disciplines, to win in many prestigious events across the country. In 2007, Seligman Spin was shown in Non Pro events by his owner, the late Peter Gesler, showing consistently to win both the \$3500 and \$10,000 National Titles, and over \$12000 in prize money, on the way to claiming those titles.

DIABLOS DESTINO Q-53850

Sire: Acre's Destiny Q-38061 / Dam: Lady in Red Diablos Destino was ridden by Jason Wanstall to win the 2013 Accor Hotels Open. The stallion went on to become a winning Campdrafter, and has sired at least 14 progeny.

COLOUR ME ROAN Q-46031

Sire: Peptos Stylish Oak Q-39269 / Dam: Lady in Red This gelding went on to become a competitive Cutting horse and won and placed in quite a few events.



REY LADY REY Q-56620

Sire: Dual Rey Q-52538 / Dam: Lady in Red

Like her dam, Rey Lady Rey, has also proven herself as a great producing mare, but not before she showed them her Cutting talents. Foaled in March, 2005, the palomino mare won and placed in Open and Novice Cuttings, and also took out the 2013 Paradise Lagoons Open Cutting, then ridden by Jason Leitch. She was also awarded two AQHA Amateur ROMs in Cutting and Performance. Rey Lady Rey's 17 foals have extended out as a very successful line, with some listed below.

Sire: Hydrive Cat Q-64619 / Dam: Rey Lady Rey Owned and shown by Amelia Servin, the colt, World Series Cat, was very consistent, winning and placing in many Non Pro and Open Cuttings. The pair won the 2014 DDCC Non Pro Open Cutting Futurity, the 2015 DDCC Non Pro Open Cutting, and the 2016 Non Pro Open Cutting at the National Finals.



SANNANDREYUS Q-93031

Sire: Sannman Q-83590 / Dam: Rey Lady Rey This colt was ridden by Matt Oakley to take out the 2022 Limited Open Derby Champion.



HY ON CHERRIES Q-84709

Sire: Hydrive Cat / Dam: Rey Lady Rey

A granddaughter of Lady In Red, Hy On Cherries is giving her owner, Sarah Campbell, a taste of Cutting success. In 2021, she and Cherry placed 5th from 43 entries in their first Cutting show, placed in the Non Pro Classic at Goondiwindi and not long after, followed that up with an unexpected win in the Open Non Pro at Injune. Sarah also owns three more of Cherry's progeny and looks forward to seeing their progress.

REYS ME A HY Q-99285

Sire: Hydrive Cat / Dam: Reys Me A Lady Q-84706 This 2019 great granddaughter of Lady In Red, was ridden by Mathew Oakley, to place equal 2nd from 111 entries with a 219.5pts in the first go-round of the 2023 NCHA Cutting Open Futurity.

Only a few horses have been mentioned here, a little of the great legacy that Lady In Red has produced, but to be honest, there are just too many to list here. This mare is a real credit to her proud owner/breeders, Vince and Sally Bonello. Still spoken of today, and will be in the future, especially in Cutting circles, Lady In Red's lines and her progeny, are deserving of study, following and a great deal of respect.

BEATING EQUINE ARTHRITIS

With natures remedies for hardworking Quarter Horses

EQUINE ARTHRITIS, ALSO KNOWN AS DEGENERATIVE JOINT DISEASE (DJD), IS A COMMON CONDITION AFFECTING HORSES OF ALL BREEDS AND DISCIPLINES.

t involves the progressive deterioration of cartilage within the joints, leading to pain, inflammation, and decreased mobility. DJD can impact any joint but is most commonly seen in the hocks, stifles, and fetlocks.

CAUSES AND SYMPTOMS:

The primary causes of equine arthritis include:

- Wear and Tear: Repeated stress on joints due to athletic activities or intensive work.
- **Injury:** Trauma to the joint can accelerate cartilage breakdown.
- **Genetics:** Some horses are predisposed to DJD due to their genetic makeup.
- **Conformation:** Poor joint conformation can lead to uneven distribution of weight and increased joint stress.

COMMON SYMPTOMS INCLUDE:

- Lameness: Especially after exercise.
- Swelling: Visible inflammation around the joints.
- Stiffness: Difficulty moving, particularly after rest.
- Reduced Performance: Decrease in willingness to work or compete.

PREVENTATIVE TREATMENT:

Managing equine arthritis involves a multifaceted approach, focusing on both prevention and treatment to maintain joint health and prolong the horse's athletic career.

DIET:

A balanced diet is crucial for preventing and managing arthritis: Omega-3 Fatty Acids: Found in flaxseed, omega-3s have anti-inflammatory properties. We do not use fish oil as horses are herbivores.

Antioxidants: Vitamins C and E, selenium, and other antioxidants help reduce oxidative stress on joints.

Balanced Nutrition: Ensuring adequate intake of essential minerals like calcium, phosphorus, and magnesium is vital for bone and joint health.



Naturopathic and Herbal Medicine Naturopathic and herbal treatments can complement traditional methods to manage arthritis:

Devil's Claw: Known for its anti-inflammatory and pain-relieving properties.

Turmeric: Contains curcumin, which has strong antiinflammatory and antiarthritic properties.

Boswellia: An herbal remedy that helps reduce inflammation and supports joint health. It has analgesic, antirheumatic, antispasmodic an anti-allergic properties.

Piper Nigrum: is a great source of magnesium, vitamin K, vitamin C, calcium, iron and fibre. It promotes the bioavailability of curcumin and helps with aching muscles, digestive issues and arthritis.

Acupuncture and Massage: These therapies can help relieve pain and improve joint function.

Equine Arthritis: Understanding Degenerative Joint Disease in Horses

Quarter Horses and Intense Competition Quarter Horses are particularly prone to DJD due to their intense work in disciplines like cutting, reining, and racing. The rapid acceleration, sharp turns, and heavy impacts these activities involve put significant stress on their joints.



Coping Strategies

To help Quarter Horses cope with the demands of competition:

- Regular Check-Ups: This can be with your vet, osteopath, chiropractor and even farrier. Early detection and treatment of joint issues can prevent further damage.
- Proper Warm-Up and Cool-Down: Ensuring a thorough warm-up and cool-down routine can reduce the risk of injury.

- Controlled Exercise: Tailoring exercise regimens to the horse's condition helps maintain fitness without overstraining the joints.
- Joint Supplements: Providing regular natural joint supplements can help maintain joint health.
- **Supportive Shoeing:** Corrective shoeing can help alleviate stress on the joints and improve overall hoof health.



Equine arthritis is a significant concern for horse owners, particularly those involved in competitive sports. By adopting a holistic approach that includes a balanced diet, herbal supplements, and proper management strategies, it is possible to reduce the incidence and impact of DJD.

For Quarter Horses, whose athletic careers demand peak physical performance, these measures are essential to ensure longevity and quality of life. Regular veterinary care, combined with preventative treatments, can help manage arthritis and keep these magnificent athletes performing at their best.

ARTHRITIS AND JOINT ISSUES WITH RIDERS



2024 Australian Reining Championships is now in its 35th Year.

The Reining Australia Futurity and National Show was once again held at the AELEC, Tamworth NSW on the 5-10 August 2024.









ith a purse of \$50,000 on the Gold Buckle Futurity alone and money and prizes totalling well over \$100,000 making it the country's biggest payout Reining event annually. Competitors travelled from as far as Western Australia and North Queensland for their shot at a National title. With the sport seeing unprecedented growth

the competition was high and although the friendly atmosphere throughout the week, riders showed up to

With a line up of several past Gold Buckle Futurity Champions, the hotly contested Open Derby brought the heat with the David & Jane Manchon entry 'NPH Gunner Be A Goodnite' piloted by Warren Backhouse backing up their 2023 win to take home the AQHA winner's cheque again marking a massive 151 from the judges. Coming in 2nd place was 88 Reining's mare 'Whiza Lil Cash' with John Wicks and taking out third place honours was Breakoday QH's stallion 'Nu Too Much' ridden by Lana Kelderman. The AQHA Owner Incentive was won by David & Jane Manchon and the AQHA Breeders Incentive was won by Dennis and Erin Neylon.

Thomas Arena Products Gold Buckle Futurity

A broad field of Professional trainers and Non Pro riders made up the numbers in the Open Futurity with a 2 go round aggregate deciding the winning combination. It was Non Pro rider Tyler Smith who came out on top, 20 years after her father Greg won the same title. Saturday morning saw the Non Pro's step into the pen on their futurity horses with Queensland rider Heather Lee taking home the buckles in all 3 levels marking a 140. A great effort by these non pros with some catch riding their own horses after showing in the Open Futurity under their trainers.

Now in its 14th year, this class is the 'one to win' for the leading Non Pro riders. 






- Portfolio: Cattle & Time Events

Another year that I have had the opportunity to be the Cattle and Timed Event Portfolio holder has been and gone and what a great year it has been. This part of our industry is a major part of the income for AQHA with registrations, breeding returns, transfers and of course memberships bringing a huge return to the AQHA and this is something that the other side of our industry is probably not aware of.

In the Camp Draft side, entries are usually in the hundreds at each class at the drafts, the leading events pays over a \$100k to win let alone the income derived by the stallion owners in service fees and to the mare owners, the value of the progeny out of these well performed mares.

Because of this, the sales of potential Camp Draft horses are huge with the annual Nutrien sale grossing over \$10,000,000 in sales each year and its usually a Quarter Horse topping the sections of the sale as well.

The Cutting side is also on the up and up, the annual NCHA Futurity pays also a \$100k to win and the led sale during this events also sees our breed achieve very high prices, the stallion owners are reporting no down turn on the breeding side and the forthcoming season looks to be another bumper one for the cutting horse industry.

The Barrel racing is also showing tremendous growth and like in the USA, they are holding age events as well as their normal events with huge entries as well. This has seen a comeback of the sprint breeding side of our industry with them embracing these bloodline to get the speed into their horses.

Roping is another event about to boom again with them looking at also introducing aged events into there shows, recently some horses from here were exported back to the USA to compete at roping events over there and did us proud in the results they achieved.

The Challenge events are as popular as ever, Cow Horse is on the come back and the likes of Team Penning ect still attracting big numbers at their events.

It's important that the AQHA continues to support this side of the industry to show these members that we do support them to ensure our involvement stays strong with them and this continues into the future.

I get feedback saying that we are spending this and that for the cattle and timed event side, it's an investment we need to maintain.

I thank my sub committee for their support during the year and the rest of the board for recognising the importance of the cattle and timed events portfolio and of course the office which ensures things run smooth.
