FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

"What is the difference between the various boarding discounts?"

The Gloria Thew Boarding Award is a discount applied to the boarding portion of school fees. The primary criteria are financial need. The ICPA boarding Scholarship is also a discount applied to the boarding portion of school fees however is primarily awarded to families in isolated rural areas. Applicants for the ICPA boarding Scholarship must be members of the ICPA (Isolated Children and Parent's Association). Applicants for the Indigenous Boarding Scholarship must claim indigenous status on their school enrolment.

These discounts are applied to the boarding portion of fees only and are not applicable to the tuition or co-curricular portion of school fees. Boarding discounts are only available to students who are full time boarders at Calrossy.

"Why was my application rejected?"

We are not able to offer assistance to every family that submits an application. As we receive no funding to assist with the costs of boarding, we have limited the total value of the discount to the maximum equivalent of one (1) full year's boarding cost each year. This may be divided among many applicants and may only result in a small discount to an applicant or none at all.

"If I receive a boarding discount, can I have other discounts as well?"

Sibling Discount	A student may receive a boarding discount and a sibling discount at the same time.
Bursary Assistance	A student may receive a scholarship or award plus bursary assistance only in exceptional circumstances. The bursary discount would be provided for a very limited time and reviewed at the end of each school year.

"How do the boarding scholarships and awards differ to other bursary assistance or scholarships?"

While scholarships, awards and bursaries all result in discounted school fees, the duration of these discounts vary in length. It is common for a scholarship/award to remain in place for the duration of a student's time at Calrossy or for as long as they study a particular subject or meet the criteria under which the discount was awarded. Bursary assistance (applied to the tuition portion of school fees) is reviewed each year and is offered to families experiencing short term financial difficulty.

"I have heard that students of families receiving bursary assistance are ineligible to attend extra-curricular activities such as the ski trip and the overseas tour. My child receives a scholarship or award, are they also ineligible to attend these events?"

As bursary assistance is means tested, students receiving any type of bursary are not eligible to attend the ski trip or overseas tour; regardless of who pays for it. Students receiving scholarships are eligible to attend the ski trip and overseas tour providing they have no outstanding school fees.

"I have heard that families receiving bursary assistance forfeit their \$1,000 enrolment bond, is this true?"

Yes. Enrolment bonds are forfeited by all families who receive bursary assistance. These funds are deposited to a trust account to be used to assist families in the future. If your child is awarded a Gloria Thew award, an ICPA Scholarship or an Indigenous Scholarship, the enrolment bond will not be forfeited.

"I don't think I can afford to send my child to Calrossy unless I receive a bursary or scholarship. Is there any other assistance which could be available?"

EDSTART (or other similar, specialist lending organisations) Have you enquired with specialist lending organisations such as Edstart? If an application is approved; they will pay Calrossy the full amount of the invoice, while you make payments to them via agreed instalment amounts. They are able to offer extended payment terms for a period of up to 5 years after a student has completed their time at Calrossy. Edstart charge an annual cost for this service, however it is generally cheaper than paying the 4% per term outstanding balance charge for overdue school fees.
