

Appointment of Assistant Chaplain

Louise Davies is moving to a Head Chaplain role elsewhere; so we seeking to appoint an innovative and enthusiastic Assistant Chaplain to join our Calrossy team. The successful applicant will have a mature and vibrant Christian faith; strong interpersonal and teaching skills; the ability to work collaboratively with teachers and

students (particularly Secondary students); a clear and active commitment to the welfare and wellbeing of those within the Calrossy community; and the preparedness to further the Christian mission of Calrossy.

The fundamental purpose of the position is to lead, model and encourage Christian belief and practice at all levels of Calrossy Anglican School.

Location

Calrossy Anglican School, Tamworth – William Cowper (Years P-9) and Brisbane Street (Years 10-12) Campuses Teachers may be required to work across both campuses and/or teach the online e-Calrossy classes

Calrossy Anglican School is a leading Day and Boarding School located in Tamworth, a thriving regional centre in the North-West of NSW. It is a 'coeducational school with a difference', catering for approximately 1000 girls and boys from Pre-School to Year 12. We have moved into our second century with a bold vision of quality Christian education for the young men and women of regional Australia, under the auspices of the Anglican Diocese of Armidale. Whilst a comprehensive school with an open enrolment policy, Calrossy has also performed as the top academic school in North-West NSW in the past ten years, regularly achieving HSC results in the top echelon of schools in the State.

Calrossy is a forward-thinking school, creating innovative and modern working environments that enhance student learning and foster a passion for and a culture of participation in all aspects of school life. There are a broad range of academic, sporting and cultural activities for Boarding and Day students, promoting success and engagement, both outside and within the classroom.

Well-known for our outstanding and distinctive approach to wellbeing, Calrossy is a place of belonging, in which every student's wellbeing is nurtured, catering for individual special needs and potential.

Calrossy operates on two campuses in Tamworth, with the Junior School and Years 7 – 9 located on the William Cowper Campus in North Tamworth and Years 10-12 students learning at our Brisbane Street Campus in East Tamworth. Boarding facilities for both girls and boys are provided within the school and nearby. Calrossy operates Tangara Farm as a Trade Training Centre, which is home to our renowned Agriculture and Primary Industries programs. In 2020 the school commenced **e-Calrossy**, a full-time, live distance education program for students in Year 7. This expanding program will involve students in Years 5 – 9 by 2023, catering to the needs of remote students across NSW and Australia.

The Primary Objective of the Position

The Assistant Chaplain will teach and live out the Christian faith that is the foundation of Calrossy Anglican School.

Supporting the School's Christian Mission

- Actively support and live out the Christian mission of Calrossy in a manner that is inclusive and sensitive to the life experiences of students, parents and staff
- Lead and speak at School Chapel services and Staff Devotions, as coordinated by the School Chaplain
- At all times promote the School's Christian core values in ways that are practical and accessible
- Promote an integrated model of teaching and service in all aspects of school life
- Reflect a strong commitment to serve others in the school community

Christian Worldview

- Assist the School Chaplain in the development of an integrated Christian Worldview across all areas of the school community
- Promote school-wide conversation on how the Christian faith intersects with life and purpose in Australia in the 21st Century
- Identify and develop School practices that promote Christian perspectives and ethics
- Lead respectful debate and development of Christian thinking in a safe environment for the exploration of the implications of Christian Worldview in everyday life
- Represent the best interests of the School and professionally serve the Calrossy community; students, staff, parents & alumni
- Be up-to-date with contemporary issues facing children and young people today, understanding their needs and possessing relational skills in communicating with this generation

Events and Gatherings

- Assist in the planning and leading of Chapel Services in the Secondary School (Years 7-12) in partnership with the School Chaplain and other Chaplaincy staff
- Promote and lead the Secondary lunchtime student Christian groups: 'LIGHT' and 'Senior LIGHT', ensuring the lunchtime meetings are well prepared and conducted
- Assist the School Chaplain in the planning and organising of whole school events and special ceremonies: Whole School Chapels, Foundation Services, ANZAC Commemoration, Community Prayer Breakfasts, Carol Services, Boarder Chapel Services during term time, Christian camps
- Promote involvement of students in Diocesan Youth Camps and connections with local church youth groups and churches
- Support and promote student involvement in School Service activities, programs, tours and visits

Student and Staff wellbeing

- Establish and maintain good working relationships with students to support their education
- Support programmes which have the benefits and progress of the students at their core
- Contribute to the student Wellbeing Programme in liaison with the School Chaplain, assisting in the development of school wellbeing framework

Parent and Community liaison

- Work with parents of students offering support, guidance and pastoral care as required
- Be the Christian 'face' of Calrossy, when required, at functions within the School and the wider community
- Contribute to the pastoral support of students and their families
- Act as a point of connection between local churches and the School community

Teaching and learning

- Prepare lessons for, teach, and contribute to the ongoing development of the Secondary Christian Studies Program
- Work in the Chaplaincy Department collaboratively as part of an educational team, in the provision of engaging lessons in Christian Studies
- Assist in the development of resources and ICT use in the teaching of Christian Studies
- Assist the integration of Christian perspectives appropriately into the broader school curricula

Other Duties

- Ensure the supervision, training and encouragement of student leaders, particularly in lunchtime student Christian groups and Chapels and associated events.
- If ordained in the Anglican Church of Australia, be involved with the activities of the clergy of the Armidale Diocese: Clergy Conferences, Synods and gatherings.
- Encourage prayerfulness throughout the school, both informally and through scheduled prayer meetings.
- Appropriate involvement in the co-curricular life of the school

- Ability to connect with young people
- Capacity for leadership and contribution to a dynamic team
- Knowledge and practice of evangelistic strategies to youth
- Demonstrated capacity to work with young people, preferably in a school setting and ideally through the application of teacher training and experience
- Insight to contribute to school strategic planning and creative and innovative approaches to Christian studies teaching
- Ability to work collaboratively with others in design of programs with a commitment to clear communication
- Capacity to deal with issues of apologetics related to blockers of faith, commonly expressed by adolescents
- Ability to work with faculties to integrate Christian world view thinking into their teaching
- Preparedness to fulfil the role of resident theologian, along with the School Chaplain, as a point of contact for staff
- · Pastoral experience and capacity to nurture and comfort young people, staff and parents in their times of need
- Willingness to work beyond school hours, including in pastoral settings and weekend camps
