#### What is the role of a Work for the Dole Coordinator?

Work for the Dole Coordinators work to identify suitable Work for the Dole activities for job seekers. They also work with <u>jobactive providers</u> to match job seekers to activities.

#### What is WfD?

Work for the Dole is part of the Australian Government's jobactive employment service. It is a work experience programme designed to help job seekers gain new skills while they look for work.

As a Work for the Dole host organisation, you can get access to extra sets of hands to undertake activities and projects that may not normally get done.

By hosting activities you can help job seekers gain the skills, experience and confidence they need to move off welfare and into a job.

#### Who can host a Work for the Dole activity?

Work for the Dole activities can only be hosted by not-for-profit organisations and local, state, territory and Australian government agencies.

#### What is the role of a Host?

As a Work for the Dole host, you will provide work-like activities for Work for the Dole participants.

Your Work for the Dole Coordinator or jobactive provider can help you determine the projects that participants complete.

### **Tingha Community Workshop**

June 23rd saw the opening of the Tingha Community Workshop.

Over thirty community elders, service providers, participants, friends and family enjoyed a BBQ and the chance to see first hand some of the amazing creations from this Work for the Dole project.

The project came about after a need for a local activity was realised. The participants are learning carpentry skills in an environment that fosters team work and creativity.

Building materials have been donated by local suppliers such as Bindaree Beef, Bunnings Warehouse, CME and Tamex.

Items such as beds, garden furniture, tables, kids cubby houses and much more have been hand crafted from recycled pallets and hard wood offcuts from a local sawmill.

The project is supervised by two local men who are volunteering their time for 25 hours per week.

Participants are encouraged to tackle items that are outside their comfort zones and learn woodworking skills that

will be with them for life.









## Bellata War Memorial

The Bellata War Memorial Hall is the first activity to involve the BEST Moree WfD Bus and was kicked off in April 2016.

WfD Supervisor Jonathan Somerville says four to five participants are regularly attending the activity and have been skilled in the correct methods of sanding and lacquering a wall as well as leveling benches.





They've also removed waste items from the backyard and continue to maintain the lawns.





Participants are still to paint the stage area as well as sand and polish the floorboards of the hall.

Mr Somerville say the comments he's received from the committee of the current works at the site are encouraging adding the participants are doing a great job.

The activity is expected to be completed in September 2016.





### May Street Park Inverell - Group activity with Jobs Australia Enterprises

May Street park in Inverell is a picturesque two acres of land that overlooks the Inverell CBD.

For many years the park was neglected and overgrown until the a team of job seekers led by supervisor Jimmy Connors stepped in.

With the assistance from local council, the Jobs Australia team have transformed the park with new fencing, concrete paths, picnic tables, turf and vegetation control.

The Work for the Dole activity currently has ten participants that are learning valuable transferable skills such as concreting, fencing and landscaping.

The activity has been full of participants since it commenced in April and by the end date of October this year, the community of Inverell will have a an asset that everyone can be proud of especially the Jobs Australia May Street Park Team.
